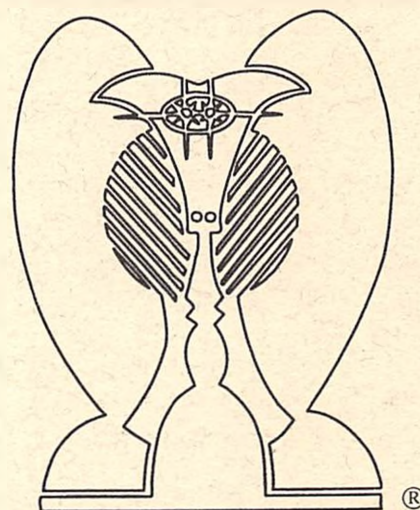

Supporting members receive all generally-distributed ConFrancisco publications (including the Program Book and any progress reports published after the purchase of the membership), may nominate and vote for the 1993 Hugo Awards, may nominate for the 1994 Hugo Awards, and may (subject to paying an additional voting fee) vote on the 1996 Worldcon site-selection. Supporting members may not attend the convention without converting their membership into an attending membership. If you voted on the 1993 site-selection, you are automatically a supporting member of ConFrancisco.

Attending members receive all of the privileges of supporting members, plus the right to attend the convention. Supporting members may convert to attending by paying a conversion fee. If you pre-supported the San Francisco in '93 Worldcon bid, you may deduct \$5 from the price of an Attending membership or the price of conversion from supporting to attending. This \$5 discount for pre-supporters of the San Francisco in '93 Worldcon bid expires September 30, 1991.

A Kid-in-tow admission may be issued to a child eight years old or less as of September 1, 1993. Kids-in-tow must remain in the custody of an Adult Attending member at all times, do not receive publications, and do not have voting rights. Although Kids-in-tow are free, it will speed your at-con registration

if you register any Kids-in-tow in advance.

A full Adult Attending membership may be purchased for a child of any age. A Children's admission may be purchased for a child between the ages of 7 and 12. Child members may attend programming, but do not receive publications and do not have voting rights. The overlap in ages between Kid-in-tow and Children is intentional; parents may choose which kind of admission to obtain for their child if the child is 7 or 8 years old.

Children between the ages of 13 and 17 must purchase an Attending membership. The parent or guardian of a minor attending ConFrancisco is responsible for the minor at all times. For a comprehensive listing of policies regarding minor children attending ConFrancisco, please write to ConFrancisco, Attn: Children's Membership Policies and enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope for reply.

Note: This membership schedule replaces all earlier versions. If you purchased a Children's admission under an older schedule for a child who will actually be a Kid-in-tow, you may request a refund by writing to ConFrancisco, Attn: Kid-in-tow Refunds. If possible, please include all relevant information, including copies of receipts/cancelled checks.

Non-humans (pets, inanimate objects which you may want to have a badge, etc.) must remain in the custody of an attending member at all times, do not

receive publications, and do not have voting rights. Proceeds from the sale of non-human memberships will be donated to the WSFS Mark Registration and Protection Committee.

Except for refunds of erroneously-purchased Children's admissions, ConFrancisco memberships are not refundable. They are, however, fully transferable. To transfer a membership, the person who currently owns the membership should send us a letter giving the particulars of the transfer, including the name and address of the person to whom the membership is being transferred. Until July 15, 1993, send transfer requests to ConFrancisco, Attn: Registrar. After July 15, 1993, do NOT send the transfer letter; instead, the person receiving the membership should bring the transfer letter to convention registration.

Although no end date is currently specified for this chart, new rates will be announced in Progress Report 3 (late 1991). If you are attempting to use this chart after September 30, 1992, we recommend that you first check with ConFrancisco to determine if the rates listed in this chart are still current. Checks which are returned to ConFrancisco by the bank for insufficient funds will be assessed a service charge as allowed by law, and the membership(s) purchased with the returned check will be cancelled.

Please make checks **payable to ConFrancisco**. All checks must be drawn on US banks; we can also accept Postal Money Orders as long as they are payable in US currency. All of this means that a check from your local bank will be O.K., just as long as your local bank is a U.S. bank. We hope to be able to accept payment by credit cards and in non-U.S. currencies shortly. Galactic currencies will take a little longer.

Now that you know how much it costs and how to pay us, the rest is up to you. All you need to do now is send a check along with your name and address to the wonderful folks at ConFrancisco, 712 Bancroft Road, Suite 1993, Walnut Creek, CA USA 94598.

