

This is my opportunity to give you a little insight into the people and ideas that are DarkCon. DarkCon is the brainchild of The Dark Ones, Inc., a social 501 (c) 10 non-profit corporation. The Dark Ones are known for their interests and activities involving the promotion of various forms of art including personification, costuming, photography, brewing, and of course the art of partying.

For over five years, The Dark Ones have been attending or throwing social gatherings for fandom in the Phoenix (and now Tucson and Casa Grande) area. The most well-known of course, are the big dance and beer parties at local cons, where loud rock music and free Michelob have become legendary. But I would like to point out a few other events maybe a little less known. Each year, the Dark Ones hosts smaller events like Grim

Guests of Honor

Simon Hawke Author Guest of Honor

Simon Hawke has been writing professionally for about 20 years and has over 60 novels to his credit. He received a Bachelor's degree in Communications from Hofstra University and a Masters in English and History from Western New Mexico University. Prior to becoming a full-time writer, he worked as a rock musician, an FM dee jay, a custom motorcycle builder, a bartender, a radio engineer, and a host of other colorful and not-so-colorful occupations. He loves fast motorcycles and has owned dozens of them, and once seriously considered racing at the Isle of Man, but sanity, self-preservation and the ludicrously high cost of Grand Prix motorcycle racing prevailed. Otherwise, by the age of 30, he had fulfilled every fantasy he ever had except one, and this year, at the ripe old age of 43, he took on that last challenge and started performing stand-up comedy in local Tucson clubs such as Gargoyle's and Laff's. He may develop it into a second career, but absolutely draws the line at sitcoms.

He teaches a science fiction and fantasy writing course called Dragonslaying 101 through Pima College and also runs the Sonora Writers Workshop from his home in the Sierrita Mountains, about 35 miles west of Tucson.

His forthcoming novel, *Birthright: The Iron Throne*, will launch a new game world for TSR and he is currently work-

ing on about three new projects simultaneously, among them the final novel in his *Wizard* series, a Young Adult novel, and an epic fantasy trilogy.

A compulsive workaholic, Simon doesn't have a lot of free time, but when he can, he enjoys shooting handguns, gardening, reading history and biography, studying metaphysics, playing with a local medieval group called the Empire of Chivalry and Steel, feeding coyotes, and collecting fantasy art. He may also be the first author to have the cover painting of one of his novels (David Mattingly's "Ivanhoe Gambit") tattooed on his body. He is single and a confirmed eccentric.

Davin Lavikka Artist Guest of Honor

Born in Denver to an artistic family (his sister is a graphic designer and his mother is a freelance artist specializing in ceramics and oil painting), Davin had his first piece of commercial art published in the *Denver Post* at the tender age of 8.

Describing his art as graphic symbology, he favors vivid colors on black backgrounds utilizing an illustrative and surreal style. He lists his primary influences as Marcus Pierson. Mark Fredrickson, Simon Bisley and Frank Frazetta. The fantastic spaceships in Star Wars urged

him into the science fiction genre.

Currently a resident of Tempe, Davin has had showings at Studio 16,

Coconino Community College, Dancing Monk Studio, and the Santa Fe House.

Talk with this talented artist at DarkCon and examine his art closely — you'll be surprised at some of the details.

Joe Bethancourt Music Guest of Honor

Joe has been making music most of his life and, with that amount of practice, is able to play 64 different instruments (though he's not bringing them all to DarkCon!). He now has some new high-tech equipment to play with (which he will be bringing to the convention).

He's been active in the Society for Creative Anachronism for most of its existence, and has been a well-known entertainer in the valley for many years. He's come out with a slew of albums, all of which are being rereleased by WailSongs. Just released is Our Fathers of Old (with Leslie Fish) and Serious Steel is in the works. Also just re-released is Who Fears the Devil, based on the short stories of Manly Wade Wellman.

Come listen to this fantastic entertainer and enjoy some of the dozens of songs he's written with science fiction and fantasy themes, as well as other great contemporary and folk music.


