Wait, what changed?

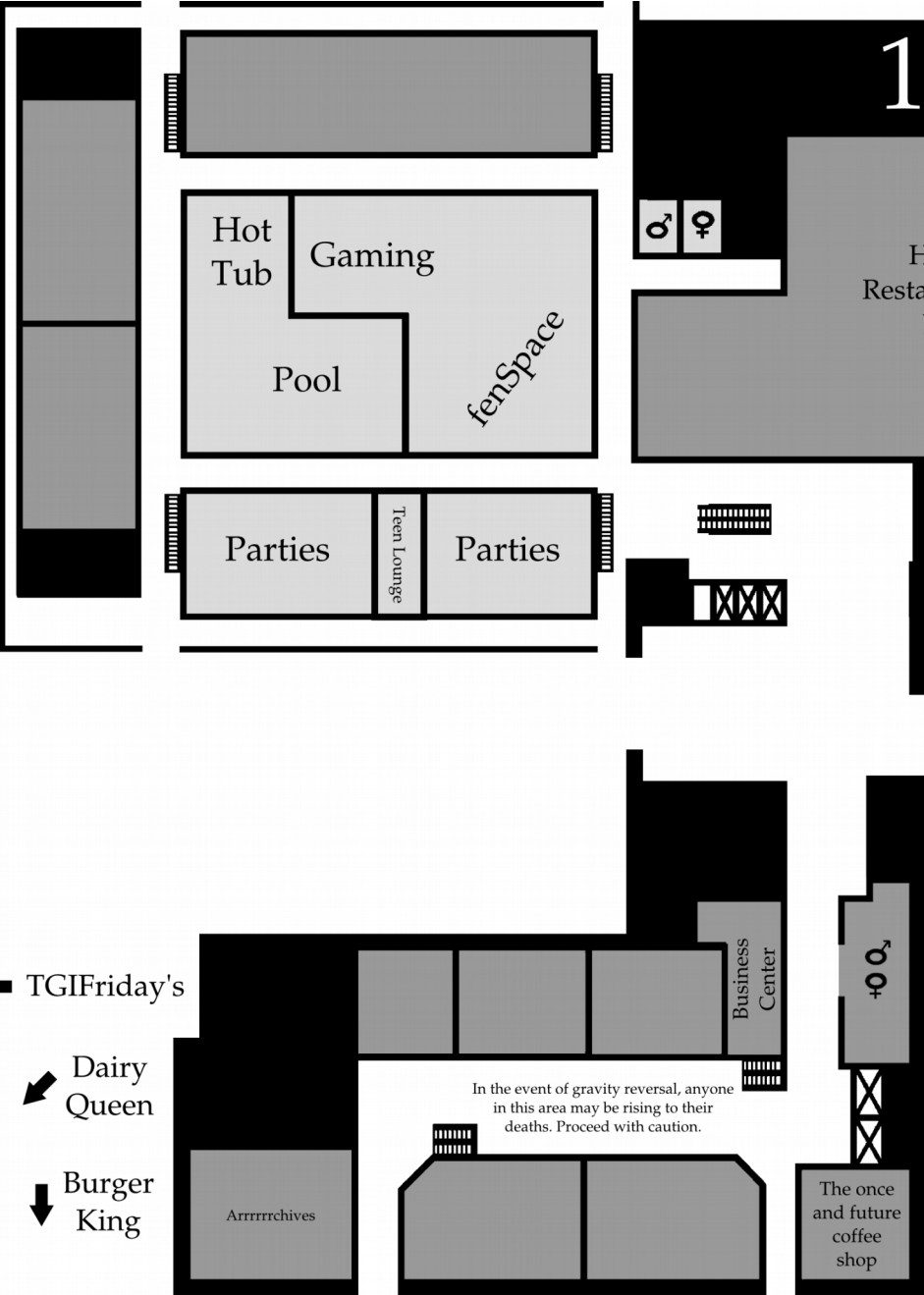
Updates and corrections to the program book and to this pocket program will be in the Minicon Bozo Bus Tribune.

In case of emergency, don't look for us – call 911!

