
Travel and Accommodation

While You're Here

While a Worldcon can easily occupy every waking hour, we know that members often like to see a bit of the host city. We have provided an <u>introduction to San Antonio</u> for orientation, and a list of <u>major attractions</u>, but for detailed information we recommend you use some of the excellent official websites.

- <u>www.VisitSanAntonio.com</u> is the official tourism site for the city. It has three main sections:
 - Browse and Book gives quick access to reviews and reservations for attractions, shops, and restaurants.
 - Trip Ideas provides thematically organized access to the same information.
 - Explore San Antonio contains extensive material on history, tourism and leisure.
- <u>www.theSanAntonioRiverWalk.com</u> is the official site of the San Antonio River Walk. It includes a history of the area, information on dining, events, and attractions, and much more.
- <u>www.SanAntonio.gov</u> is the official site of the City of San Antonio. It includes a range of information for visitors, including details of museums and galleries, public parks, art and cultural events.
- <u>www.SAHearts.com</u> is a city-sponsored guide to arts and cultural events in San Antonio. It includes visual arts, theatre, dance, music, culinary, and other events.

The River Walk area itself is full of shops and restaurants and will provide a great atmosphere for a stroll or a longer break from the convention. We've provided a guide to <u>dining on the River Walk</u> listing over 30 restaurants that you may want to try. Tex-Mex is of course the local speciality but you'll also find Old World, New World, Barbeque, Italian, Seafood, and some AAA Four Diamond fine dining choices.

If you'd like some morning exercise - to keep yourself fresh and to see some of the River Walk area - consider joining <u>Stroll with the Stars</u>, starting at 9 a.m. each day just outside the Marriott Riverwalk.

Worldcon Orientation

The first thing to do on arrival (after checking into your hotel, of course), is to register and collect your badge, which gives you access to the convention. The registration desk is located in the West Registration area of the convention center. Make sure you ALWAYS carry your badge - security will not let you in to convention areas without it - and be careful not to lose it. Registration hours are listed on the main schedule page along with the opening hours for all of the main convention areas and activities.

- If you are bringing younger children, you may want to consider using our <u>professional childcare</u> <u>service</u>, which is once again being run by Kiddiecorp this year. (This is additional to the Rangernauts fan-run children's program.) We encourage you to pre-register for this service as capacity is limited. Childcare costs \$12 per hour but the first six hours are free for those with paid child memberships.
- And if you'd like to help put on "the Greatest Show on Earth" (or at least in fandom), please sign up as a <u>volunteer</u> we will need as many hands as possible on the day to share the load!

You will find our Information Desk, Volunteers Desk, and Accessibility Services Desk all located in the West Registration area, near to convention registration.

LoneStarCon 3 on the Move

We are currently finalizing our mobile applications - yes, plural, this year you will have two to choose from! One will be a mobile site (no software download needed), while the other will be a more fully-featured application which can save your personal schedule. The apps will run on a wide variety of Android, iOS, and other devices. This year's apps will also be available for direct download rather than needing to go through Google Play and the iTunes store - this will make it much easier for us to deal with any issues that arise during the convention.

We expect that our mobile applications will be available for members to use by **Friday**, **August 23**, at the latest.

Schedule, Program, and Events

LoneStarCon 3 has an exciting and diverse range of programming, topped off with some spectacular events and exhibits. The full convention program will be published around August 15, but in the meantime, a great place to start is the <u>schedule</u> page which includes a list of highlights.

- For those arriving early, we still have space for our guided tour to the <u>Robert E. Howard House and Museum</u>. This event is scheduled for **Wednesday**, **August 28**, with a cost to LoneStarCon 3 members of \$50 to cover the coach trip to and from Cross Plains.
- Major events are planned for each night of the convention. Opening Night (Thursday) will feature <u>Music Night</u>, while Friday night has <u>Art Night</u> including the presentation of the <u>Chesley</u> <u>Awards</u>. On Saturday you can attend the <u>Masquerade</u> and, of course, Sunday sees the presentation of the <u>Hugo Awards</u>.
- Thursday night will also see a Ghost Walk of San Antonio, starting outside the Alamo at 8:30 p.m. Guides in period costume will be performing in true storytelling format.
- The middle nights of the convention will have featured <u>dance events</u>. On Friday at 8 p.m., you can Join the Browncoats as we recreate the famous "Shindig" ball in our Firefly Shindig Contradance. On Saturday at 8 p.m. you can step into a real Tex-Mex Conjunto dancehall experience with the music of <u>Los Paisanos de Chalito Johnson</u>, one of the first families of the progressive San Antonio Conjunto sound. And on Sunday at 11 p.m., after the Hugo Awards, <u>Scott Bradlee</u> and his Postmodern Jukebox ensemble will transform the pop-chart hits of today into the anachronistic party favorites of a yesteryear that never was, in our Steampunk-themed late night club dance.
- Our musical highlights are not limited to Music Night, although concerts from Seanan McGuire, Leslie Fish, Captains of the Chess Team, and the Diamond Star Project are certainly a great way to start the convention! As we have committed to from the time we started bidding, we will have <u>music at the heart of the convention</u>, with concerts and performances every day. Look out especially for <u>Sundown: Whispers of Ragnarok</u>, a performance by the acapella group Sassafrass. Gods and myths of the Viking era will come to life in this set of songs which narrate the history of the cosmos according to Viking legend, from the creation of the world to Ragnarok. Sassafrass will be performing at 2 p.m. on Saturday, August 31.


