Memberships: Pre-registration closed March 9. If you didn't pre-reg, you can still pay at the door. If you did, you don't need to bring anything with you to get your badge. Just come to the reg desk at the top of the escalator. Th 10am-10pm, Fri 9:30am-8pm, Sat 9:30am-8pm, Sun 9:30am-4pm.

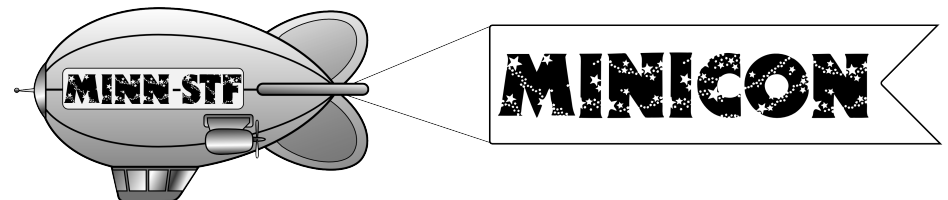
At the door: Due to an unexpectedly large number of pre-registrations, we have decided to decrease the at-the-door rate from \$70 to \$65. More members cost less per member; this reduction is in keeping with our non-profit mission. The rates: Full adult \$65. Th \$30, Fri \$40, Sat+Sun \$45, Sun \$20. Convert from supporting: additional \$40. Students (13-20) \$25, Kids (6-12) \$15, Children (0-5) no charge. We accept cash & check (**not** credit cards). FFI: registration@minicon50.mnstf.org.

Hotel: We're in the Bloomington DoubleTree. Rooms booked by March 15 are \$92. Go to mnstf.org/minicon50/hotel or call 800-222-8733, using group name "Minicon", group code "MCN". Many members had trouble booking rooms, particularly for Thursday, because our block filled up. It's been expanded: please try again. **Signage policy:** This year the hotel will let us hang signs anywhere on the walls in the pool area, plus on their provided bulletin boards elsewhere.
