

Terry is the author of the phenomenally popular series of Discworld novels. He began his writing career at an early age with *The Carpet People* and continues to craft wonderful novels, mostly in his own universe, Discworld. While primarily considered an author of humorous fantasy, Terry's works contain a wisdom far beyond most serious fantasy novels. He has written for children as well as for adults and I think you would have to have no humor in you whatsoever if you don't laugh out loud at least once every novel. And "crivens" is not a swear word.

He is retired from the State Department's Foreign Service where he served in such places as Botswana, Russia, Nigeria, and Great Britain.
