



From the Chairs

Everyone in the Tucson World Fantasy Convention crew is looking forward to seeing y'all again! We had such a great time in 1985 that we wanted to do it again for you in 1991.

We're not going to just do the same thing all over. Besides doing the usual high-quality Program Book you've come to expect from WFC, this time we plan to also do a complimentary, limited edition book, edited by B. D. Arthurs. There will also be

a cookbook, edited by Doreen Webbert and Jean Goddin, free to members.

The convention is honored to welcome our Special Guests, authors Susan and Harlan Ellison; our Toastmaster, author Stephen R. Donaldson, and our Artist Guest Arlin Robins.

The menu for the Banquet at the World Fantasy Awards is included in this Progress Report. If you've already bought your ticket, please let us know your selection. The default selection is Prime Rib. If you have not already purchased your ticket, now's the time since we've not yet sold out.

The hotel reservation form is enclosed for our main hotel, The Doubletree Hotel at Randolph Park. The Doubletree is the host to all official convention activities as well as open parties, so we suggest that you don't delay in sending in your form if you want to



be in that hotel. However, do look over the information in this PR on the other two hotels; The Lodge on the Desert and The Viscount Suites Hotel. Both have excellent features to recommend them — The Lodge was a great hit in 1985 with its Southwest look and feel (it sold out early in '85) and the Viscount includes a breakfast buffet, hosted cocktails and hors d'oeuvres with each room, as well as being a suite hotel. The Lodge and Viscount suggest phone reservations, and we have their numbers listed in the Hotel article. Rooms at all the hotels are approximately the same price. We'll be running a shuttle among the hotels and nearby restaurants Thursday evening to Sunday evening, through early morning hours.

The next Progress Report, which will be mailed around the middle of September, will contain tour and travel information, a preview of the Program, and confirmed Program Participants. We look forward to seeing you in Tucson!

Membership Rates

World Fantasy Convention memberships are limited to 750 paid, Attending members. The rates and cutoff are as follows:

These are the rates currently in force and supercede any other published rates. There will be no memberships sold at the door. Memberships are transferable with a signed letter from the member and the new member's name and address. PLEASE CONTACT US WITH TRANSFERS PRIOR TO 10/15/91!

Supporting memberships are available until October 15, 1991. They will be entitled to copies of the Progress Reports, Copper Star, the Program Book, the Fantasy Cookbook, and items remaining from the freebie bags. Supporting is convertible to Attending with payment of the current membership price, less \$30.00. No conversions after 10/15/91. NOTE that memberships are revocable for cause and that badges remain the property of the convention and can be requested to be returned by the member. Early convention registration will begin on Thursday, October 31, 1991 at 6pm at the Doubletree Hotel.

Hotels

We're back at most of the same hotels we used for the 1985 WFC, including the Doubletree Hotel at Randolph Park. You might remember it as having the best lobby bar yet discovered! The Doubletree is offering special convention rates of \$79.00 per room for single through quad occupancy, \$158.00 for one-bedroom suites and \$237.00 for two-bedroom suites. These are all plus tax. These rates are available for October 28 through November 6, 1991. The Doubletree will host all official convention activities, including all open parties. A reservation envelope is included with this Progress Report for the Doubletree, or call 1-602-881-4200.

Please note that all suites at the Doubletree must be reserved through the convention's office (602-470-0494). This is due to there being a limited number, and we wish to allocate them first to groups planning parties. There are some suites at the Viscount — call our office for the rates.

The hotel is seven miles from the airport. The hotel does not have a free shuttle, but we are working on a special arrangement with a local shuttle service... details in Progress Report 3. Downtown is ten minutes away and a large shopping mall is one mile/two minutes away (all by car, that is). Please note that nothing is in "easy walking distance" in Tucson, however.

There will be a late checkout of 2pm for the convention. The hotel will provide storage space for luggage for checked-out guests (such as during the banquet). There is no charge for parking at any WFC hotel.

This is a resort hotel with year-round heated swimming pool and jacuzzi (open 23-hours a day), three lighted tennis courts, two 18-hole golf courses across the street and nearby horseback riding stables. Tucson has an average peak temperature during that time of year of 79° F; 58° F at night.

