

If you need help or information of any kind; if you are lost, or if your child is lost; if you've lost or found anything, stop by the information desk in the Hyatt atrium near registration. We will try to handle your problem or find someone who can. We have numbers for hospitals ambulances, drug and psychiatric clinics; we have restaurant lists, hotel maps, program information, reference works, and all kinds of helpful stuff. We'll try to find foreign-language translators, especially Spanish-speaking translators. We will not take messages for anyone except the concom and the GoHs: leave all other messages on the bulletin board. If you have any problems whatsoever, please tell us; we can't help you if you don't ask us to.

Please, be as polite and patient as possible with the hotel staff. They are doing the best they can; remember that they are human, too. If you have any problems with hotel security, please be as polite as possible, note the person's name, and mention it to us. No signs are to be taped to anything in the Hyatt. Party notices may be placed on easels on each guest-room floor. No signs may be taped to walls in the Adams, but signs may be placed on doors. Please don't throw anything from the atrium balconies in the Hyatt. The air drafts pull everything into the open elevator shafts and foul the elevators. Please don't bring animals into the hotels—it's against health laws. This includes snakes. There is a corkage fee on alcohol in both hotels—be warned; be discreet. There is no corkage fee on soda pop in the Hyatt, but there is in the Adams. However, in the Adams, you can buy soda pop from the concom at \$6 per case, which is what we are paying the hotel for it. Sorry; it is the best deal we could get you, and it's better than 50 cents per can (plus tip) from Room Service. Guests do have access to one safety deposit box with their rooms. We urge you to store your valuables in it; hotel rooms are not very secure. Unless you have BankAmericard (Visa), American Express, or MasterCard, room payment is required in advance.

We'd appreciate your please wearing your badge at all times. Anyone not wearing a con badge will be asked to show it; those who cannot produce it will be asked to leave function space. We ask that you don't bring any food or drink into the huckster room or art show, to avoid damaging valuable materials. In case of theft, please call hotel security and they will call the con headquarters and police. In case of damage to facilities, call con HQ and we will call the hotel or Civic Center.

If you want to volunteer to work, go to the Staff HQ in the Borein Room of the Hyatt.

Members of the Press should go to the Board Room in the Hyatt.

Please be as polite and patient as possible with the convention staff. We're doing the best we can; remember that we're human, too. Help us out, if you can.

At previous conventions, the GoH has been taken out of storage only for functions; Mr. Ellison feels that the GoH should be visible and available to the attendees, and has volunteered to repeat a gesture he has used before: Mr. Ellison will be writing in a transparent bubble in the Hyatt mezzanine during IguanaCon II.
