


#### George Barr Artist Guest of Honour

Many people have known George longer than I: John and Bjo Trimble, Tim Kirk, Alicia Austin,

Jim Bearcloud, for example... but I can say with confidence that nobody likes him a whole lot more than I do. And there are probably few people in or out of fandom who dislike him.

That's one of George's many talents, I think being a genuinely likable person. Some would even say loveable, I'm not going to go that far; after all, I've got this macho image to uphold. No, I'm not gonna go that far, as the Duke would say... The hell I'm not! Yep, he is sort of loveable, that fella over there in the corner grinning and blushing and shuffling his feet. And you want to know why? Because he is a nice guy, for one.

Great Ghu, what a hackneyed phrase: "nice guy". But in George's case, it's true. Oh, he's not necessarily an easy guy to get to know... he is not exactly shy, but he's very private. But once you get to know him, you will find you have a friend for life. I can think of very few people of whom I can say that.

But what about George Barr the bon vivant, man about town, idol (as Tom Lehrer was wont to say about himself) of gibbering millions from Madagascar? You want to know about his life, his art and his aspirations, don't you?

Yesterday (a book devoted entirely to George and his works) and many more. It's a sordid, tawdry story, like so many others, but briefly, it goes like this:

George Barr was born. There is incontrovertible evidence of this. He had parents. Sometime in his formative years, he was exposed to the nefarious influences of Walt Disney, Maxfield Parrish, Aubrey Beardsley, odd and sundry Wyeths, a mustache named Salvador, and many other "pushers" of the "Art". In his childhood, he was given, sold or (more likely, as is with most practitioners of this solitary vice) stole the tools of his awful trade: "paper", "pencils", "ink", and, inevitably, the hard stuff: paint. "Oils", "acrylics,", watercolor", and

so on.

It gets worse; bear with me. He joined a cult, one of those quasireligious groups that proselytize at

bus stations, airports and high schools the so-called "fandom". He started sending "art" to "fanzines", going to "cons", and joining in clandestine meetings with "fans". Then he sent one of his "pictures" to a "promag" called Fantastic, and they gave him money he used for materials, combining them in sundry ways, and selling the product so that he could buy more paint. He became a "Filthypro".

So make him welcome, eh? I don't mean you have to rub his head every time you see him, or invite him to every party, but please...approachhim.Talk to him. (what the heck, commission him!)

He's a nice guy. He really is. Try him, you'll like him.



#### Getting to Winnipeg

Some SF writers and fans from western Canada are planning to make the trip to Worldcon in '94 in style. We're going by train.

It's not just the thought of seeing the county without sitting cramped behind the wheel of a car, and it's not just the benefit of arriving without jet lag to cramp our style. The real appeal for travelling by train is the process: slightly oldfashioned and celebrated in mystery stories of great renown. There is time to talk with fellow travellers or gaze out the window, while travelling faster than highway driving or taking the Greyhound. And how many moose or black bears does anyone see from a plane, anyhow?

No moose sightings are guaranteed with the reservation, admittedly, but there are some sightings that can be expected on this trip. An Enthusiast's Guide to Observing Persons Interested in SF Phenomena will be of great use in the identification of sightings.

At the train station in Vancouver, look for a variety of SF club members, readers, and general party animals. Some of their talk is bright and animated, some serious and intent, and their groups cluster and reform. A group from the Island comes equipped with artists' portfolios, a lap-top computer, reams of printed paper and some cases marked "Fragile: this End Up" on two or more sides.

The writers among the traintravelling party can be identified in two ways: the professionals answer "yes" by reflex when asked if they are working on a new story, while the amateur's characteristic comment is "my new project should be finished Real Soon Now." Both carry pens and an aura of confidence. They are distinguished from editors of western Canadian

publishing houses by the latter's harried expressions and cases of promotional flyers.

Food services range from sandwiches at a coffee bar to four-star dining room service, for those who want the linen and heavy silver to make an impression on an editor or a new friend.

SF books may even be read at odd moments between conversations and brief stops in Jasper and Edmonton. By that point, it is statistically almost certain that there will be included among the passengers bound for Conadian a singer with a guitar, and someone


already decked out in full makeup and costume of one sort or another.

Will arriving at Winnipeg seem almost an anti-climax after travelling across western Canada by train? Not on your life. It's the best lead-in to Canada's first Worldcon in over twenty years. Will there be a similar expedition for people arriving from the East? Will someone organize a migration of the Society for Creative Anachronism? Will Winnipeg residents find themselves flying west to join the train on its journey to the center of Canada? Only the travel agents will know for sure.