There are many fine restaurants in Tucson, including the two large ones in the hotel. One of them, the Javelina Cantina, is a Southwestern theme with a large bar that's good enough to draw the general public, and the other, the Cactus Rose, is slightly upscale with a reasonable lunch menu (\$6.50 for most entrees). For the budget conscious, there is a Circle K convenience market across the parking lot. Again, don't plan to walk to "nearby" restaurants.

Since the Doubletree has only 250 rooms available, we have arranged for overflow hotel space. This includes the Lodge on the Desert, which was a runaway hit in 1985. It will allocate 30 rooms to us this time — and we expect them to go fast! This is a hotel that will inundate you in "old southwest" atmosphere with adobe walls and spacious rooms. The rates are \$79.00 single/quad for "standard rooms" and \$89.00 for "luxury rooms". We HIGHLY recommend the luxury rooms! Call 1-800-456-5634, 1-602-325-3366, or FAX 1-602-327-5834 for reservations. One night's advance deposit is required by check or credit card.

Our main overflow is the Viscount Suites. We have 150 suites held for us. The rate is the same as the Doubletree (\$79.00, single/quad occupancy), but includes some things the other hotels don't. First, each room is a two-room suite. Next, there is complimentary airport transportation for hotel guests. Then there is the free buffet breakfast (no, not just a continental style) and evening hosted cocktails and hors d'oeuvres. This is a non-party hotel. They can be contacted at 1-800-527-9666 (outside of Arizona), 1-602-745-6500, or by fax at 1-602-790-5114. We suggest advance payment by check or credit card for one night to hold your room past 4pm.

To make things easier on all of us for both a choice of restaurants and for getting to overflow hotels, we will be running a free shuttle service. It will start running prior to the start of the Program each morning and will run until the wee hours of the morning. It will also stop at a couple of nearby restaurants that are along its route, including a TGI Fridays.

Reservation envelopes are included with this Progress Report for the Doubletree — the Lodge and the Viscount prefer that reservations be phoned in. **BE SURE TO NOTE THE GROUP**NAME, 1991 WORLD FANTASY CONVENTION, FOR PHONE-IN RESERVATIONS! Otherwise you may not be given a room against our rooming block and may not get the lower group rate.



Special Airline Discounts

American Airlines, America West Airlines, and Ladera Travel Service are working together to provide discounts on travel to the 1991 World Fantasy Convention. Both airlines have special rates, and are offering the following discounts:

• 45% off coach fares from any point in the U.S. and Canada

5% off any excursion fares originating with the U.S. only

At this time excursion fares are set at as much as 55% below coach fares, and a 5% discount from those fares is by far the best price.

Copper Star

Besides the high-quality Program Book that World Fantasy attendees have come to expect, the convention is also producing and publishing a hardback book. This book, *Copper Star*, will be distributed on a complimentary basis to all 1991 World Fantasy Convention members.

Copper Star contains original short stories by sixteen authors, totaling approximately 70,000 words. Illustrations were done for each story by various artists, including our Artist Guest, Arlin Robins. We will also be selling a signed, limited (to 300), boxed version of the book for \$30.00. There will also be a run of 26 for contributors and others, which will not be for sale. Advance orders are being taken for the limited edition, presently available for ordering only to members.

Banquet

As is traditional, the World Fantasy Awards will be presented during the banquet. The banquet will be held starting at 2pm on Sunday, November 3, 1991 and will run (including the ceremonies) until approximately 4:30pm. Tickets cost \$25 and are limited to approximately 300. We will let non-banqueters in to watch the Awards ceremonies as soon as they begin.

Please let us know what items you would prefer as a vegetarian selection. The hotel can customize the final selection as we

wish. Suggestions include: 1) Stuffed artichoke with vegetable Ratatouille, served with garlic-flavored pasta; 2) Caviar Rice—wild, white and brown rice, served with a three-color souffle: carrots, spinach and turnips; 3) Hot Herb Couscous served with fresh water cress and grilled squash in balsamic vinaigrette; 4) Tomato-based Lasagna, served with fresh seasonal vegetables; and, 5) Oriental Vegetable Stir-Fry, served with fried rice. We will select one of the above, based on your comments.