NOTICE OF INTEREST TO WORLDCON BIDDERS

Committees wishing to appear on the site selection ballot for the 1996 World Science Fiction Convention must file with ConFrancisco no later than the close of business of the 1992 World Science Fiction Convention in Orlando. For convenience, ConFrancisco has defined the close of the 1992 Worldcon as Monday, September 7, 1992, 5:00 p.m., Eastern Daylight Time.

The constitution of the World Science Fiction Society (WSFS) requires that bids for North American sites for the 1996 Worldcon be from the Western Zone, defined as "Baja California, New Mexico, Colorado, Wyoming, Montana, Saskatchewan, and all states and provinces in North America westward including Hawaii, Alaska, the Yukon and the Northwest Territories. Sites within 60 miles of the 1993 Worldcon are ineligible, however. Bids for any site outside North America are acceptable.

Filings may be made only by mail or by delivering the appropriate documents to the chair or the secretary of ConFrancisco. For the record, they are Terry Biffel and Kevin Standlee. They should be easy to locate at Magicon.

Filings by mail should be sent to ConFrancisco's address, 712 Bancroft Road, Suite 1993 Walnut Creek, CA 94598. If the filing is postmarked legibly by a national post office, it will be considered to have been filed as of the time and date of the postmark. If the postmark is made by a private postage meter or other means, the date of the filing will be the date of its actual receipt at the ConFrancisco address.

Article III, Section 4 of the WSFS Constitution specifies the information that bidders must submit in order to appear on the ballot:

Bids from prospective Committees shall be allowed on the ballot by the current Worldcon Committee only upon presentation of adequate evidence of an agreement with the proposed sites' facilities, such as a conditional contract or letter of agreement. To be eligible for site selection, a

bidding committee must state the rules under which the Worldcon Committee will operate, including a specification of the term of office of their chief executive officer or officers and the conditions or procedures for the selection and replacement of such officer or officers. Written copies of these rules must be made available by the bidding committee to any member of WSFS on request. The aforementioned rules and agreements, along with an announcement of intent to bid, must be filed with the Committee that will administer the voting no later than the close of the previous Worldcon for a Worldcon bid, and as set by the administering convention but no earlier than the close of the corresponding Worldcon for a prospective NASFiC bid.

ConFrancisco will consider a bid to have fulfilled its filing requirements if it submits the following documents:

1. Letter(s) of agreement or similar documents for the prospective convention's principle programming site and principle hotel.
2. Articles of Incorporation and bylaws (if incorporated) or constitution or similar document (if unincorporated) of the organization that is responsible for the bid.
3. If any of these documents are not applicable or unavailable, bidders should consult with ConFrancisco's secretary, Kevin Standlee, concerning acceptable substitutes.

If NASFiC site selection proves to be necessary, the same documents will be required of NASFiC bidders. The deadline for submission will be Sunday, September 5, 1993, 11:00 a.m., Pacific Daylight Time.

Did You Know . . . ?

The first woman mayor of a major American city was Janet Gray Hayes of San Jose, California.

What we do expect from kids who have memberships is that they have an adult around somewhere, who is responsible for them -- see to it that they eat now and then, be available in case there's a discipline problem or somebody gets hurt, make sure they go to bed once in awhile. Unbelievable as it may sound, on the west coast we've found an increasing number of instances where people buy a child a membership in a con -- or maybe not even bother do this much -- drop him off at the door, and collect him when the con is over. In the meantime, the child is on his own to scrounge food and a spot to sleep if he can. As you can imagine, children in this circumstance present discipline and/or security problems. This isn't fair to anybody and it's something we really want to avoid. Therefore, if we have sounded a little stiff in our child membership requirements, that's why. We'll be spelling out our child care policy in clear and unmistakable terms well in advance for one and all.

A BIT ON OUR PHILOSOPHY (FIRST IN A SERIES)

In general, (science fiction) convention committees start with the idea of hosting the best convention ever, one that will be remembered for years afterward as the funnest ever and will be held up as a shining example for its smooth operations.

During the bidding process, our committee evaluated each of the elements that make up the convention. We determined that certain aspects of the convention would take priority in our policy decisions. Policy has been formulated for the last several months based on this philosophy. So, for the members' viewing pleasure, here is a brief statement of part of our philosophy.

There has not been a WorldCon locally for twenty-five years (at the time of ConFrancisco).

Many area fans have worked at the local regional con and smaller cons. However, many have rarely worked at higher than the staff level at WorldCons. Some haven't worked at a WorldCon at all.

Our philosophy includes the idea that the WorldCon should be run largely by local fans. While we do not believe any committee can successfully run a WorldCon without assistance from other fan groups, we wanted to allow time for local fans and fan groups to demonstrate that they have the ability to perform the given task.