#### Notice to 1997 Worldcon Bidders

#### Kevin Standlee, WSFS Division Head

Committees wishing to appear on the site selection ballot for the 1997 World Science Fiction Convention (Worldcon 55), must file with Conadian no later than March 5, 1994. Please note that this is a change from previous practice. An amendment to the Constitution of the World Science Fiction Society (WSFS) ratified at Magicon changed the filing deadline from "the close of the previous Worldcon" to "180 days prior to the official opening of the administering Worldcon." The 1997 Worldcon is the first site selection affected by this new rule.

The WSFS Constitution requires that bids for North American sites for the 1997 Worldcon be from the Central Zone, which is defined as all states and provinces in North America east of "Baja California, New Mexico, Colorado, Wyoming, Montana, Saskatchewan" and west of "Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, North Carolina, Virginia, West Virginia, Pennsylvania, New York, and Quebec." Yukon and the Northwest Territories are not part of the Central Zone. Sites within 60 miles (97 km) of Winnipeg, the administering convention, are not eligible. Any site outside of North America is eligible.

Filings may be made *only* by mail or by delivering the appropriate documents (see below) to the Conadian's WSFS Division Chief (Kevin Standlee), or the Site Selection Administrator (Don Cook). Send filings by mail only to Conadian's main address, PO Box 2430, Winnipeg MB R3C 4A7 CANADA or by private service

(Federal Express, UPS, etc.) to 321 Portage Avenue, Winnipeg MB R3B 2B9 CANADA. Do not send bid filings to any other address. If the filing is postmarked legibly by a national post office, it will be considered to have been filed as of the time and date of the postmark. If the postmark is made by a private postage meter or other means, the date of the filing will be the date of its actual receipt at the Conadian address. We encourage bidders to file as early so any problems can be resolved easily.

Section 3.5 of the WSFS Constitution specifies the information that bidders must submit in order to appear on the ballot:

Bids from prospective Committees shall be allowed on the ballot by the current Worldcon Committee only upon presentation of adequate evidence of an agreement with the proposed sites' facilities, such as a conditional contract or letter of agreement. To be eligible for site selection, a bidding committee must state the rules under which the Worldcon Committee will operate, including a specification of the term of office of their chief executive o fficer or officers and the conditions and procedures for the selection and replacement of such officer or officers. Written copies of these rules must be made available by the bidding committee to any member of WSFS on request.

Conadian will consider a bid to have fulfilled its filing requirements if it submits the following documents:



- Letter(s) of agreement or similar documents for the prospective convention's prinicple programming site and principle hotel.
- Articles of incorporation and bylaws (if incorporated) or constitution, articles of association, or similar document (if unincorporated) of the organization that is responsible for the bid.
- 3. If any of the above documents are not applicable or unavailable, consult with Conadian's WSFS Division Chief, Kevin Standlee, or the 1997 Site Selection Administrator, Don Cook, concerning acceptable substitutes.

NASFiC Site Selection: There is an amendment pending to the WSFS Constitution which will change the NASFiC site selection procedures. If the amendment is ratified at ConFrancisco and a non-North American site is selected for the 1997 Worldcon, then the 1995 NASFiC, DragonCon, will administer the election to select the site of the 1997 NASFiC. If the amendment is not ratified and a non-North American site is selected for the 1997 Worldcon, then Conadian will administer the election to select the site of the 1997 Worldcon. If the pending amendment is not ratified, rules for potential 1997 NASFiC bidders will be published in a future Conadian Progress Report.

#### News from Canada on the GST

The goods and services tax (GST) is a tax paid by consumers on goods and services in Canada. The tax is charged at a rate of seven percent (7%) on most sales of goods and provisions of services.

Recognizing the importance of US and overseas conventions to the Canadian economy, the Canadian Government's Department of Finance issued a press release on December 18, 1990 announcing a non-resident rebate provision to include GST paid in respect to meeting rooms and exhibitions space supplied to non-resident convention and conference organizers. A second press release, issued May 15, broadened the nonresident rebate program to apply to a wide range of expenses incurred by foreign organizers and exhibitors. Expenses will include such items as:

- audio visual
- business equipment
- convention show services
- destination management companies
- · electrical services
- exhibit design and display
- floral decorations
- · moving services
- newsletter services
- personnel services
- · photography

- · security
- simultaneous interpretion equipment
- speakers and educational seminars
- specialty advertising and premiums
- telecommunications
- translators and interpreters
- transportation services between venues


