The NyCon 3 Guest of Honor will be Lester del Rey. Those familiar with his professional career (one which began in ASTOUNDING's Golden Age) will be pleased to know that as a speaker he is equally brilliant and facile, and he has promised an uncompromisingly controversial speech.

We are reintroducing the neglected tradition of Fan Guest of Honor to bestow it upon a man long overdue the honor: Bob Tucker. Bob's own professional credits are not meagre, but he has chosen to remain a fan active in fandom, thirty-five years after the publication of his first fanzine. Bob was the first to bring the light of wit and humor into the staid and sometimes over-pompous realms of early fandom, and his still sharply-honed rapier will undoubtedly be in evidence when he speaks.

While we sold member/ in the NyCon 3 at the Tricon at a 50d discount, membership rates are presently \$3.00 for an attending membership, \$2.00 for a non-attending membership, and \$1.00 for an overseas non-attending membership.
