
Please make sure to give a warm welcome to our Guests of Honor when you see them around the convention!

JTFP offer a safe and comforting environment for sharing empathetic conversation, receiving relevant health and nutritional guidance. JTFP offers a place where you can select from a wide assortment of nutritional foods to take home.

100% of proceeds from the Charity Auction and Sketch Off will go to this program. Both are being held in Terrace. Anyone can bid! Your badge number is your bidder number.

Book Drive

The WesternSFA is sponsoring a book drive to benefit the Children First Academy of Phoenix, a charter school with a goal to provide services directed toward poverty-level and homeless children in grades K-8.

At each Phoenix-area convention at which WesternSFA is present there will be a special donation box near the Fan Tables. We will be collecting books to distribute to homeless children. This donation will stock the school library. The age ranges vary, but we would particularly like to see juvenile fiction. Please take some time to clear your shelves and closets of unwanted books and help a child.

Food Drive

We're also hosting a non-perishable food/pet food drive at LepreCon to benefit Joshua Tree Feeding Program. It's set up as a "store" so clients can pick and choose what food they prefer so this empowers clients and no food is wasted. It also has a partnership with Phoenix Children's Hospital's Bill Holt Clinic.

In 2010 JTFP started the Pet Assistance Project (PAP) so every other week their clients get free dog or cat food so their furbabies get fed. The PAP also gives those clients information and resources for low-cost neutering as well as vet care.

Appreciation—Baron Dixon (Local Artist GoH)

I met Mr. Dixon for the first time when were constructing a two story tall Black Widow spider that I had designed for a local gallery show. When it was completed, I fell into a very unconstrained, maniacal "IT LIVES!!!!! THE CREATURE LIVES!!!!! BOO AHH HAA HAAA!!!!!" exposition and Baron decided I was weird and offbeat enough. Obviously "whatever lock was on the cage I was supposed to be in was broken", therefore I must be a kindred soul, and O.K. to befriend. That creature still comes out to play for a month each year (the spider... I'm on the loose all year round) and is now on its 12th year...

We've been friends and allies in many endeavors since that time. A man of many talents and a good friend of mine, Baron Dixon's background is extremely varied one, composing an abundance of abilities into a dynamo of creativity.

He's a Master prop maker; give Baron an empty milk jug and he'll create a helmet, an epaulette or a piece of art worthy of a gallery discussion. Ever see a piranha-likened Cretaceous creation curiously composed of glue sticks generously intertwined into fossils of former ferocity?

Or, do your preferences lean more towards the animalistic antics of felines of a circa '50s feel, functioning freely while inexplicably intermingling with their daily thoughts, both the real and the absurd? Need some elevator music for the background of a scene? See Baron. Cover art for a poster or the band's latest thrashin' hot, new album/CD? Need a background voice "from beyond" or "Mr. Movie Phone"? He can do it for you in "Baron Tone". Ask him about his exceptionally rendered *Tyrannovision* web series!

A wordy fellow, with a *huge* library of movies on file and a memory to match, he can generally recall the names of the actors, directors, and many of the crew, as well as background stories surrounding the flick.

Baron is an extremely talented writer, creator, designer, skilled actor, digital musical score musician, videographer, graphic art designer, former Artisan of the Cosanti group. And, as a painter? He's painted everything from full stage sets to photorealistic fine art and everything in-between.

These things don't *begin* to touch on my past experiences with him. Partnered with a third artist, we *were* working on a full scale *working* H. G. Wells time machine... But "past", "present" and "future" are still such... fluid concepts. Don't you think, Mr. Wells?

Maya has co-authored *Star Wars* novels, pre-Disney. But the legends are all true, Han said so. The *Meri* series is there for the fans of fantasy. And *The Antiquities Hunter* was published recently for detective fans.



Appreciation—Madame Askew (Costuming GoH)

LepreCon is blessed to have Madame Askew as the Costuming Guest of 2019. A delightful force for good, Madame Askew can best be recognized for her stunning original garments, her glowing personality as a performer, and her drive and desire to share her art with the world.

Madame Askew, as a seamstress and costumer, embodies both the vintage detail and radical reimagining that is at the heart of Steampunk. As a professional Steampunk performer for over eight years, Madame Askew's fashion focuses primarily on utilizing traditional Victorian designs bringinging whimsy and unencumbered joy through what some would say excessive numbers of pleats—80 feet of pleats in the most recent project alone! Using mostly traditional and historical patterns, Madame Askew creates one of a kind masterpieces with fine details and embellishments to take a project from merely completed to a work that is a sight to behold.

