DFFP SOUTH NFWS LETTER

wanted to put a real Witches' spell on. But thats still
another story. Back to what I started to say.

At the DSC plans were made to organize Southern Fandom. The
plans reached the stage of electing a Chairman and Secretary.

Now what is the best plan to keep in touch? Should it be by carbon letters, fanzines, or RR? Lets hear your ideas on this. What do you think of regional meetings? How should they be set up? I'm sure most people would prefer meetings on week ends. If possible I will try and meet with any county in Tennessee and will help in anyway I can. Anyway our first job is to find out about fans in our own area.

The DSC in Atlanta in August will be a fine place to complete plans for organizing Southern Fandom. But we should have lots done by then. There's plenty time to think of a boundary line to be designed as Southern. Shall we start with the place where people go barefoot and chew tobacco? Right now we are open to suggestions so flood us with them.

If East Tennessee Fandom would like to meet some Saturday let me know and I'll make arrangements for a place to meet. It would be better I'm sure to wait until May or June when the weather is warmer. Maybe we could have serious discussions followed with some old stf tapes...even the one of the last DSC. Then too we might have some slides etc. Any idea is worth exploring, but one we might think some about is meeting and doing a one shot.
