PROGRESS REPORT 4

As I type this PR, NOVACON 9 is just 3 weeks away - the programme is organised, the Programme Book is being printed, the badges are being pinned & written...what have we forgotten? Something will doubtless backfire in the next 3 weeks or at the event... well, it wouldn't be a <u>real</u> con if everything ran smoothly, would it? (That's the usual con committee's cop-out catchphrase stated just to get you in the right mood for turning a blind-eye to the committee's cock-ups!)

EXTREMELY IMPORTANT - As stated in PR 1/2 we are starting NOVACON 9 at 3.30 on Friday afternoon, not in the evening. GET THERE EARLY.

HOW TO GET TO THE HOTEL

If you live in Birmingham, you'll find it easy. To all those living outside of Birmingham we are enclosing a map issued by the Royal Angus which should prove to be useful.

In addition to this information we should point out that there is a bus route between New Street Station and the Hotel. The bus runs from Stephenson Street. After coming through the ticket barrier at the Station you will see escalators ahead of you. Go up an escalator and turn left at the top, walking past the indoor fountain through the exit to New Street. Emerging from the Station complex you will find yourself at the top of a ramp leading down to New Street. At the top of this ramp, on your left-hand side you will find a narrow staircase leading down to Stephenson Street. The bus stop when at the bottom of this staircase. The bus required is the 101 and is always a single decker. There is a standard fare of 5p (no tickets are issued on this route). Following the map provided, the bus route is Stephenson St, Navigation St, up Hill St to Paradise St, around Paradise Circus, through Summer Row and into Great Charles St. Around St Chad's Circus and up Snow Hill Circus. The bus stops about half way up Snow Hill Circus - get off at this point and walk back down the hill to St Chads Queensway. NOTE this bus is the shopper's special and therefore does not run after 6pm or on Sundays. Up till 6pm it runs every 2 or 3 minutes.

HOW TO GET THE CENTRE HOTEL

If you are one of the few booked into the overflow hotel, directions are a little simpler. The Centre Hotel is situated in New Street, exactly opposite the Odeon Cinema (No 32 on the map).

Arrival by train - instructions as above out of New Street Station. Instead of descending stairs to Stephenson Street, go down ramp and turn right into New Street. The hotel is on the opposite side of the road about 30 yards along.

Arrival by car from M6 - At Spaghetti junction take A38M to city and continue to end of motorway. Take left side lane into Lancaster Circus and along James Watt Ringway and Moor Street Rinway, clockwise around St Martins Circus and turn into New Street by the Rotunda (high circular building not marked on map). Along New Street to traffic lights and turn left towards and then right into Stephenson Street. There is an NCP car park on the left as Stephenson Street ends and Navigation Street starts. This is the most convenient car park to the Centre Hotel.

Arrival by car from M5 - instructions as map to Royal Angus as far as Broad Street. At end of Broad Street turn left into Paradise Circus and follow around clockwise to

At end of Broad Street turn left into Paradise Circus and follow around clockwise to the Town Hall (No 16 on map). Turn left into New Street. Continue down New Street until forced to turn left or right. Turn right. Then turn right again into Stephenson Street and the NCP car Park is about 60yds along on the left.

Arrival by Car from A34 - along A34 into Digbeth and follow City Centre sign into and clockwise around St Martins Circus. At the Rotunda (see Above) turn left into New

Street and follow directions as from M6 above.

WHAT TO DO ON ARRIVAL AT THE ROYAL ANGUS

- 1) Book into hotel on Ground Floor and get to your room.
- 2) Proceed to 2nd Floor by lift. Turn right out of lift and you will come to the convention Registration Desk.
- 3) At Registration you will be asked for the balance of the registration fee. You have already paid £2 supporting mambership. It is a further £2 to convert to Attending membership making a total of £4. (NOTE: Anyone wishing to register at the convention itself will be charged £5 so if you have friends or know someone who intends coming to NOVACON and hasn't bothered to register at all, you might warn them to register before the con.)
- 4) You will then be given your Programme Book and your convention badge. This badge should be worn at all times while walking around the hotel. If you don't wear your badge, you won't get served at the bar. With your Programme Book you will also get Nova Award voting forms etc plus a NOVACON SPECIAL a limited edition booklet Christopher Priest's sequel to INVERTED WORLD, "The Making of THE LESBIAN HORSE". Illustrated by Andrew Stephenson, it will be a 500 copy numbered edition.
- 5) Go to the bar and buy the committee drinks.