We *have* been recruiting committee people from out of the area and will be escalating our efforts at ChiConV.

Stay Tuned. Future PR's will have further discussions of our philosophy.

History of... Exhibits

The Science Fiction History Exhibits developed in celebration of the Fiftieth Anniversary of the first Worldcon will be exhibited at ConFrancisco. Although the exhibition was originally intended to conclude in 1992, the exhibits have never been shown on the West Coast. These exhibits are The History of Worldcons, The History of Fanzines, The History of Bidding, The Portrait Gallery and the World-Wide Fandom. We also expect to have the History of Specialty Press exhibit and a retrospective of Worldcon Masquerades through a slide presentation in the exhibit area, which are currently being developed.

If you have material you would like to contribute for any of these exhibits (for display, it will be returned after the History of exhibits are concluded) please contact Peggy Rae Pavlat at 5709 Goucher Drive, College Park, MD 20740 USA as soon as possible.

The History of Fanzines exhibit, developed by Nancy Atherton, encourages the current-day fan to travel back to the days of Spaceways, Le Zombie, Quandry and Xero. The exhibit features a feast of fanzine writing from the 1930s through the 1950s by such legendary fans as Walt Willis, Lee Hoffman, Donald Wollheim, Ray Bradbury, Robert Silverberg, Robert Bloch, Bob Tucker, Marion Zimmer Bradley and a host of others.

The fanzines on display are likely to include the 1930's Cosmology, The Planet, The Time Traveller, The Phantagraph and Fantasy Magazine; 1940's Peon, The Acolyte, The Fanscient, Futuria Fantasia, and Spacewarp; The 1950's Fanac, Hyphen, Grue, the Vega Annish and the BNF of Iz. There will also be copies of special items such as Up to Now, the first fan history; Walter A. Willis's immortal fan fable, the Enchanted Duplicator; Jack Speer's original Fancyclopedia and Bob Tucker's original Neo-Fan's Guide.

The History of Worldcons exhibit, developed by Bruce Pelz, includes the World Science Fiction Convention banner, the Program Book from each previous World Science Fiction Convention, playing cards, sets of stamps issued in honor of the convention, official Worldcon stationery, some T-shirts, a hat and tote bag and many badges, buttons and other memorabilia.

Scenes from World-Wide Fandom will include material from Japanese Fandom (thanks to Mr. Takumi Shibano), Russian Fandom (courtesy of the Russian SF artist Anatoly Paseka), Canadian Fandom (many thanks to both Charles Mohapel and John Robert Columbo). In addition, there are Scenes from the Dutch (Dirk Bonkes), Finnish, German, Norway and the Czechs. Other European fan groups are being recruited to provide Scenes of their own fandom. Don't Look Now, But ...

There's a Convention in your Computer!

There's a major convention going on right now. Anyone can attend. You'll meet people who write science fiction and fantasy; professionals in the movie and TV industries; artists and fans; reviewers and publishers. You can see pictures and artwork, pick up copies of articles and reviews, and snoop around for books to complete your collection. You can make new friends and meet old ones. In fact, you can do just about anything you'd do at any other convention.

You can come to this convention as often as you like. All you have to do is fire up your computer and log into the **Science Fiction and Fantasy Forum** on **CompuServe**.

CompuServe Information Service is the largest commercial computer network in the world, with over half a million subscribers. Any computer, word processor, or terminal can connect with **CompuServe**, as long as it can use a modem to connect it to phone lines. **CompuServe** has a network of phone numbers all over the country; over 80% of the phones in the USA can reach **CompuServe** with a no-toll local call.

The **Science Fiction and Fantasy Forum** has three parts. The **Message Board** is divided into sections for each special interest. Sections include Star Trek, Science Fiction Literature, Fantasy Literature, Publishers' Corner, Science Fact, The Con Suite, McCaffrey's Pem (tm), Science Fiction/Fantasy Film, Science Fiction/Fantasy Television, British Media SF, The Weekly Book Chat, The Writing Workshop, Conventions/Fandom, and a SFWA (closed) section. You can read the messages in any section and reply to them; your reply is attached to the original messages to form a thread. If someone posts a message for you, you'll be notified when you enter the Forum. You can post messages to any of the

professionals who use the Forum, or any other member, on any subject.

Browsing the **Libraries** will show you multiple author stories written by Forum members (such as our very own "Sweet Savage Star Trek" – a parody of ST:TNG); High-resolution GIF (Graphic Interchange Format) picture files can be downloaded from several of the Libraries, and software to view these files is free for the downloading. Interesting message threads and conference transcripts are archived here for you to read. Computer programs are also stored in the Libraries.

