## Programme

The Satellite 6 programme will have the usual emphasis on *Science Fiction*, *Science Fact*, *Science Fun*. Alongside items on speculative fiction, we have interesting science talks and plenty of opportunities for silliness. Our featured planet is Venus: where better to explore how increased scientific knowledge of the real conditions on a planet's surface has impacted on the stories set there?

The programme is not quite finalised and there is still time to volunteer to take part (please email **programme@Six.SatelliteX.org.uk**). Information on just some of the items confirmed so far is below.

Programme highlights are the contributions from our wonderful Guests. Author Paul McAuley will give his main GoH talk on Saturday and take part in Desert Island Books on Sunday. Day Guests Dr Charles Cockell and Dr Saskia Vermeylen consider what alien life could look like, and who owns resources in space.

Satellite Stalwarts Robert Law, Colin McInnes, Phil Welling and Nik Whithead will all give talks covering topics from terraforming Venus to (....yet more) inadvisable rocket science. Our own Mad Elf will present Anime 101, an introduction for fans who don't know much about the medium.

Panels will focus on depictions of Venus in literature and media speculative fiction. We have the traditional Satellite Convention All-Apocrypha panel, this time discussing whether apocrypha might prove a more reliable way for NASA to explore space than robots. We also consider the legacies of Blake's 7 and the Hitch Hikers Guide to the Galaxy, both celebrating ruby anniversaries in 2018. This year also sees the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Glasgow's first SF convention, Faircon '78, so we shall have programme items looking back across the past 40 years of Glasgow fandom.

Evening entertainment includes the superb Science Ceilidh Band, who will take us through some science-themed dances as well as old favourites.

Quark's Bar returns for another round of alcohol-themed questions and we also plan a chocolate biscuit quiz. There will be a fannish version of Radio 4's The Unbelievable Truth. We also have a weapons demonstration from Jo Thomas of HEMA, book launches, and author readings, so a rich variety of items to choose from.

# Day Guests

In keeping with Satellite Conventions' tradition, we have recruited some special Day Guests to entertain you.

#### Professor Charles Cockell

Charles Cockell is Professor of Astrobiology at the University of Edinburgh, and Director of the UK Centre for Astrobiology, which he established in 2011. His academic interests encompass life in extreme environments, the habitability of extraterrestrial environments and the exploration and



settlement of space. He has previously worked at NASA and the British Antarctic Survey. His work has taken him to both poles and many other extreme environments. He has published over 300 scientific papers and numerous books, including a series on the conditions for liberty beyond Earth. He leads the Life Beyond program, which engages prison inmates in the design of human settlements in space. He is Chair of the Earth and Space Foundation, a non-profit organisation he established in 1994, and he is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Edinburgh. His most recent book, *The Equations of Life: How Physics Shapes Evolution* is published in June 2018.

#### Dr Saskia Vermeylen

Dr Saskia Vermeylen is a critical legal scholar working in the area of property theory and resource frontiers. She joined Strathclyde University's Law School in July 2016 as a Chancellor's Fellow. She studies indigenous peoples' cultural expressions as a source of law and is currently finishing a monograph on critical property theory drawing upon the work of Jacques Derrida and Emmanuel Levinas. As part of her



interest in property theory she's also embarking on a new research project on the legal and ethical meaning of 'common heritage of mankind', a concept that is currently much debated in the context of outer space mining. She has just been awarded a Leverhulme Fellowship to study the relationship between Utopian Literatures and Space Law.

#### The Hotel

The Convention will take place in the Crowne Plaza Hotel, Congress Road, Glasgow G3 8QT. The hotel is situated about two miles from Glasgow City Centre and beside the Scottish Exhibition and Conference Centre. The hotel is familiar to SF fans, having hosted Satellite 2 in 2009 and Satellite 4, the



2014 Eastercon. In addition it was, of course, the hotel for the 2006 Eastercon, Concussion, and was the principal hotel for both the 1995 Worldcon, Intersection, and the 2005 Worldcon, Interaction. For further information see:


#### Overflow Hotel



Membership Types


Attending Member