 The <u>LoneStarCon 3 Independent Film Festival</u> is brought to you by Nat Saenz, who also ran the Renovation and Chicon 7 Film Festivals. These events are growing in popularity every year and this year we have a full program of over 100 independent and fan films.

Rangernauts - Our Children's Program

We will once again be offering fan-run children's programming for 6-12 year olds - and their parents - as an alternative to the professional childcare service offered by Kiddiecorp. Rangernauts will run for the full weekend and feature crafts, games, toys, mini-projects, books, comics, and a bit of space for children to enjoy. We want to create a room where there is always something to do, where science and engineering meet fiction, film, books, comics, and the fantastic, and where kids will enjoy themselves and have fun!

Rangernauts is not a child-minding service: it is Worldcon programming for kids. There will be a sign-in facility for children who are LoneStarCon 3 members, with children able to be signed in for a maximum of four hours at a time (everyone needs a break!)



These activities allow kids to have their own convention time. We will have a ribbon system in place for parents, children who can come and go, and children who must be with a parent. Younger children are welcome in the continual company of their parents. We will have a seating area so parents can have a moment of peace while watching the chaos.

The <u>Rangernauts</u> web page includes a more detailed description of the program that is planned for each day. The Rangernauts activities are coming from the same team that delivered "Dragongirls, Cowboys and Pirates" at Renovation in 2011, and ChiKidz at Chicon 7 last year - with great reviews both times (not least from the kids!)

- Site Selection at the convention will be open from 12 Noon to 6 p.m. on Thursday, August 29, and from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Friday, August 30, and Saturday August 31. The winners will be announced at the Sunday morning WSFS Business Meeting.



Travel - Getting Here

San Antonio Airport Information

There are over <u>100 flights daily to San Antonio</u> and the airport is about eight miles from downtown San Antonio or a 15-minute taxi ride.

You can find <u>San Antonio International Airport</u> flight information, transit services provided, flight time and mileage on their website, or call (210) 207-3411 for more information.

How To Get To/From the Airport

- Taxis and Car Services: As with most airports, taxis can be found just outside the terminals near baggage claim. Typical fare to the convention center or either Marriott hotel is \$25-30.
 - <u>Towne Car San Antonio</u> is a car service with a reasonable local reputation. They use Lincolns, which offers more comfort for larger fans, and the fares follow standard San Antonio taxicab rates.
- **Public Transport**: The cheap option is VIA Metropolitan Transit bus #5, \$1.20 / passenger to downtown (about 30 minutes) and \$0.15 per transfer slip, leaving from the VIA stop halfway between Terminals A & B, and running from 5 a.m. to 10:30 p.m., every 30 or 60 minutes depending on the time of day. Once in downtown, you can either transfer to VIA's streetcar service (usually the Red Line #301 Circulator) or walk ~1-2 blocks to the Riverwalk area.

Airport Shuttle Reservations: GO Aiport Shuttle is the airport's authorized shared-ride shuttle
service. The local San Antonio franchise for GO Airport Shuttle is operated by City Tours, Inc., and is
the successor to the old San Antonio Trans Airport Express.

Shuttles depart from 7 a.m. to 1:30 a.m. daily to downtown hotels every 15 minutes. Passengers may purchase tickets at the airport's baggage claim area or <u>make a reservation online</u> for a small additional discount. Ticket rates are currently \$19.25 (including fuel surcharge) for a single trip and \$36.50 for a round trip ticket.

Complimentary Shuttle: Some hotels have <u>complimentary shuttle service</u> for their guests. However
this is primarily for hotels in the airport area and does not include any of the <u>three hotels</u> being used
by the convention.

