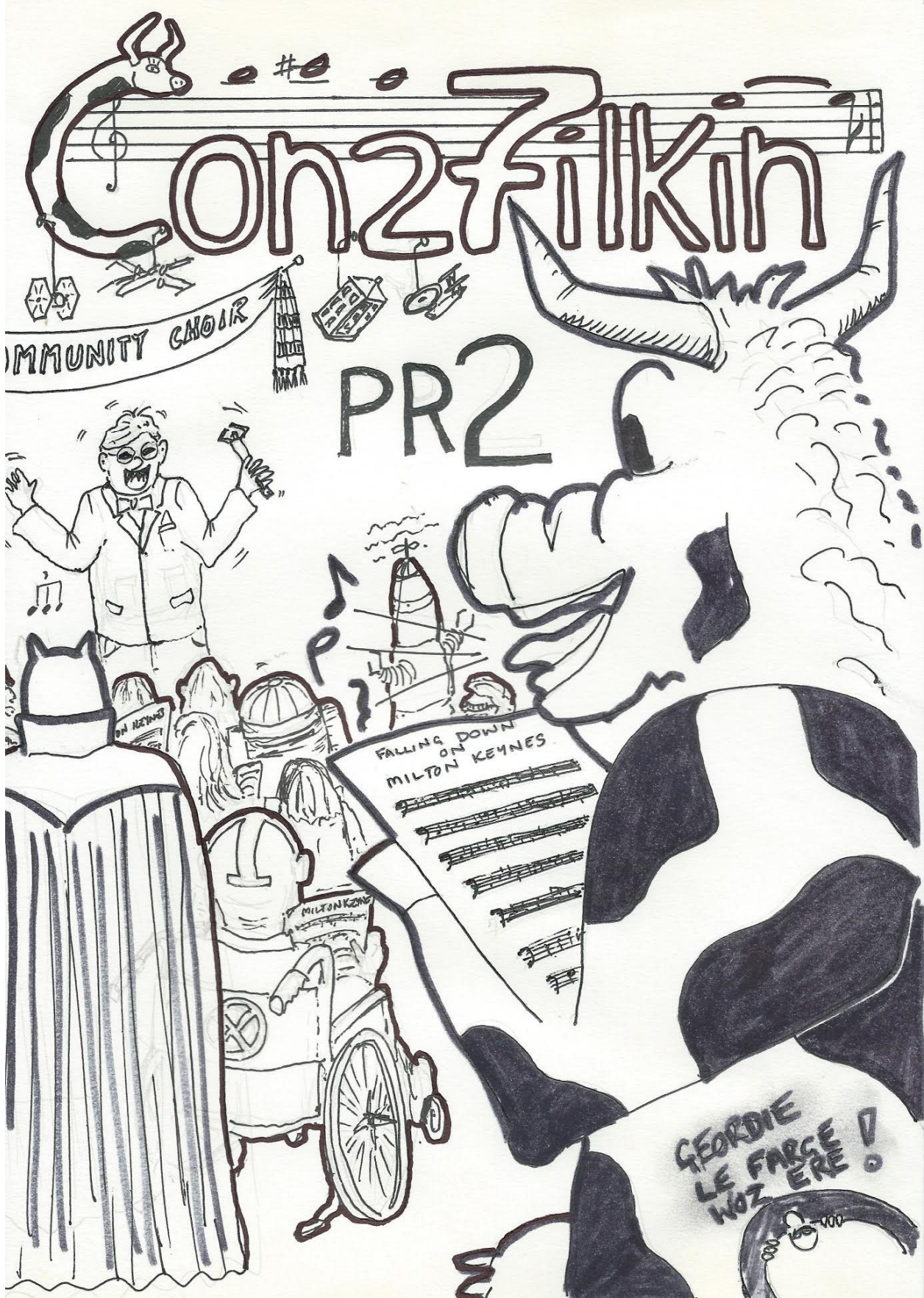




Intro

Programme spot requests

Now is the time to be informing us if you would like to have a spot on the programme at Con27ilkin’. To do so please send an e-mail to Con27ilkin@contabile.org.uk titled Programme Spot, telling us how long you would like and what you plan to do with it. As we mentioned in PR1 the con’s ethos is “Music is more fun when we make it together” and we have a strong bias towards programme items that are participative. This does NOT mean that there will not be normal concert spots and do still apply for that if that’s what you want, but do give it a thunk both inside and outside of the box.

