KiddieCorp is available to all children ages 1-12 years old. Preference for hours will be given to children ages 1-6 for the hours between opening-6pm. Childcare is \$12/hour.

If the child has a Child's Admission or Full Attending Membership that was bought prior to July 31, 2004 they may use up to 8 hours of childcare without charge, given space available. If the child has a Child's Admission or Full Attending Membership that was bought between August 1, 2004 and September 3, 2004, they may use up to 6 hours of childcare without charge, given space available. Child's Admissions purchased Saturday or later get a pro-rated amount of childcare hours. Please see us for details.

KiddieCorp organized activities are in Beacon G & H; children must be checked into KiddieCorp and may not move between the different activities scheduled below. The KiddieCorp. schedule and policies follow the Children's Programming and Activities schedule. Please note that parents of children who are not picked up by closing time will be subject to additional fees charged by KiddieCorp.

KiddieCorp will not be able to provide meals for your children. They will have some snacks available for in between. Please remember to pick up your children for their meals.

# **Discipline Policies**

Attached (Satellite): We will have ribbons that designate the children as Attached that will say SATELLITE. They will be required to wear the ribbon with their badge at all times and will not be admitted to any children's activity or children's program without a designated adult. Parents may choose to work together with up to 3 attached (Satellite) children per 1 adult. This policy is for safety and legal purposes. Children designated as attached (Satellite) who are unable to appropriately participate with a designated adult will be asked not to return to the children's area.

Free Range (Comets): Free Range children will have a ribbon made available for them saying COMET. These ribbons are optional. Children designated as free range who repeatedly or dangerously choose to use inappropriate or disruptive behavior will have a hole punched through their badge. If they earn 3 punches they will be asked to leave the children's activities and program areas and not return without a parent. They will be designated as an attached child, given a ribbon stating (Satellite) and will become governed by the policies stated above.

Parents may designate their child as Free Range (Comet) or Attached (Satellite).

### Tween Lounge

Looking for a space to find others your age to play a quick game or to check out other programming? We've got a space for you! Our Tween Lounge is located in Beacon E, and will be open the same hours as Children's Services. We will have two special events in this room. On Saturday afternoon, there will be an introduction to Dungeons & Dragons from 1-2pm and then from 3-6pm you will get to play your newly created character. Then during the Hugos, there will be a Gummy Wars game run by the N4 Gaming division. The rest of the time is open for you to have a place to hang out, read, meet new friends, find old friends. play games, and solve puzzles.

# Children's Programming

Children's Programming is designed for, and open to, older children in the 7-12 year range, and is open to any child with a Full Membership, a Children's Admission designated as a Comet (aka Free-ranging), and Children's Admission designated Satellite (Non-free-ranging) with an attached adult. Children under 7 usually need a little assistance with the projects or sometimes need redirection for behavior. We prefer for ages under 7 that discipline and assistance be done by the parents. It helps the Children's Programming Staff alleviate some of the disciplinarian load.


Several of the scheduled program items do have a limit on the number of participants. Please make sure you arrive early for these items if you wish to take part in them.

A child member has the right to attend Noreascon 4 for all five days of the convention. If the child is six and under and wants to participate in Children's Programming, as opposed to Children's Activities, then an attending member who has full authority and responsibility for the actions and safety of

the child member should also be present with the child. Children ages 7 to 12 with a child's admission or full membership can participate fully in Children's Programming without their parent present.

Children attending Children's Programming fall under the same disciplinary actions as the Comets (please see preceding page.)

The Children's Activities and Programming Staff *cannot provide snacks and meals*. Arrangements *must* be made to feed your children. This is especially important as no meal breaks have been built into the program schedule.


