

FROM THE CHAIR

This is the final Progress Report before the convention. We trust that we'll manage to answer any final questions you might have in this PR...otherwise, please write or give us a call. There are still mailings upcoming for all Program participants, Dealers, and Artists under separate cover.

As of mid-September there are only 94 paid memberships unsold. We expect to be sold out by October 15 so we'll be able to keep our promise of no sales at the convention. If you haven't bought yours yet, remember that the final few will be sold "first come, first served". As long as you mail your membership within a week of receiving this PR you should be okay.

Right now our main hotel, the Doubletree Inn, is sold out of hotel rooms (275 rooms - our overflow hotel, the Aztec Inn, still has space available); the main Program is completed; the Collectors' Seminar is sold out; the Dealers' Room is filled with mostly rare book dealers; the Art Show is all set; the Program Book is about to go to press; the WFC Awards are ordered; and the Banquet is almost sold out (over 220 tickets sold of 300 maximum available). We'd say that everything is going well!

There is little more I can say (except for the six more pages of text after this), except that those of you who will be attending will be experiencing what we hope will be one of the best conventions that you have attended in years. Yet that alone isn't what's important about WFC...what is important is that we gather each year to renew old acquaintances, make contacts and new friends, and to have fun...for this is what WFC is all about!

THE PROGRAM

The theme of this year's WFC is "Writers of the Southwest". Correspondingly, we are having Program items on that theme; "Mythology of the Southwest", "Living in the Southwest", and others. We ask for your comments and suggestions on the Program as in all other areas.

The first Program event will be Thursday night (Halloween) at midnight on Supernatural/Supernormal Vampires. It will be open-ended in length with eight to ten writers of vampire stories of various types participatning, two or three at a time. We'll have a bar serving Bloody Marys during the event.

Of course, there will be the traditional autograph party on Friday night. Several publishers are helping sponsor a free bar (they'll be credited prominently during the event). We're still hoping for more to assist. Write for details!

We'll be running a two-track main Program (which will include only a few readings), starting after the Friday 11 am Opening Ceremonies. WRITERS' WORKSHOP

The Workshop is intended to provide useful information to writers about their craft. We have consolidated some of the Workshop sessions we were considering in Progress Report Two due to a lack of demand. This is the final list of planned sessions. The only change we may make is to possibly open some of the sessions as no charge to the attendee.

 Trends in Fantasy and Horror. Which markets are worth writing for (monetarily) and what is looked for in work submitted. What the editor looks for and buys. New markets you might not have

considered. Saturday 2 pm to 4 pm.

2) Word Processing Workshop. Many of the most successful writers today use computers in their work to ease editing and increase output. Shop talk on which systems are best and how to use them to their fullest. Includes demonstrations of some machines. Saturday from 10 am to noon.

- 3) New Writers. A two-part workshop for somewhat-experienced writers. We will match you with a more-experienced writer for a get-acquainted session at the beginning of the convention with a follow-up (by mail) after the convention. The idea is for aspiring writers who have been trying to make sales to bring in sample work for criticism, followed up by mail after the convention with work which is revised to take into account the criticism. Friday 4 pm to 6 pm.
- 4) The Writer and the Agent. An experienced authors' agent (Ms. Jean-Teresa Sumner) will be conducting a seminar to acquaint both new and experienced writers on the role of the agent. You'll be interested to know that she doesn't believe that all writers even need one...do you? Saturday 4 pm to 6 pm.
- 5) The Business of Writing. Hosted by Mr. Stephen Goldin, author of a well-received book on the subject, who will conduct an intensive examination of some of the subjects of his book. Will include an in-depth look at contracts. Friday 2 pm to 4 pm.

The registration fee is \$5 per session with fees going to the individuals conducting the session. If we do decide to waive fees for any of the sessions, paying attendees will be registered first in case the session fills up and fees will be refunded.

Please contact us early as may fill up the available spots prior to the convention. As with the main part of the Program, we're open to suggestions.

HOTEL

Our main hotel, the Doubletree Hotel at Randolph Park, was sold out of hotel rooms as of the end of August. We had large enough a room block to handle the largest WFC yet held...

Our overflow hotel is the Aztec Inn, located "two blocks" from the Doubletree. Now these are not short blocks and are described are being a 5-10 minute walk. If you are handicapped or have a problem with getting about, we might be able to assist you with getting a room at the Doubletree. Call Bruce or Kim Farr at (602) 968-5673 on the weekend.

The room rates at the Aztec Inn are \$55.00 single/double, \$60.00 triple/quad plus 8% room tax. One night deposit required to guarantee and the reservation cutoff date is October 21, 1985. Call 1-800-227-6086 outside of Arizona or 1-800 824-0518 inside of Arizona.

We suggest that you contact them by phone since we're so close to the convention dates. Their address, however, is 102 N. Alvernon Way, Tucson, Arizona 85711. You might also check with the Doubletree periodically as cancellations will periodically occur.

For those of you who are already reserved, The Doubletree Hotel at Randolph Park was offering special convention rates of \$65.00 per room for single through quad occupancy (plus 8% tax and \$1.00 phone charge/night if you use the phone). Suite rates were \$205 for one-bedroom and \$295 for two-bedroom (casitas). These rates were available for October 29 through November 5, 1985.

The hotel is seven miles from the airport and is serviced by a <u>free</u> hotel shuttle (you call from the airport for pickup). Downtown is ten minutes away and a large shopping mall is one mile/two minutes away (all by car, that is). Flease note that nothing is in "easy walking distance" in Tucson, however.

There will be a late checkout of 2pm and the hotel will provide storage space for luggage for checked-out guests. There is no charge for parking.

