The room rates include breakfast which runs from 8.00am to 10.30am. We will have sandwiches and rolls available while the Union bar is open.

There are some very good restaurants plus the usual fast-food places within 10 minutes' walk of the college.

If however you have a strong wish to eat main meals on the premises, then you must let us know by the 30th of April. The college wants us to tell them in advance how many will require meals and we will have to make arrangements for the sale and collection of meal tickets. So if not enough people have declared an interest by the 30th, main meals will NOT be provided.

To help you decide whether you do wish to eat in the student canteen, a typical menu would be: Tomato Soup, Quiche Salad or Braising Steak, Creamed Potatoes, Broccoli, Macedoine and Apricot Sponge'n'custard or Ice Cream at £2.70 (Lunch, no coffee). Evening meal would be £3.05 (including coffee). If you feel tempted then please let us know using the enclosed form.
