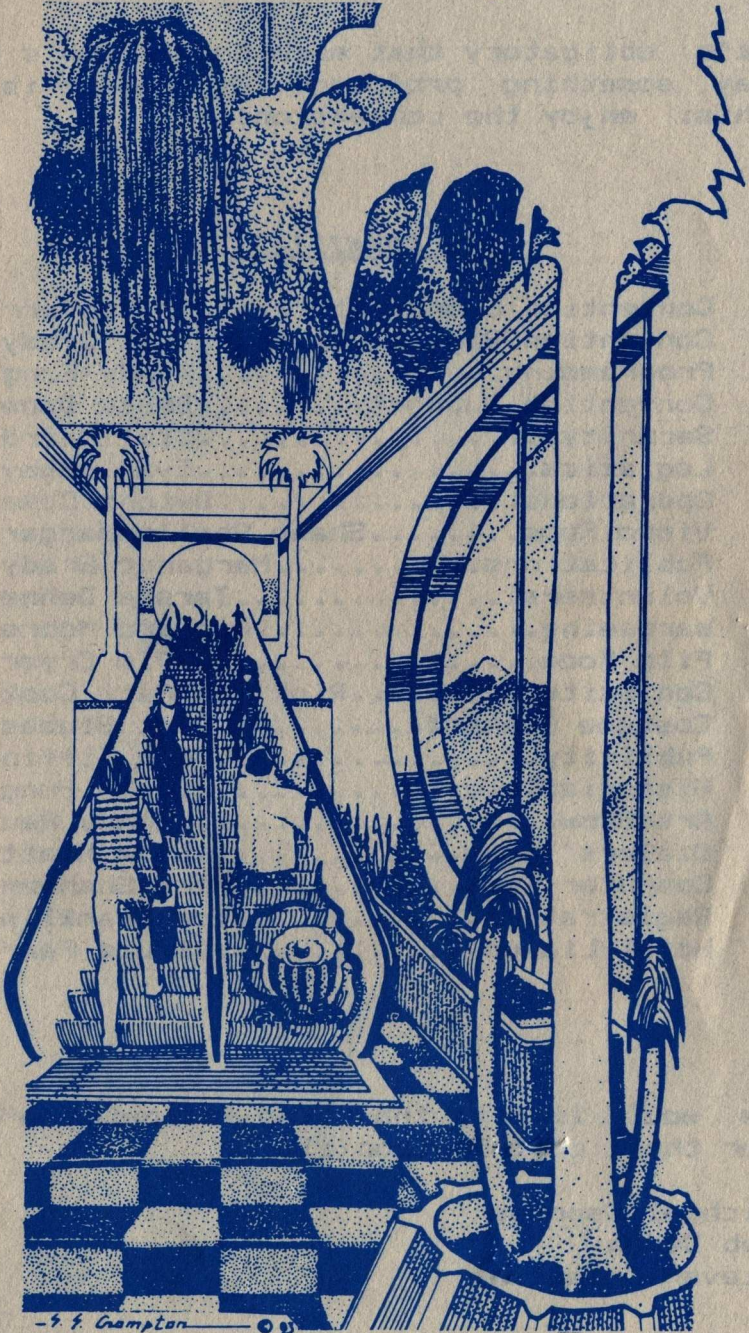

This is the fourth year of a convention that was conceived, in the words of the convention's first chair, "First, to give us all a chance to get together and enjoy each other's company (and) second, to provide an opportunity to unwind and to gossip after the WorldCon . . . and most important, to have fun." To that end, we are making a fannish tradition of replaying WorldCon costume contests, having a panel on what happened at the WorldCon (which is usually the weekend just prior to CopperCon), and helping underwrite open parties at our con.



We also have an excellent committee in my humble estimation. They, with your help, will combine to make your con experience at CopperCon 4 one you'll enjoy remembering for years.

HOTEL

The special CopperCon rate is \$42 (plus tax) for single-double occupancy. These are DELUXE oversized rooms with a wet bar and refrigerator in every room. We ask you to make early reservations (1-800-528-7867 or 945-7666 locally) or by using the enclosed reservation card as the number of rooms at this rate are limited.

The hotel is at 4925 N. Scottsdale Road (just north of Camelback Road) in Scottsdale. Limo service is available from the airport for \$7.00. Two restaurants are in the hotel with more across the street.

While the sleeping area of the hotel is two stories, the all-new convention facilities are all on the ground floor. We will be the only ones using their function space . . . and we have almost doubled our space over last year's con...and this year the parking is free!