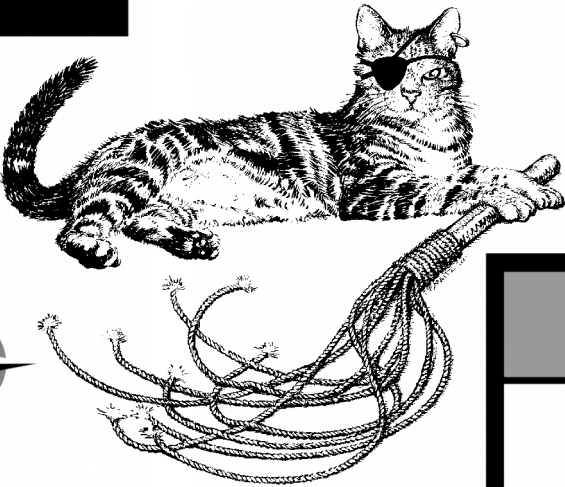


1st Floor

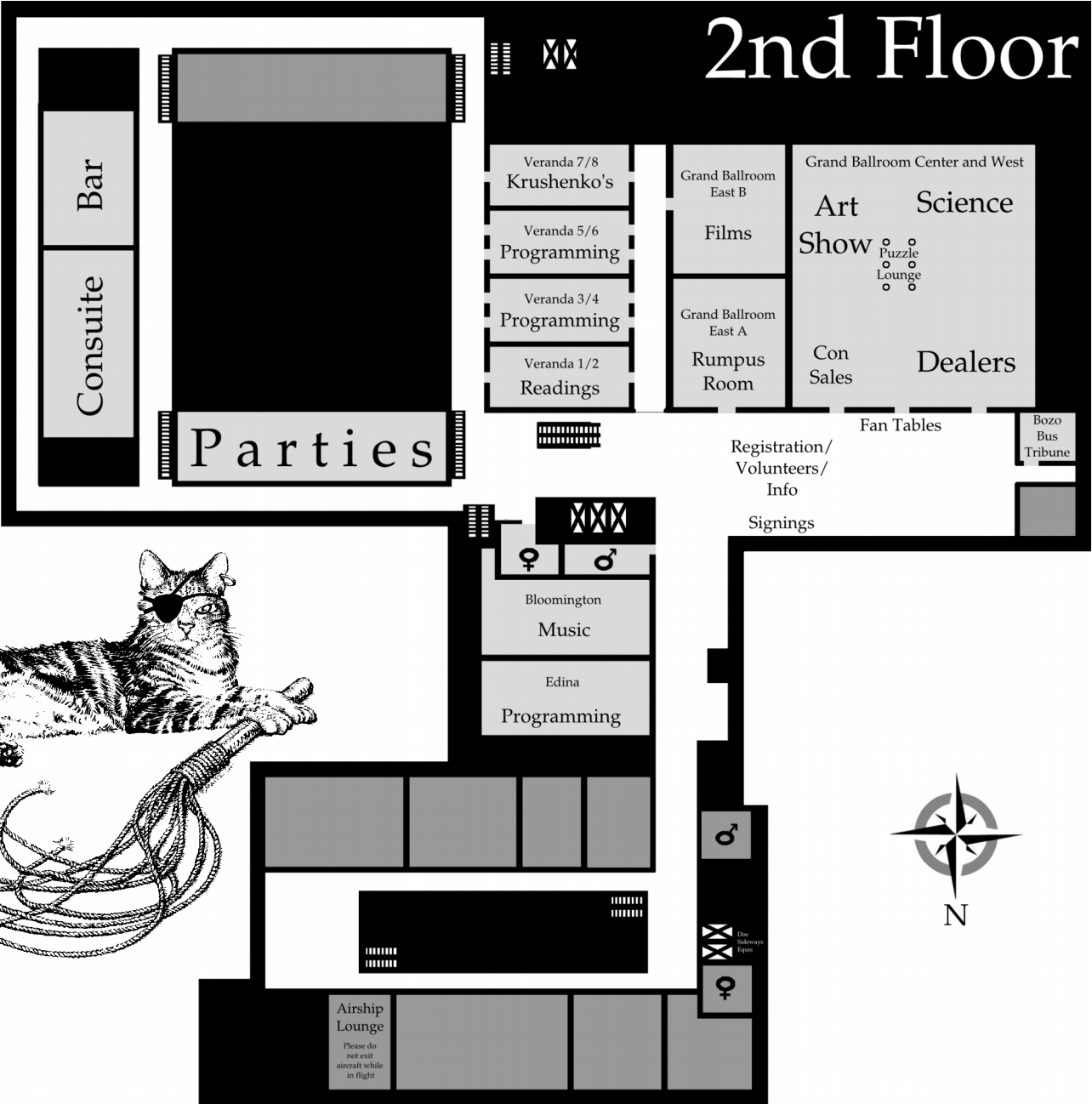
Front Desk



Subway, et cetera

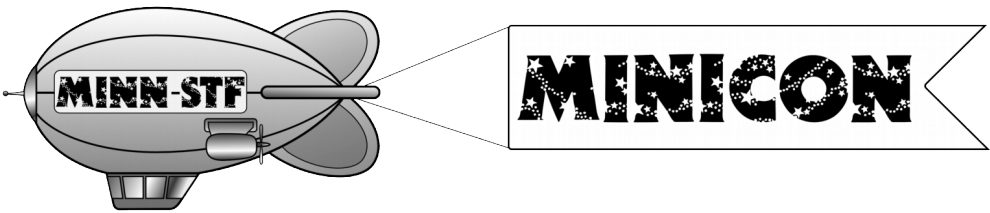


2nd Floor