Finally, you can have real-time conversations with other users in the **Conference Rooms**. When you're in a Conference Room, the lines you type come up on everyone else's screen with your name in front. Conferences devoted to Star Trek and Beauty and the Beast are held every Monday evening; a conference devoted to Anne McCaffrey's Pem universe is held every Saturday evening; and our informal weekly **"The Hot/Tub"** conference is held every Thursday evening. There are other informal conferences held during the week.

CompuServe is a subscription service; it costs you \$1.50 a month plus \$6.50 per hour (in increments of a minute, at 300 bps) of online time to use it. Since most users don't have to pay phone company toll charges to log in, CompuServe rates are cheaper than a long distance call.

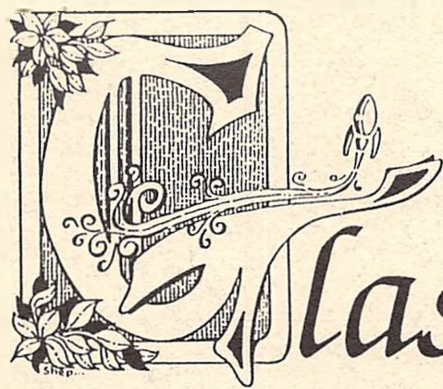

PUFF STUFF



he smoking regulations in San Francisco are among the most stringent in the US. They can be summed up as follows:

Smoking in "adequately ventilated" public places is permitted except when and where the owner designates

otherwise. Signs must be posted notifying the public of places where smoking is permitted or forbidden. Restaurants must provide non-smoking seating to patrons who request it. Many restaurants which permit cigarette smoking do not permit cigar or pipe smoking. They are within their rights to make this distinction. In theory, theaters must also provide segregated seating but in practice almost no theaters in San Francisco permit smoking other than in the lobby.

Smoking in hotel rooms and function space is left primarily to the discretion of the hotel or function space owner except when the function space is owned by San Francisco, where it is regulated by Ordinance No. 300-88. As of 1990, smoking rules for parties aren't covered by this Ordinance; however, by 1993, this may change. Multiple revisions of the various smoking laws during 1990 have not yet

received final approval, nor will they until well into 1991.

Smoking on public transit, or in BART (Bay Area Rapid Transit) or Muni Metro stations, is strictly prohibited. The fines can and do range up to \$500. They mean business.

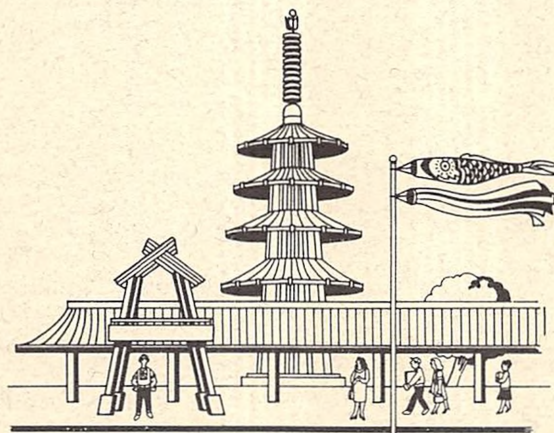
Most hotels in San Francisco, on request, will provide nonsmoking rooms. Nonsmoking rooms are rooms which have never been smoked in.

There are some "of course" aspects to the question as well. Of course you don't smoke in an enclosed room with no way to open a window. Of course you don't carry a lit cigarette onto an elevator even if it's just for a couple of floors. Of course you don't automatically light up wherever you happen to be without checking to see if you're going to send a nearby asthmatic into a wheezing fit that will land him in a hospital. Of course you don't light up without finding out if you're in an area where you legally can do so. Common sense, here as in so many other areas of life, can get us all through a lot without having to resort to citing laws. Nevertheless, just so there would be no areas of misunderstanding, we took the trouble to find out just what the laws were. The full text of the ordinances will be in a future PR.

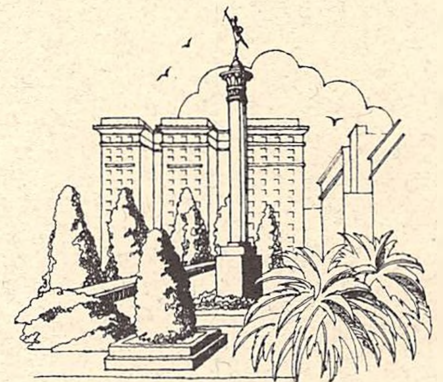