An educator at heart, Madame Askew brings all of her skills to the digital world to assist aspiring costumers everywhere. Madame Askew offers, at no cost, weekly "Teatorial" live videos to provide guidance on many sartorial skills from the simple act of sewing on a button to hat construction to creating a variable fleet of pleats. During these videos Madame Askew offers support and will answer any questions had by the audience. Additionally, when she discovers a new sewing trick, hack, or skill, she quickly offers it to her audience. Beyond being an educator, she creates a space where anyone, of any skill level or body type, would feel safe to create and be a part of art.

Far from being just a showpiece, the ultimate experience with Madame Askew is to see her perform and host events in full regalia. A comedic star to be reckoned with, Madame Askew focuses on creating pockets of whimsical joy in a complicated and sometimes harsh world. The goal of any Madame Askew event is to build a community of kindness between the audience and the participants, be that Tea Duelling, Splendid Teapot Racing, or simply an educational panel on the history of Tea. Utilizing her knowledge of language and her upending Victorian Ideals, Madame Askew focuses on creating comedy that celebrates the diversity that can exist and should exist in any community.

Madame Askew, like her costumes, is a combination of discrete skills and imagination that are forged through hard work to create something that reflects more than its components. Madame Askew isn't just a brilliant costumer. She is a community leader, a delightful comedian and an expert educator, but above all she is a friend to all. While she would never admit accept it—she's too modest—she is an inspiration to us all to be more noble, more creative and more delightful.

The first time I heard Jeff and Maya perform in a filk circle at a Westercon in Seattle, I was blown away. They hadn't been filking long back then and had no filk albums to sell, but had written some wickedly hysterically funny filks to classic rock tunes and, due to the fantastic quality of their acoustic performance, they stood out from us dabblers.

I found out later that they had spent years gigging professionally in cover bands before settling down with mundane jobs and raising their children. Maya's ethereal vocals and Jeff's brilliant mastery of guitar held me and my fellow Duras Sisters utterly spellbound. We decided after the first song they sang that we would use two of our three picks in the largest Bardic filk I have ever been in to request the Bohnhoffs to play more music.

As the years passed I have had the honor to count Jeff and Maya and their family as part of my own. Not only are they are brilliant and extraordinarily talented, they are also kind, generous and deeply spiritual people who share a joy of life and music everywhere they go. If you have never heard them perform, I almost envy you that magical moment when you first hear their delightful parodies and gorgeous original music.

High Desert, written on a road trip from California through Nevada and on to Arizona is my absolute favorite, but Manhattan Sleeps, Persian Rose and Road to Jerusalem are close runners up. Their parodies such as Midichlorian Rhapsody, Every Single Song She Sings, Eldorado, Six Feet Under and The Actor make me smile every time I hear the original rock recordings while singing along with the Bohnhoff lyrics.

It has been too long since Jeff and Maya have performed at an Arizona convention, so enjoy them to the fullest. Having them as Filk Guests of Honor is a treat to savour.

Fandom Cheat Sheet

As a traditional science fiction/fantasy con, LepreCon 45 follows many traditions. If you're new to these, they may seem strange, so here's a quick cheat sheet to guide you through such traditions.

Charity Auction - Many cons hold auctions of donated items for charity. Ours will be in aid of the Joshua Tree Feeding Program, Inc., which has been feeding the HIV/AIDS community in metro Phoenix since 1988. Anyone can attend and bid. Your bid number is your badge number.

ConSuite - A hotel room where attendees can visit, eat (for free) and find both good conversation and a place to relax. Our ConSuite is in suite 317.

Dead Dog - At the end of a con, when all the programming has finished, there's often a final party (and maybe filk session) for those fans who don't want to go home yet.

Fan Tables - These are free tables for local non-profits who want to promote. Ours are all in the hallway outside the Dealers' Room. Chat with these folk about what they do.

Filk - Songs with a sf/f focus that are often set to highly familiar tunes. Saguaro is our filk room at LepreCon 45. Open filk sessions are when anyone can join in.

GoHs - Guests of Honor are individuals of note that we've chosen to honor by bringing them out to be a special focus. Please make them especially welcome.

Hall Costumes - Hall Costumes are thoses worn while walking about the con, rather than at a competition like a masquerade. Secret judges may award hall costume prizes.

Meet the Guests - An opportunity to mingle and chat with our GoHs. Ours is at 4pm on Friday in Terrace and will be followed by an Ice Cream Social in the ConSuite.

Operations - If you've lost something or have a question about the con, talk with our Operations team. Our Operations room is right outside the Art Show.

Room Party - A party held in the evening, often to promote a group, a con or an event but often for no reason but fun. If a room party door is open, you're welcome to enter for free food, drink and company.

Perhaps best known for her whimsical tea adventures with her partner, the Grand Arbiter, Madame is also delighted to teach sewing workshops and to host regular live sewing teatorials with her dear friend Temperance.

Dee Astell co-founded and co-runs the Arizona Penny Dreadfuls. She's the Fashion Manager for Wild Wild West Steampunk Convention, ran the steampunk track at Phoenix Comicon and has been Steampunk Coordinator for many others. She also runs maker workshops across the southwest. She chaired Westercon 70 and LepreCon 45 and will cochair CoKoCon 2019.

Hal C. F. Astell runs the Apocalypse Later Empire, which includes book, music and film reviews; a publishing imprint; an annual genre film festival; and a roadshow that has him bring mini-film festivals to conventions across the southwest. He has five books in print and *A Hundred in 2016* won the Alan Black Book of the Festival Award at Cirque du Livre in 2017. He founded and co-chaired CoKoCon 2018. He runs AZFandom.org, covering the past, present and future of Arizona fandom. He reviews books for the Nameless Zine.

The Awesomelys are a group of pop culture fans who host panels at conventions to reintroduce audiences to the guilty pleasures and underrated gems of their childhoods. We're talking movies and TV shows, the ones you know suck but somehow, against your much better judgement, you love anyway.

Gary W. Babb is the traditionally published author of eight books: a fantasy series: *Earth is Ours, Target Earth, Earth's Dragons*; a biography, *The People's Warrior*; a sci-fi series: *Genesis Logs* and *Genesis Prime*; a YA fantasy, *Dark Angels of Zeus*. Gary served in the Navy and traveled the world. These life experiences can be seen in his writing.

Len Berger, known as the "Movieman", keeps the freebie tables full of movie posters, flyers and anything else we receive for the con. Len also provides all the prizes for the At the Movies trailer presentation panels. Len is performing the functions that the late Barry Bard started decades ago and has done his best to "walk" in Barry's shoes.

Jeff & Maya Bohnhoff have an identity crisis. Their music is sometimes uproariously funny parody (like their spot-on *Bohemian Rhapsody* parody *Midichlorian Rhapsody*, or hauntingly beautiful, like *Road to Jerusalem* or *Manhattan Sleeps*. One way or another, their music will create strong emotions. Jeff and Maya have been creating music together since 1979, and plan to continue for some time to come.

Maya Bohnhoff started her writing career sketching science fiction comic books in the back row of her elementary school classroom. Her debut novel, *The Meri*, was a *Locus Best First Novel*. She penned a series of *Star Wars* novels with Michael Reaves, including the *New York Times Bestseller*, *Star Wars: The Last Jedi*. Her most recent novel, *The Antiquities Hunter: A Gina Miyoko Mystery*, marks her first steps into the world of detective fiction.

Mark Boniece has chaired 16 conventions in the Phoenix area and has lost count of the times he has volunteered in all areas of conrunning. He was Dealer Liaison and Hotel Liaison for Westercon 70. He's Chairman of CASFS and President of WesternSFA. He has also served as a director and officer for several other fan groups in AZ.

Catherine Book is appropriately named. She collects, stores, covets and otherwise lives for books. She also manages our Charity Auctions, where one can find, dare we say it —books. She can often be found standing in a line for autographs, *any* autographs. Cathy is a Staff Writer and Co-Editor for The Nameless Zine.

No photographic or videographic recording other people without consent. The fact that someone is in costume does not imply consent for photos or videos—ask first! Obtain permission before posting images of people or recordings of LepreCon online. Program participants and Guests of Honor may not allow recordings of their likeness or voice. You are encouraged to ask for unequivocal consent for all activities.

Privacy Policy

We won't sell our data to any other org. We won't release our data to any other org except to those affiliated with the event. Examples are: World Horror Con 2004, which a copy went to the World Horror Society Board of Directors as part of our responsibilities; World Fantasy Con 2004, which a copy went to the World Fantasy Society Board of Directors as part of our responsibilities; etc. Should we ask for someone's contact info, we will contact the requested party for permission or to pass along the contacting party's contact info instead.

Room Party Policy

Room Party Coordinators must purchase at minimum an Attending Full Membership, while others staffing or attending a party are encouraged, but not required, to purchase their own memberships. Room Party Coordinators are allowed to book a room/suite for a party at the convention rate, be located in the party area, and must conform to any convention-specific party rules and regulations as specified by the convention chair or committee.

Weapons Policy

Carrying and/or wearing of weapons of any kind will not be permitted, except as part of a hall costume if peace-bonded by designated convention staff. No real or realistic looking firearms are allowed and all bladed weapons must be sheathed. Any weapons purchased in the Dealers' Room must be securely wrapped before they are taken out of the room. The committee realizes that most people who would like to carry and wear weapons are sensible and careful individuals. However, because of the present liability laws, we have no choice but to comply. The safety of convention members is our overriding consideration, as well as cooperating fully with the hotel's security personnel.
