HOW TO GET THERE

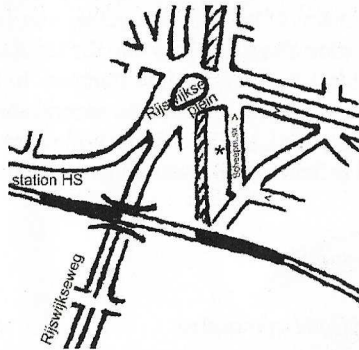
Past heaps of brick and mortar and sand, and through Umleitungen, Déviations and Detours, for not only is the part of The Hague just south of the hostel being renovated, but the famous Rijswijkseplein around the corner looks like the beach after a busy day.

By car?

If you insist. Public transport is perfect for the hostel, but if you insist...

Coming from Rotterdam follow the A13 (E19) down into Rijswijk/Den Haag. It is a long, long road. Please ignore roads branching off to Rijswijk(left) and Voorburg (right). Persevere and in time, when it seems Den Haag is being either boarded up or torn down, you'll see a tall rose red/pinkish tower. Loose sight of it for a moment, pass under a railway bridge and come out in the middle of a large reconstruction.

The rose red tower is on your right. Just left to it is a Mondriaan mural of white and yellow. Keep that to your right. In front of you is a bit of a rise but just before you get there, turn right (maybe the lights will be working already!).

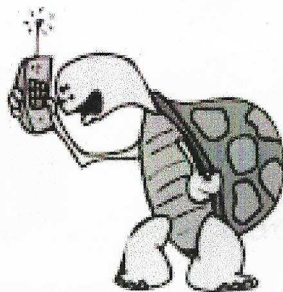


Cross the secondary road and take the next sharp right. Then take the first right and you are in Scheepmakersstraat! The hostel is on the left.

Coming from Amsterdam, ignore Den Haag/Voorburg signs but continue in the direction of Rotterdam and take the Den Haag/Rijswijk exit (see above).

Coming from Utrecht, arriving at Den Haag briefly follow the signs for Rotterdam and then take the Den Haag/Rijswijk exit (see, again, above).

There is paid parking by ticket in the surrounding streets, daily 9.00-17.00. Usually not on weekends, but it can be very hard finding a spot. You can usually find room in the covered parkings further on in the centre.

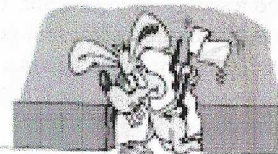


HOW TO GET THERE

By public transport

From Den Haag HS station. Take the exit Centrum or Stationshal (ignore Laakhaven). Turn right past the station and all the taxis. At the end you'll see the sand hill of a crossroads under construction. There is a footpath across to the rose red tower (watch out for traffic twice!!!). Behind the tower, across the water, you'll see the hostel. Just cross the bridge, take the first on the right and there you are. Three minutes, unless they place traffic lights at the footpath – than it'll be two minutes more.

From Den Haag CS (Central Station). Leave the concourse on the left hand side and take tram nr. 12 that goes to Duindorp. Leaves appr. every 10 minutes. Buy a ticket for two stops from the driver, OR (cheaper) seek out the HTM-ticket window in the station concourse and get a 'strippenkaart' which you can use for any tram/bus trip in this country. If you travel together you can use one card for all. You stamp one strip per zone travelled, plus one for the road per person, and you may change or go back within 1 hour of the time stamped. In this case, stamp two strips. Descend at the second stop (Rijswijkseplein), and across the wide expanse of road and sand is Scheepmakersstraat and the hostel.
