

Progress Report 1





Board games will be allotted space. Risk players, Bridge players, or any kind of players at all are invited. Come in and kibitz even if you don't play.

HOTEL The Howard Johnson's Carvan Inn is located at 3333 East Van Buren (a typo in our flyers says "West") in Phoenix. There is a shuttle service from the airport. From the freeway, you can either travel east on Van Buren (taking you through the often hectic downtown streets), or north on 24th or 40th Streets. On 24th, go north to Van Buren, turn right and head east to the hotel. On 40th, turn left on Van Buren and go west to the hotel.

The hotel recently completed remodeling and improvements. The improvements include a Jacuzzi and a second swimming pool. There are also shuffleboard courts and barbeque facilities available, as well as several bars, a restaurant, gift shop, barber shop and beauty salon.

The convention program book will include a guide to restaurants and eating places in the vicinity of the hotel and throughout the


Phoenix area.



Coppercon. CASFS is a non-profit organization formed for the furtherance of speculative fiction (i.e., science fiction & fantasy)

fandom.

Besides sponsoring and organizing conventions, CASFS has other activities. Meetings are held twice monthly, on the 2nd and 4th Fridays of each month. Meetings start at 8:00 PM, and are held in the banquet room of the Bonanza restaurant at 7th Street & Missouri in Phoenix, in the Cinema Park shopping center.

MAW is the newsletter of CASFS, and is published every two months. MAW contains news items, convention listings, book & movie reviews, and other items of interest to fans of science fiction and fantasy. Membership in CASFS includes a subscription to MAW.

Membership in CASFS costs \$12 per year, \$7 for half a year, and \$4 for a quarter of a year. A lifetime membership is also available

for \$150.
