

HOTEL

The special CopperCon rate is \$42 (plus tax) for single-quad occupancy. These are DELUXE oversized rooms with a wet bar and refrigerator in every room. We ask you to make early reservations (1-800-528-7867 or 945-7666 locally) as the number of rooms at this rate are limited.

The hotel is at 4925 N. Scottsdale Road (just north of Camelback Road) in Scottsdale. Limo service is available from the airport for \$7.00. Two restaurants are in the hotel with more across the street.

While the sleeping area of the hotel is two stories, the all-new convention facilities are all on the ground floor. We will be the only ones using their function space . . . and we have almost doubled our space over last year's con...and this year the parking is free!

The hotel is waiving their normal policy of a first-night's deposit for reservations. However, they will bill no-shows if 72-hour notice is not given for cancellations.

PROGRAMMING

CopperCon is the Phoenix area's RelaxaCon/PartyCon. Yes, we will have programming and scheduled events; but at an unhurried, one-track pace.



Good ideas happily stolen - send suggestions



GUESTS

Somtow Sucharitkul, Pro Guest of Honor. The first thing we want to point out about Somtow is that he recently won the John W. Campbell award for the best new SF writer of the year. He is an *extremely* good writer, often outrageous, and a very high-energy individual. The second thing that bears mentioning is that the name is Thai and "it's pronounced the way it's spelled".

His novels include "Starship and Haiku" and "Mallworld" and his short stories are collected in "Fire from the Wine Dark Sea". The last is highly recommended, especially for its enlightening interviews with Somtow.

Samuel E. Konkin III, Fan Guest of Honor. CopperCon 4 is honoring Sam Konkin's contributions in the APA and fanzine fields, perhaps most notably for his New Libertarian newsletters. He's a member of the Los Angeles fan organization, LASFS, and of the local non-profit group that puts on this convention, CASFS. Many of you may already know him from his attendance of past Phoenix area Cons.

OTHER GUESTS. Several others have expressed interest in possibly attending CopperCon 4. These include LepreCon 10's Writer GOH C. J. Cherryh, Star Trek author and rep Susan Sackett, filker and song writer Leslie Fish, editor and author Ed Bryant, and others.



BANQUET



A few highlights and facts you may wish to know are:


- 1) No entry fee