Convention commentary: convention staff have had good experiences with the GO Shuttle but it is relatively expensive. For a single person the \$19.25 fare is better value than a taxi, but for two or more people sharing, a taxi (typical fare \$30 including tip) will be cheaper. The larger mini-vans can take up to six people.

Driving Directions

Driving directions to the convention center from various locations are as follows. Naturally you may need to modify these depending on where you plan to park, but these should be a good starting point.

- **Driving from the Airport**: Take Highway 281 South to the East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard exit. Exit on East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard and turn right on East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard to Alamo Street. Turn right on Alamo to Market Street. At Market Street turn right and proceed in front of the convention center. Just before the stoplight at Bowie Street, the Marina Parking Garage is on the left (past Marriott Riverwalk) and the Grand Hyatt Parking Garage is on the right. The convention center parking lot is on the left past Bowie Street.
- **Driving South from Dallas/Austin**: Travel IH-35 South to San Antonio. IH-35 South intersects with IH-37 South to Corpus Christi. Take IH 37 South to the East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard exit. Exit on East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard and turn right on East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard to Alamo Street. Turn right on Alamo to Market Street. At Market Street turn right and proceed in front of the Convention Center. Just before the stoplight at Bowie Street, the Marina Parking Garage is on the left (past Marriott Riverwalk) and the Grand Hyatt Parking Garage is on the right. The convention center parking lot is on the left past Bowie Street.
- **Driving West from Houston**: Travel IH 10 West to San Antonio. IH 10 West intersects with IH 37 North toward Johnson City. Take IH 37 North to the East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard exit. Exit on East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard and turn left on East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard under the interstate to Alamo Street. Turn right on Alamo to Market Street. At Market Street turn right and proceed in front of the Convention Center. Just before the stoplight at Bowie Street, the Marina Parking Garage is on the left (past Marriott Riverwalk) and the Grand Hyatt Parking Garage is on the right. The convention center parking lot is on the left past Bowie Street.

• **Driving North from Corpus Christi:** Travel IH 37 North toward San Antonio to the East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard exit. Exit on East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard and turn left on East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard under the interstate to Alamo Street. Turn right on Alamo to Market Street. At Market Street turn right and proceed in front of the Convention Center. Just before the stoplight at Bowie Street, the Marina Parking Garage is on the left (past Marriott Riverwalk) and the Grand Hyatt Parking Garage is on the right. Exit on East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard, keep right for three-quarters of a circle and proceed under the interstate past six traffic signals to Alamo Street. Turn left on Alamo Street to Market Street. At Market Street turn right and proceed in front of the Convention Center. Just before the stoplight at Bowie Street, the Marina Parking Garage is on the left (past Marriott Riverwalk) and the Grand Hyatt Parking Garage is on the right. The convention center parking lot is on the left past Bowie Street.

The San Antonio Amtrak station is located on the eastern portion of Downtown San Antonio, right next to the AlamoDome. It's about half a mile from the Marriott Riverwalk and Marriott Rivercenter.

To get to the Marriott Rivercenter from the Amtrak Station by car

- Head West on Hoefgen Avenue toward Gonzales Street (Alamodome will be behind you)
- Take the left onto E. Commerce Street (You will have just passed Sunset Station on your right)
- Drive straight ahead on Commerce Street. You will pass under the highway 281 overpass. Keep going straight.
- After about a fifth of a mile, you will see a Denny's on your right. That Denny's is at the intersection of Commerce and Bowie.
- You want to take a right onto Bowie Street. Immediately after taking the right onto Bowie, get into the left hand turn lane. Then take the first left you can, and you are at the Marriott Rivercenter.

To get to the Marriott Rivercenter from the Amtrak Station by foot

• Follow the same instructions as by car. It is easily walkable if the weather is good. It's roughly half a mile, no major inclines or declines. Be careful about the highway underpass, since there are a lot of people rushing off of or onto the highway. Not recommended if you have a lot of luggage.

Parking in San Antonio

San Antonio's urban core is very compact and you can walk to dozens of restaurants, top sights both on street and along the River Walk. If you stay in a downtown hotel, parking can be arranged through your hotel. The charge for parking at the convention's <u>Marriott hotels</u> is \$25 per day however, and members are likely to find better deals available at other locations in the area.

There are very good official web pages with comprehensive information about parking in San Antonio. These include maps as well as lists of parking providers with phone numbers. Two particularly useful pages are:
