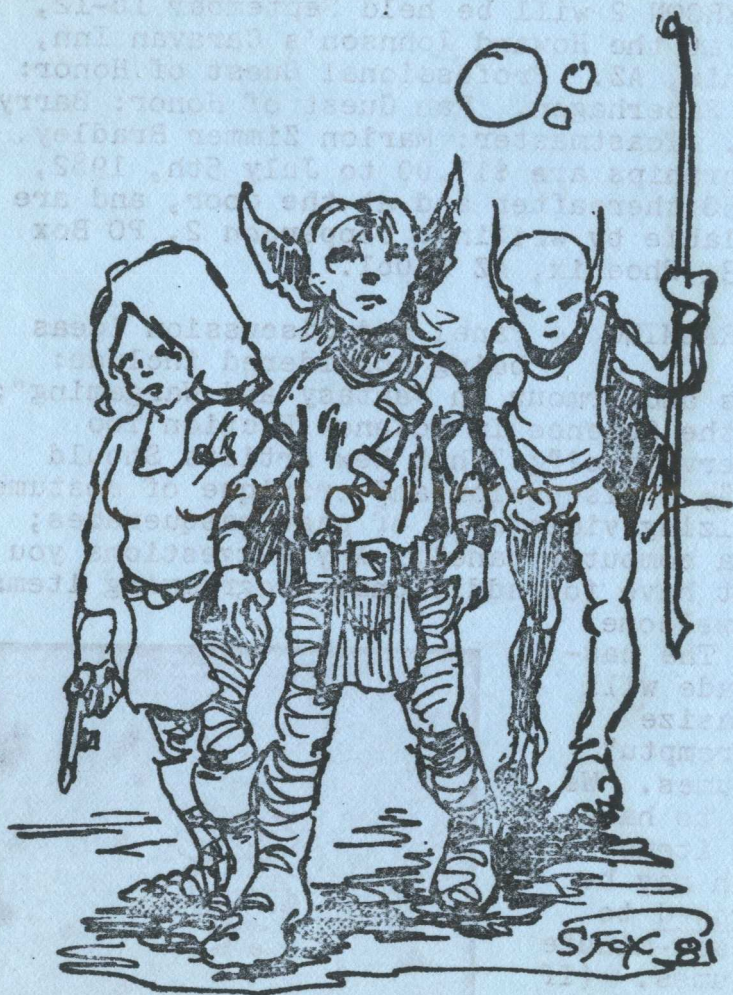

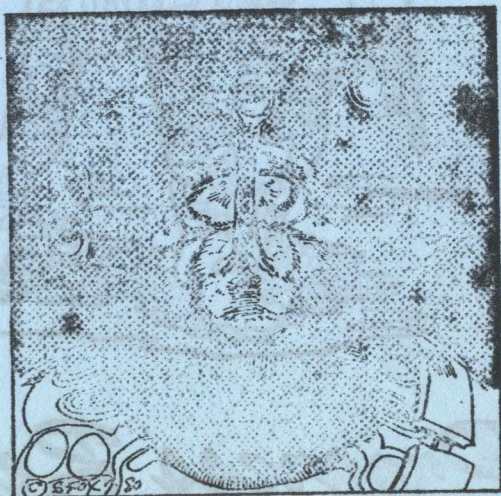
Progress Report 1

COPPERCON 2 will be held September 10-12, 1982 at the Howard Johnson's Caravan Inn, Phoenix, AZ. Professional Guest of Honor: Fred Saberhagen. Fan Guest of Honor: Barry Bard. Toastmaster: Marion Zimmer Bradley. Memberships are \$11.00 to July 5th, 1982, \$12.50 thereafter and at the door, and are available by writing: Coppercon 2, PO Box 11743, Phoenix, AZ 85061.

PROGRAMMING Panel and discussion ideas being considered include: "Arms and Armour In Fantasy and Wargaming"; "Is the Science In Science Fiction Too Conservative?"; "What New Artists Should Know"; a discussion and critique of costumes, utilizing videotapes of past masquerades; and a computer panel. Any suggestions you might have for additional programming items are welcome.

The masquerade will emphasize "impromptu" costumes. We hope to have some items which may be borrowed to do last-minute costumes. (If you would like to help provide things, let me know; they will be

A trivia bowl and a folksinging session & exchange are also planned.

GAMES ROOM



The wargaming facilities at Coppercon 2 will be active 24 hours a day, possibly more. A competition dungeon is being considered, as is a program to introduce newcomers to Fantasy Role Playing. Board games will be allotted space. Risk players, Bridge players, or any kind of players at all are invited. Come in and kibitz even if you don't play.

HOTEL The Howard Johnson's Carvan Inn is located at 3333 East Van Buren (a typo in our flyers says "West") in Phoenix. There is a shuttle service from the airport. From the freeway, you can either travel east on Van Buren (taking you through the often hectic downtown streets), or north on 24th or 40th Streets. On 24th, go north to Van Buren, turn right and head east to the hotel. On 40th, turn left on Van Buren and go west to the hotel.

The hotel recently completed remodeling and improvements. The improvements include a Jacuzzi and a second swimming pool. There are also shuffleboard courts and barbeque facilities available, as well as several bars, a restaurant, gift shop, barber shop and beauty salon.

The convention program book will include a guide to restaurants and eating places in the vicinity of the hotel and throughout the

Phoenix area.

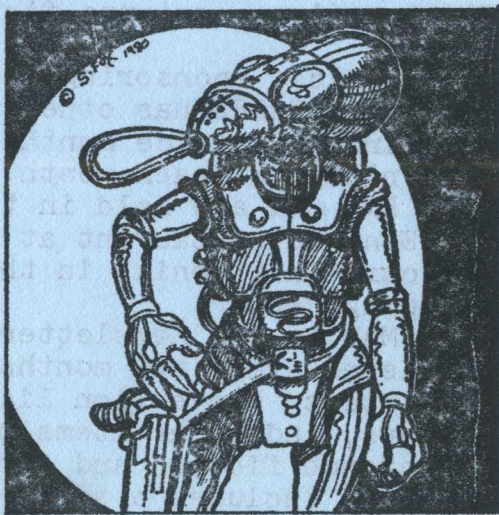
PUBLICATIONS

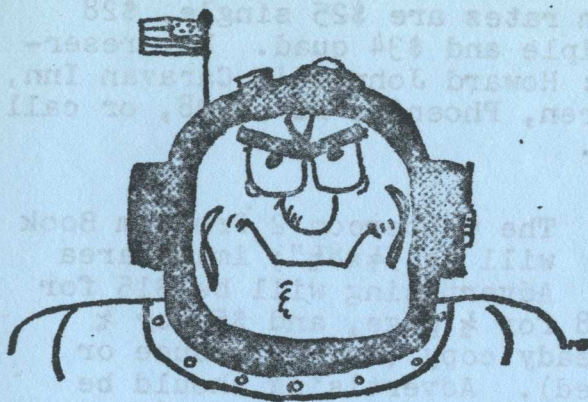
The Coppercon 2 Program Book will be $5\frac{1}{2} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$ "; image area will be $4\frac{1}{2} \times 7$ ". Advertising will be \$15 for a full page, \$8 for $\frac{1}{2}$ page, and \$5 for $\frac{1}{4}$ page, camera-ready copy (we can reduce or expand as needed). Advertising should be included no later than August 31, 1982.

WEAPONS POLICY

Realistic-looking weapons should be peacebonded during the convention, i.e., fastened or tied down in such a manner that they cannot be drawn. This also applies to real weapons such as edged knives or swords.

An exception to this policy is that special arrangements may be made for a masquerade presentation; contact Pati Cook for such arrangements. Zapguns (flashing lights, buzzing noises, etcetera) do not require peacebonding, but common courtesy should be exercised in their use; complaints will be acted upon.





CASFS PLUG

CASFS

is the acronym for the Central Arizona Speculative Fiction Society, the sponsoring organization behind

Coppercon. CASFS is a non-profit organization formed for the furtherance of speculative fiction (i.e., science fiction & fantasy) fandom.

Besides sponsoring and organizing conventions, CASFS has other activities. Meetings are held twice monthly, on the 2nd and 4th Fridays of each month. Meetings start at 8:00 PM, and are held in the banquet room of the Bonanza restaurant at 7th Street & Missouri in Phoenix, in the Cinema Park shopping center.

MAW is the newsletter of CASFS, and is published every two months. MAW contains news items, convention listings, book & movie reviews, and other items of interest to fans of science fiction and fantasy. Membership in CASFS includes a subscription to MAW.

Membership in CASFS costs \$12 per year, \$7 for half a year, and \$4 for a quarter of a year. A lifetime membership is also available for \$150.