The hotel is waiving their normal policy of a first-night's deposit for reservations. However, they will bill no-shows if 72-hour notice is not given for cancellations.

IMPORTANT!! Anyone who is under 18 is required to have a parent or guardian sign their hotel checkin form if they are staying in the hotel. This is required by the fact that minors cannot be held responsible for unpaid hotel bills!

REGISTRATION

Registration will open Friday morning at 10am and will stay open until 8pm. Afterhours registration will be out of the Convention Office. The same hours will apply Saturday with afterhours at the Con Office. Sunday all registration will be out of the Con Office. Registration during regular hours will be on-line using computers.

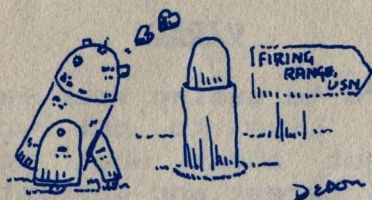

PROGRAMMING

Besides our Guests of Honor (Somtow Sucharitkul and Samuel Konkin III - see PR1 for more info), we have confirmed Susan Sackett. She will be bringing some unusual Star Trek footage as well as personal slides on the making of the Star Trek movies. Susan is best known for being Gene Roddenberry's Executive Assistant and as an author of several books on Star Trek.

We will also have a presentation from the Arizona Doctor Who club, which will bring several first-season Peter Davidson shows. There will also be a meeting of the Dragonriders Club during the Con.

We are in the process of contacting or confirming several mainstream SF authors, including Ed Bryant, Fred Saberhagen, Jack Williamson, Roger Zelazny, and others. We aren't promising that they will attend, but we expect that some will stop over on the way back from L.A.con II (WorldCon) in Los Angeles the week prior to our Con.

Our program will include a Trivia Bowl, starting Saturday afternoon with elimination rounds. The final competition will be Sunday after the Banquet; approximately 2pm. It will be played Jeopardy style and the questions will cover all phases of SF.

BANQUET

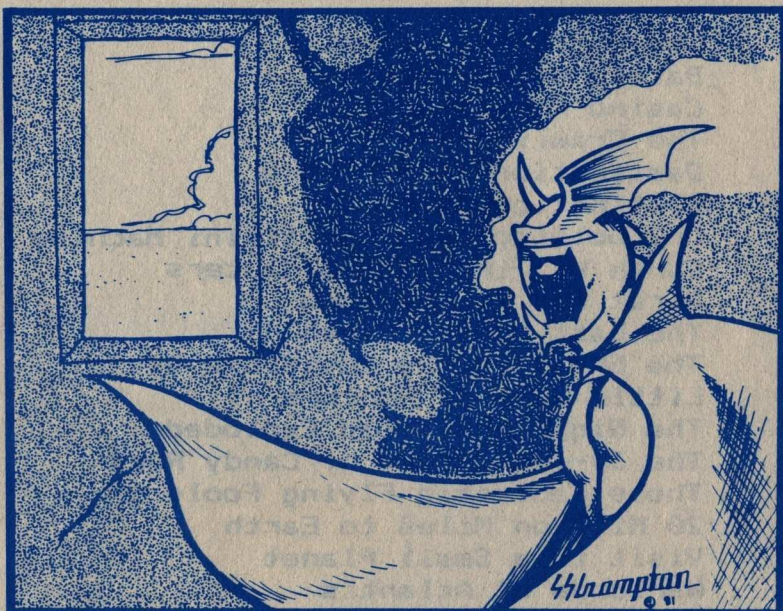

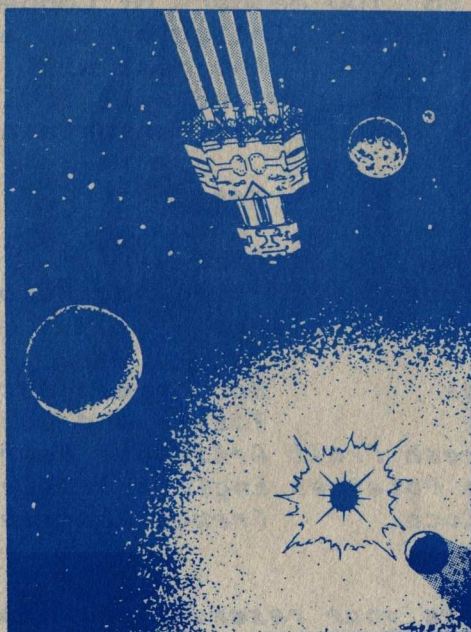

ART SHOW

A few highlights and facts you may wish to know are:

- 1) No entry fee
- 2) Limit of two 4X5 pegboard panels per artist
- 3) 3D work is limited to ten pieces
- 4) Ribbon awards will be given for the first, second, and third places in science fiction, fantasy, 3-D, and kids' art
- 5) Commission from artists' sales is 10%
- 6) There will be tables and display cases for 3-D
- 7) We'll have artist programming



Hanging of artwork starts 9am Friday morning and the room opens Friday at noon. Open to 7pm on Friday, 9-9 on Saturday, and Sunday 9am to 10am. The art auction starts at 11am on Sunday.

