Less than a month and a half to go before the big event! Corflu 24, the convention for and by fanzine fans, will be held February 9–11, 2007 at the DoubleTree Hotel Austin, located at 6505 Interstate Highway 35 North in Austin, Texas.

Do *not* wait until the last minute to make your reservation—there are very few rooms at Corflu rates available for Thursday night, and **our room block closes on January 18th.**

The Corflu rate is \$109 for a single, \$129 for a double (plus 15% state and city occupancy tax). You can book over the internet (www.austin.doubletree.com, internet code FAC), by calling toll-free (1-800-347-0330, mention the secret code words “Corflu” and “Fandom Association of Central Texas”), or by calling the hotel directly at 512-454-3737.

The “get our wagons in a circle, yo” strategy of surrounding the con suite with Corflu-booked rooms couldn't be choreographed in advance. However, by mid-day Thursday the front desk should be able to tell you the room number for the Corflu hospitality suite.

Corflu members get a discounted self-parking rate of \$5 per day, in the attached multi-level parking garage.

Getting to Austin

Austin Bergstrom International Airport features nonstop service to 35 destinations (the international one being Cancun, of course). The airport is 12 miles or 25 optimistic minutes from the hotel; average taxi fare is \$27.50, and Super



Shuttle shared-ride service is available for roughly \$15.75 one-way. (The Super Shuttle toll-free number is 1-800-BLUEVAN; their Austin direct number is 512-258-3826.) There are also Capital Metro Line buses serving the airport.

If you're driving to the DoubleTree Austin, the hotel is located at the corner of La Posada Dr. and the Interstate 35 northbound service road, between the Pappadeaux and Papisito's restaurants. If you're driving I-35 northbound, you'll want to take the FM 2222 exit; for I-35 southbound, take the Hwy. 290/FM 2222 exit, U-turn under the interstate, and turn right at La Posada Dr.

The hotel does offer a courtesy shuttle service to nearby Highland Mall, or any office, restaurant or store within a two-mile radius. You could use the shuttle service to hit a bus stop, and explore downtown or other areas from there. Capitol Metro does offer a free Dillo service in central Austin and the University of Texas area.

You can walk to and from the hotel, but I don't recommend it. Texas is not a state for pedestrians. (Nor equestrian travelers, these days.) There isn't much within easy walking distance of the hotel, unless you think the Pappas chain is the be-all and end-all of great food. The hotel does offer a shuttle to anywhere within two miles, which gets you to most of the various bus routes for public transit. Otherwise, there's driving, cadging rides, or calling for a taxi...

Texas drivers are unpredictable. Usually, in Texas, the more beat-up or muddy the vehicle, the friendlier the driver. (The more expensive the car, the ruder the driver. Watch out for H3's and Lexus SUV's in particular.) Any driver wearing a cowboy hat is usually safe, unless they have a cell phone stuck to their ear (in which case they're from Dallas or Houston and not to be trusted). On the freeways, most drivers view the speed limit as a minimum bid. (Unless there's a state trooper nearby, of course...) Highway construction is unavoidable, as are roadway obstructions which have escaped from their owners' vehicles. (Ice chests, furniture, ladders, extension cords, inflatable lake toys, sheets of plywood, bungee cords, real estate signs, bumpers, tire treads, single shoes, you name it.) And in Austin, the downtown streets are all one-way, but never going the way you want to go.

The Usual...

Attending Memberships are \$50 US through December 31, 2006, and will go up to \$65 thereafter. Supporting memberships are \$20 US. Please make checks payable to Pat Virzi, and mail them to 618 Westridge, Duncanville TX 75116.

The Corflu 24 British agent is Ian Sorensen, 3 Portia Place, Motherwell, ML1 1EL, UK (ian@soren.demon.co.uk). UK rates are £30 for attending memberships.

Following the fine tradition established at the first Corflu, an attending membership includes the mandatory Sunday banquet. If you're planning on buying your membership at the door, be warned: I must give the hotel catering office a banquet headcount by 10:00 Friday morning. If I don't know about you by then, you'll be dry toast for Sunday's lunch.

Badges, program books (with a restaurant guide by Kurt Baty), and other kipple can be picked up in the con suite any time after 3:00 on Thursday afternoon. You can also buy your t-shirt there (art by Harry Bell!).

The con suite will be open at 3:00 on Thursday afternoon, at noon on Friday and Saturday, and at 10:00 on Sunday. (It will close when it closes, of course.) There *will* be chocolate.

Murray Moore has volunteered to administer the FAAn awards again this year; there's a ballot included with this progress report, and I expect everyone to send theirs in before the January 31st deadline. (Murray has recruited Brad Foster to design the certificates, which are stunning.)

Instead of the traditional limp-stencil-in-a-typer, there'll be several "Magnetic One-Shots" (a la magnetic poetry) up in the well-stocked con suite. At Corflu's official opening on Friday night, we will select the Guest of Honor. On Saturday, plan to attend the program that Ted White has lined up, but definitely attend the obligatory auction held to raise money for TAFF and DUFF, Corflu, and HANA. (If you have any auction items to donate but don't want to schlep them, you can ship it to the Duncanville address to arrive by Monday, February 5th; remember to specify what fund you're supporting.)

The Corflu Banquet will be at 11:00 on Sunday morning. If you miss it, you'll miss the Guest of Honor speech, the Fan Achievement Awards, the fajitas and the cheesecake. (Of course, if you have special dietary requirements you'll have to let me know well in advance.)


