

Author Guest of Honor Simon Hawke

Some people claim that Simon Hawke is actually a pseudonym for Doc Savage, while others think it's really Gore Vidal writing commercial novels under another name to help support his literary work and dissolute lifestyle. In reality, Simon Hawke is a changeling who was stolen by Russian gypsies when he was a child and raised in the wilds of the Carpathian Mountains, where he learned to classify wildflowers by phylum and communicate with bats. He came to America in the early 1800's by stowing away on a clipper ship in a steamer trunk lined with his native earth and has survived ever since by drinking the blood of editors and taking megadoses of vitamins to compensate for its inferior quality. He has written more books than it is possible to count, many published abroad in Swahili, Sanskrit, and Esperanto, and his hobbies are javelina wrestling, quessing bra sizes, and sacrificing virgins (if he can ever find one).

A bit more detail: Simon Hawke (a pen name for Nicholas Yermakov) has written dozens of books in the fantasy and science fiction genres under several names. As Yermakov he created his Boomerang Series (The Last Communion, Epiphany, Jehad), Journey from Flesh, Fall Into Darkness, Clique, and with Glen Larson, the Battlestar Galactica novels The Living Legend and War of the Gods. As J.D. Masters, Berkley published his Steele Series (Steele, Cold Steele, Killer Steele, Jagged Steele, and Renegade Steele). As Simon Hawke, he wrote a dozen novels for his time-travelling Time Wars Series (from The Ivanhoe Gambit and The Timekeeper Conspiracy to The Cleopatra Affair and The Sixgun Solution). His Wizard Series (from The Wizard of 4th Street to The Wizard of Lovecraft's Cafe) has been very popular, as have his Reluctant Sorceror books (which he recently completed with The Ambivalent Magician). Other novels include those in his Psychodrome, Sons of Glory, and Catseye Gomez series, and his current books for TSR in

their Tribe Of One Series (which includes, so far, The Outcast, The Seeker, The Nomad, and The Broken Blade).

All of these great books are in addition to three Star Trek novels (both Classic and TNG) and many other novels and short stories that aren't a part of any series (including his latest, The Whims of Creation). He currently teaches Dragon Slaying 101 and Advanced Dragon Slaying at Pima Community College in Tucson. On top of all that, this prolific author is a perfect convention guest, full of great stories and fascinating observations — catch him on various panels throughout the convention and at other times, socializing with his fans.

Artist Guest of Honor Davin Lavikka

Born in Denver to an artistic family (his sister is a graphic designer and his mother is a freelance artist specializing in ceramics and oil painting), Davin had his first piece of commercial art published in the *Denver Post* at the tender age of 8.

Describing his art as graphic symbology, he favors vivid colors on black backgrounds utilizing an illustrative and surreal style. He lists his primary influences as Marcus Pierson, Mark Fredrickson, Simon Bisley, and Frank Frazetta. The fantastic spaceships in *Star Wars* urged him into the science fiction genre.

Currently a resident of Tempe, Davin has had showings at Studio 16, Coconino Community College, Dancing Monk Studio, and the Santa Fe House. Talk with this talented artist at DarkCon and examine his art closely — you'll be surprised at some of the details.

Music Guest of Honor Joe Bethancourt

Joe has been making music most of his life and, with that amount of practice, is able to play 64 different instruments (though he's not bringing them all to DarkCon!). He now has some new high-tech equipment to play with (which he will be bringing to the convention).

He's been active in the Society for Creative Anachronism for most of its existence, and has been a well-known entertainer in the valley for many years. He's come out with a slew of albums, all of which are being re-released by WailSongs. Just released is *Our Fathers of Old* (with Leslie Fish) and *Serious Steel* is in the works. Also just re-released is *Who Fears the Devil*, based on the short stories of Manly Wade Wellman.

Come listen to this fantastic entertainer and enjoy some of the dozens of songs he's written with science fiction and fantasy themes, as well as other great contemporary and folk music.

Other Activities