This is a resort hotel with year-round heated swimming pool and jacuzzi (open 23 hours per day), three lighted tennis courts, two 18-hole golf courses across the street and nearby horseback riding stables. Tucson has an average peak temperature during that time of year of 79 degrees F; 65 degrees F at night.

There are many fine restaurants in Tucson, including the two in the hotel. For the budget conscious, there is a Circle K across the street. Again, don't plan to walk to "nearby" restaurants!

In response to inquiries, we wish to inform you of the following: the hotel has small refrigerators they can rent for a one-time fee of \$20; there are a <u>few</u> handicapped-guest rooms in the main tower...be sure to request those early. If you wish, you may indicate in advance that you want your room to be in the Tower or courtyard. Finally, we understand that if you <u>specifically</u> request a poolside room, there may be an extra charge.

Hotel reservations may be made by calling (602) 881-4200 or through Doubletree's 1-800 number (call 1-800-555-1212 to ask the operator for the number in your area).

FUNCTION FACILITIES

All activities will be at the Doubletree Hotel.

Dealers' Room (4864 sq. ft.) will be 1/2 of the Doubletree Ballroom. Ready access for dealers.

Art Show will be the Boojum/Bonsai room (3105 sq. ft.). Auction will probably take place in the 960 sq. ft. Foyer immediately outside the room.


Programming will be most of 1/2 of the Doubletree Ballroom. This is divisible into four rooms (2508, 682, 992, and 682 sq. ft.), allowing the function space to alter to fit expected audience.

Hriters' Norkshop will be the Cottonwood Room (992 sq. ft.).

Collectors' Seminar will be Salon C of the Doubletree Ballroom (682 sq. ft.).

Convention Lobby is in the process of being rebuilt. It's not 100% guaranteed, but it's expected to be finished by the convention. The Con Lobby will be beside the Doubletree Ballroom and is estimated at 3-4,000 square feet.

In addition, there is space for a convention office, Rare Book room, and a Green Room. We're fortunate to have a lot of flexible, yet attractive, function space available that is quite suited to a convention of this character.

Dear Collector:

Have you read Karl Edward Wagner's novelet "Neither Brute Nor Human" which was awarded the British Fantasy Society Award as best story of the year at the 1984 World Fantasy Convention? If you haven't, you won't be able to find it in any collection yet published. This very fine story that deals with fantasy writers, fans and conventions and the strange relationship between them is only available in the 1983 WORLD FANTASY CONVENTION SOUVENIR BOOK.

If you missed this book, then you also have missed Stephen King's very funny biographical sketch of Robert Bloch. And a complete chapter (along with synopsis) from Philip Jose Farmer's unpublished Cthulhu Mythos style novel, THE MONSTER ON HOLD. Did we forget to mention stories by Manly Wade Wellman, Brian Lumley, and Hugh Cave. There is an unpublished chapter of INCARNATE by Ramsey Campbell that was cut from the final novel due to length. We also can't forget Gene Wolfe's short story "The Cat" - though you might have already read that - it was anthologized twice since originally published in the SOUVENIR BOOK.

You also missed Bob Bloch and Jack Williamson writing about their days working for $\underline{\text{Weird}}$ $\underline{\text{Tales}}$, Sam Moskowitz with a fact filled history of the most popular stories ever to appear in that famous magazine, and more. Plus full color front and back covers by Rowena Morrill.

This 8x11" paperbound book, 96 pages long, featured only new material. No reprints. Everything was commissioned for the book (except for the covers which were chosen from among Rowena's best works). Starlog Magazine called it the "Best Program Book they had ever seen". Considering that "The Cat" was included in one of the Years Best Collections, and "Neither Brute Nor Human" won the British Fantasy Award, we won't disagree. How many other Convention Books can you name that published new fantasy of Award Winning Stature?

The Souvenir Book was free to all members of the 1983 Convention. Copies were offered for sale at the Con for \$8.95 and a number were sold. This is 1985, but don't despair. Copies are still available (you knew were weren't doing this just to fill a page with print, didn't you?). You can get a copy for that original price of only \$8.95 still. The World Fantasy Convention is offering three tours to some of the most beautiful and interesting places around Tucson. They are led by guides who will give talks on the history, geology, plants, and wildlife of the Sonoran Desert region. Transportation is in air-conditioned buses and vans. Tours leave from the Doubletree lobby at 9:00 am. Each tour will be offered on October 31 and November 4 (Thursday and Monday).

- 1) Kitt Peak National Observatory. Kitt Peak lies 40 miles west of Tucson, high above the desert at 7000 feet elevation. The spectaular drive up the mountain leads to the world's largest collection of research telescopes. We will visit three of the largest telescopes and see exhibits plus a film at the Visitors' Center. \$30 fee includes an excellent picnic lunch (\$26 without lunch, but there are no food services on the mountain). Tour returns around 3 pm.
- 2) Nogales. The colorful city of Nogales, Sonora, is just across the Mexican border 60 miles south of Tucson. Its shops full of textiles, leather goods, wood carvings, glassware, and many other items will give us the opportunity to shop or just browse. On our way south we will stop at Tumacacori Mission, founded 200 years ago by Spanish Jesuits and now run by the National Park Service.

Cost for this trip is \$31, which included lunch at a first-class restaurant. The tour returns around 3 pm.

3) Desert Museum and Old Tucson. The Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum is a zoo, botanical Gardens, and acquarium with an international reputation. Guides will give talks on living examples of the plants and wildlife of the Sonoran Desert. Old Tucson is a movie location and amusement park where over 100 feature-length films have been made, in addition to many tv series. Our visit will include a short film, sound stage tour, and dramatic re-enactment of stories from the Old West. The cost of this tour is \$25.50, which includes all entrance fees. Tour returns around 2:30 pm.