MASQUERADE CASTING CALL

It's not always easy to do something new with your basic masquerade/costume contest, so we are not going to attempt anything radical with it this year. We will be using a raised stage and runway which should make for better viewing and showing off. Contestants should be reminded that this means there will be at least one step up and down, and should engineer their costumes accordingly. If we can figure out how to hang them, we will have a pastel blue and gold backdrop, so again contestants should engineer their costumes accordingly. Not all colors will show up as well as they should against such a background. Other changes are being made to

make it easier for the people who put in so many dreary hours making costumes to thrill and titillate their audience!

There will be four basic categories of judging; pre-pubescent, reMEDIAL studies, audience favorite, and best in show. The judges will have the option of no more than 5 other categories to be made up on the spot, if deserved. In addition, your humble MC and masquerade organizer will be awarding the First Annual Ken Hall Memorial Putridity Award (Ken Hall not eligible) to the costume judged most tasteless in the vein plagiarized by Mr. Hall. Signups will be at the registration table Friday afternoon and evening, at the keg in the consuite Friday night, and at the table again Saturday morning. No signups will be allowed after 2pm Saturday. The masquerade will start promptly at 8pm Saturday night. Latecomers will be embarassed and executed. There will be a photo session prior or after the event (we don't know yet). No flash photos allowed during the event.



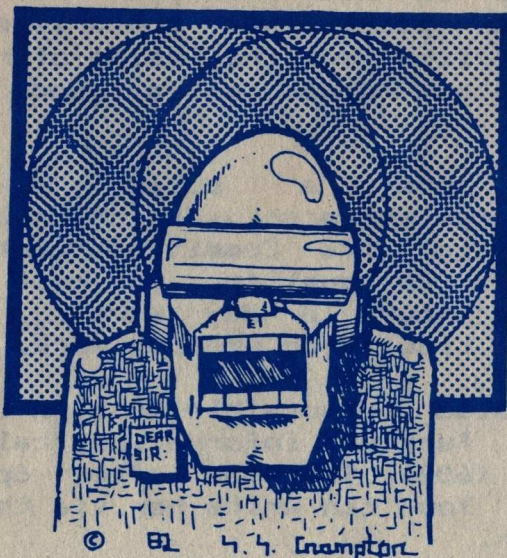
SECURITY

The Security team is being built for CopperCon IV. There are a few openings for volunteers who can help us.

The weapons policy this year is:

- 1) No real firearms
- 2) No projectile devices (includes water pistols, lasers, ping-pong ball guns, bows and arrows, etc.)
- 3) No realistic guns (fake, but look like the real thing)
- 4) No spiked apparel
- 5) Knives, swords, or any pointed or edged weapon must be accompanied by a sheath or scabbard capable of protecting the entire edge/point. Peace bonding is not required, but is guaranteed to be a *reasonable* weapons behavior, as in #6
- 6) All behavior involving weapons must be *reasonable* as judged by Security

Please note that convention badges remain the property of the convention until the close of the Con Monday morning.

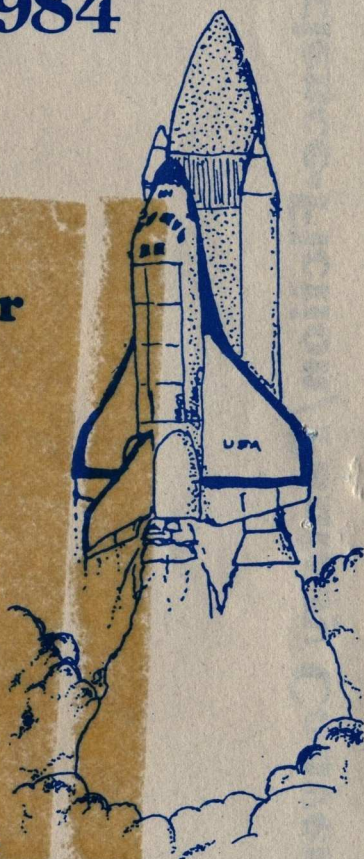