PROGRAMME

As stated earlier the programme starts at 3.30 on Friday aftermoon. It will continue through to 6.30pm. It will resume at 8.30pm and continue till after midnight. On Saturday it starts at 10am and runs to 7pm with a lunch break at 1pm. It will resume at 10pm for the Fancy Dress followed by the Disco till 1.30am Sunday. Sunday programme starts at 10.30am and runs till 4.30pm with a break for lunch at 12.30pm.

The programme consists of films, talks, the NOVACON Chat Show, Auctions, a formal debate, panel discussions, a quiz designed along the format of University Challenge, Fancy Dress Competition, Disco, etc.

EATING

Where you eat and what you eat is entirely at your discretion. There is no banquet this year. The Hotel Restaurant will be open Friday and Saturday evenings and Friday and Sunday lunch time. It will not be open on Saturday lunch time. In addition, the Hotel will also be providing a Buffet on Saturday & Sunday lunch time, for those requiring only light meals. It will consist of one Hot dish with alternative Cold dish. Cost will be in the region of £1.

Those wishing to sample exotic dishes (Chinese, Indian, Wimpy, etc) will find several good eating houses outside the hotel with 10 minutes walking distance.

 $\underline{\text{NOTE}}$: those who wish to eat in the Hotel Restaurant on Friday and Saturday evenings should book their tables early to avoid disappointment. It might even be advisable to book a table by phone before the con (Tel: 021-236 4211)

DRINKING

The bar will stay open through Friday aftermoon and remain open till approximately lam Saturday morning. Reopening at 10.30am it will be open through till approx. 2am Sunday morning. It will reopen at 11am and close at 2pm. It will not be open on Sunday afternoon as we will have ceased to be residents at noon. The Friday night and Saturday night closing times are provisional. They will not close before those times and they will stay open as long as people are buying and consuming drinks.

THE BOOKROOM

Books will be on sale during the weekend, from various dealers who will be only too happy to part with various literary delights. Books will be on sale at the following times:

Friday: the bookroom will open at 2pm and close at 6.30pm.

Saturday: from 9.30am to 6.30pm (it will close during the Guest of Honour's talk from 2.15pm to 3.15pm).

Sunday: from 10am to approx 4.30pm.

<u>Dealers please note</u>: Setting up will be allowed on Friday morning only - <u>not</u> Thursday evening.

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THE ART SHOW

Martin Hoare will be announcing the Fancy Dress - make sure he has your name, character pronunciation correct and familiarise him with any things like timing, background music, etc. <u>Don't</u> arrive 5 minutes before the start of the Competition, having forgotten to fill in the necessary forms because you were drunk or something, and then ask us to find a record of the National Anthem or some such obscure piece for your background music. We might not like it.

THE NOVA AWARD

The NOVA Award is presented at each NOVACON to the best British fanzine of the preceding year. It has been presented every year since 1973. Early awards were decided by a select panel of judges - since 1977, however the rules were changed and the Award thrown open to popular vote. Ballots and copies of the full, incredibly complex rules will be available at the Registration Desk. Voting is open to any NOVACON member who in the last two years has published a fanzine or had contributions or letters printed in other zines (see rules for precise details). Thus the Award is voted for by people who do know something about the fanzine field. Voting closes with the registration desk on Saturday evening of NOVACON 9. And just what is a fanzine? By the rules: "an amateur publication which is concerned with SF, Fantasy, SF & Fantasy fans and/or associated subjects, and copies of which may be generally obtained in exchange for other amateur publications or in response to 'letters of comment'." The NOVA committee (not judges but expert consultants) interprets this and verifies ballots; the Administrator collects said ballots; and each year Ray Bradbury (the Birmingham one, not the American imitation) creates an amazing and unique trophy for presentation to the winner. Use your vote if you have one!


