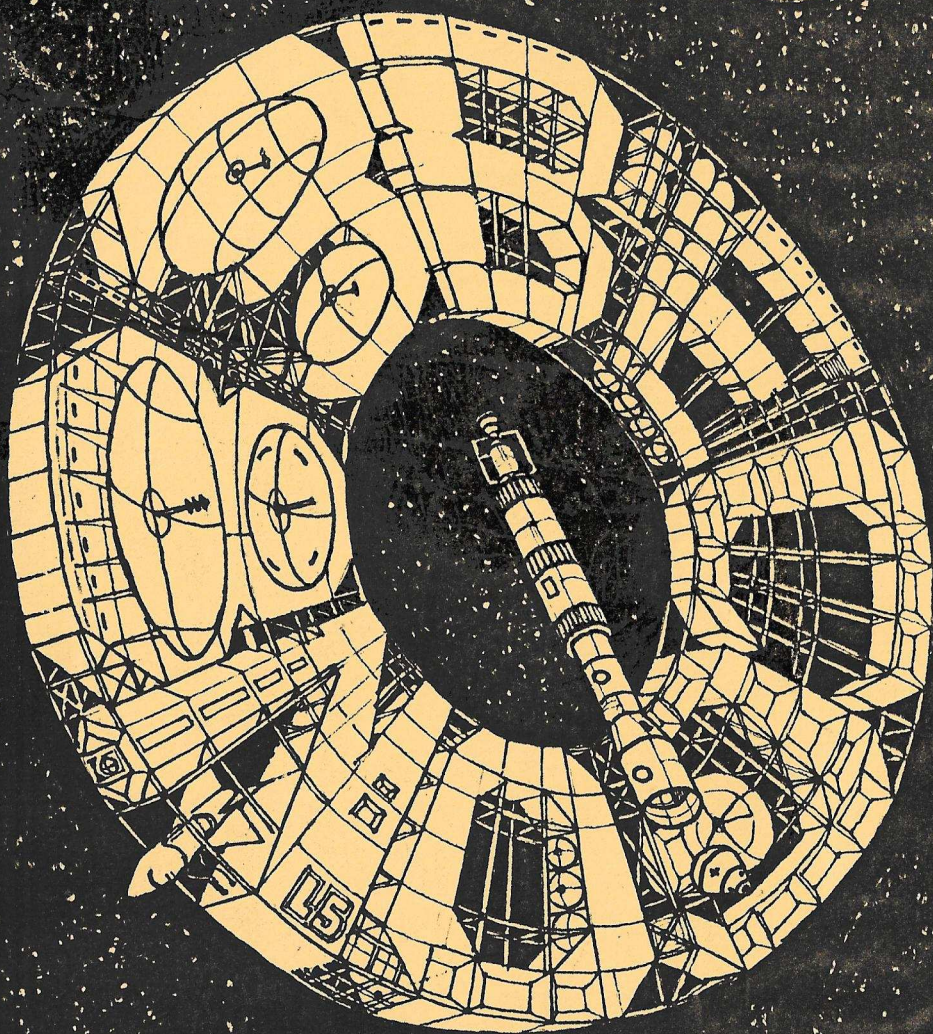




INTRODUCTION.

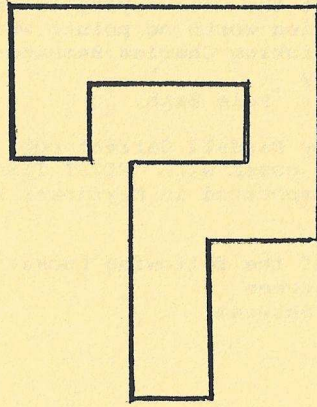

Slaughterhouse 5.	directed by George Roy Hill. 1971. The film version of the Kurt Vonnegut novel.
The Green Slime.	directed by Kenji Fukasaku. 1968. Little green men, spaceships, meteors - what more could you want! (well possibly a plot, good acting and script!!).
Son of Kong.	directed by Ernest Schoedsack. 1933. Sequel to the most famous monster movie.
Fred Fu Manchu.	A little known avant garde classic of early period Sellers.
Lurgi Strikes Britain.	Milligan strikes Beccon (subtitle).

KEN BULMER.

In PR2 we made some reference to our G.O.H.'s history and professional works, but you may be interested to hear of some of his fannish activities over the years.

In 1941 he published his first fanzine 'Star Parade', which ran for seven issues, and collaborated in 'Fantasy Post'. He went on to edit a number of fanzines, many in collaboration, such as 'Science Fantasy News' (1952), 'Aaaagh!' (1954), 'Dysteleology' (1954,55), 'Vignette' (1954), 'Ziz' (1954), and 'Wappopot' (1956). He was also the founder of OMPA (Off-trail Magazine Publishers Association), which organised OMPACON (1973, Eastercon, Bristol). He was TAFF Delegate in 1955 to the Cleveland World S.F. Convention - Clevention - at which Isaac Asimov was GoH. We must also note that BECCON 83 will not be the first time he has been Guest of Honour, - there was Thirddancon (1968 Eastercon, Buxton), and of course Shoestringcon 1 (1980 Hatfield)

* Dysteleology - the doctrine of purposelessness, or the denial of final causes