* Chicken Jerusalem (10-oz boneless chicken breast, sauteed in a basil, mushroom, and artichoke sauce)

* Broiled Halibut (10-oz charbroiled with a fennel sauce)

STARTER: Crisp garden salad with ranch and honey/lemon vinaigrette

VEGETABLE: Large portion of Julienne carrots and zucchini

POTATOES: 4 mushroom-cut red potatoes

ROLLS AND BUTTER: Warm white and whole-wheat rolls

DESSERT: Three-Berry Shortcake

BEVERAGES: Milk, coffee, decaf, hot and iced tea

We have arranged for portion and selection upgrades on all items being offered in this menu. Also, those selecting Prime Rib will be able to request medium rare, medium, and medium well (subject to cuts remaining) from their table server at the banquet. The default selection will be Prime Rib, so please be sure to contact us by October 1, 1991 if you have already purchased your ticket and have another entree preference. Tickets can be purchased with the form in this PR. If you plan on attending, we suggest reserving soon since quite a few tickets have been sold.

Other concerns: We will have an open bar during the banquet. A portion of the room will be set aside for smoking (about 30% of the available seats). There will be 11 seated at each table with only 300 total tickets available (excluding the head table). Publishers reserving a table need to choose whether they wish it to be in the smoking or non-smoking area. Seating, except where a whole table has been reserved, will be first-come, first-grabbed.

World Fantasy Awards

The judges for the World Fantasy Awards this year have been announced. They are Emma Bull, Faren Miller, Orson Scott Card, Darrell Schweitzer, and Richard Laymon. Material for consideration should be mailed directly to the judges. The convention will supply publishers with the judges' addresses if you call or write us.

Ballots were mailed to all members of the 1990 Chicago and the 1989 Seattle World Fantasy Conventions as well as members of this year's WFC. The judges will use the ballot results as an aid in making their selections for the Awards. Two selections for each award are nominated by the voters.

The Awards will be presented at the Awards banquet.

The Program




Hospitality Suite

We will have the suite open for most of each day and every night of the convention, starting with the close of early registration on Thursday night (9pm) and through late Sunday evening/Monday morning. Art Show

Our Progress Report #1 went out in May to all artists on file who have been in past World Fantasy Art Shows, along with others who requested information. At this point the Art Show is almost completely sold out.

We will have approximately 120 4'x4' panels (limit three per artist), as well as several tables and display cases for



3-D. The Show has juried entrance, except for those who were in one of the two past two WFC Art Shows. Otherwise, five slides or photographs of representative work will be required. We will be maintaining a Waiting List for those who qualify for admittance, but contact us after we're sold out of space.

There will be a 12% commission on all works sold. The rate per flat is \$15.00 and per 3-D piece is \$1.00. Please write us at the convention's P.O. Box for an Art Show Progress Report and rules. One third of the panel fee will go to assist ASFA and another third will help pay for the Artist's Reception.

So far response to the horseback riding has been enthusiastic! (My thanks to all the people who've responded.) Thursday afternoon seems to be the preferred time. Right now we favor a stable at the base of the Catalina Mountains to the north of Tucson. The area has some truly beautiful scenery. There is a personal weight limit of 240 pounds at this stable (this is mountainous desert terrain, folks, and the horses are going to be WORKING). Transportation to and from the stables can be provided and will cost roughly \$10.00 per person. To better help people make decisions, here is a SMALL list of the possibilities available and their costs:

1 hour trail ride \$12.50 2 hour trail ride 20.00 Sunset ride (1-1/2 hr) 18.00

Dinner ride (3 hr wlfood) 33.00 (15 person minimum)

Another possibility is available in the Rincon Mountains to the east of Tucson. This is much rougher terrain (and also very beautiful). Rides with this outfit cost a little more (\$14 per hour with a \$21 minimum). In addition to the types of rides listed above (at higher prices), they can arrange 1/2 or full day rides through the Saguaro National Monument for \$42 and up. Jeep tours are also available with this particular group. Transportation to and from the stable will cost \$10 here, too.