Making a request is no guarantee of getting a slot, recent performances will be considered when allocating spots. Please make your applications by 31st December and then we will look at what we have and craft a beautiful programme from there. Code of Conduct

We will not tolerate discrimination or harassment on the grounds of gender, race, sexual orientation, age, ethnicity or disability - or anything else. We expect all the convention members to treat each other with respect.

If you feel you are being harassed, or if someone is making you feel uncomfortable, please speak to them about the behaviour you are finding inappropriate, or come and speak to the Duty Committee Member (or any other committee member). If you notice someone else behaving in a manner that makes you uncomfortable, again, please come and discuss it with us.

We will take any comments or complaints very seriously and do our best to hear all sides of the situation in order to make sure we are reacting appropriately and fairly. We will treat all matters with discretion. If we are unable to mediate a solution between the parties involved, we may take further steps, including but not limited to issuing a warning, revoking a membership without refund and requesting that the person leave the convention, or, in serious cases, involving the hotel staff or the police.

We reserve the right to pass on details of any serious breaches of the code of conduct to future committees of the UK Filk Convention for their information.

Concrete Cow Policy

We strive to provide a welcoming atmosphere for all cementitious ruminants who wish to attend Con27ilkin'. We would ask, however, that if you intend on bringing a concrete cow, he/she/they should be a full member of the convention if he/she/they wishes to attend convention programming. Depending on interest, we may need to limit the numbers of concrete cows permitted in the swimming pool at any one time, due to water displacement and consideration for other users.

Please do not allow your cow to wander off unattended – we are close to main roads, an airport and a very good chocolate shop, all of which may pose problems and sources of temptation for hardcore-comprised ungulates.

Con27ilkin' Hotel Booking Form

The Instructions

1. A single room is £50 per night. A double/twin room is £58 per night. A room with adjoining room for children is £95. These prices are per room without breakfast.
2. To add breakfast add £7 per room so the prices become £57, £65 and £102
3. Please complete all of the form.
4. Remember to delete any nights you do not require a room.
5. You may only share with another member of the convention. If you specify a sharer who has not joined, your application will not be processed unless/until they join.
6. If you want us to find a sharer for you and wish to exclude certain people from consideration please write their names on a separate piece of paper headed with your name and titled exclusion list. This list will only be seen by Lissa as Hotel Liaison.
7. Special requirements for the room is for such things as non-feather pillows for people with allergies. Please do not ask for a bath tub of lime jello - I promise I already know that you are wild and wacky people.
8. Unsigned forms will NOT be processed as that is your commitment to pay. If Doing by e-mail then please include a statement about understanding that you are responsible for your own hotel bill.
9. The membership list in PR3 will indicate if we have received a room booking from you, or if at a later date you are unsure then you can always ask.

Getting to the Hotel

From London:

From the M25 exit at Junction 28 (A12), signposted Chelmsford. You are now on the A12; continue for approx 34 miles and take the exit for the A120, signposted Bishops Stortford. At the roundabout take the 3rd turning signposted to Stanway follow the road over the A12, at the next roundabout take the 2nd turning, the entrance to the hotel is 200 yards on your left.

From Ipswich:

From the A14 and A12 interchange follow the A12 towards Colchester for about 19 miles, take the A120 junction signposted Marks Tey & Bishops Stortford, exit on to the slip road and take the 1st turning left at the roundabout, the entrance to the hotel is 200 yards on your left.

From Harwich:

Follow the signs for the (A12) A120, continue on the A120 until the Junction with A12, signposted Chelmsford/London and join the A12. Continue until you reach the A120 signposted Marks Tey & Bishops Stortford, exit on to the slip road and take the 1st turning left at the roundabout, the entrance to the hotel is 200 yards on your left.

From Stansted:

At the junction A120/M11, Birchanger Green Service Area, take the 1st turning signposted Colchester off of the roundabout. Continue on the A120 following all the signposts for Colchester. After about 22 miles you will enter Marks Tey, go over a railway bridge and approach a roundabout, take the 2nd turning and follow the road over the A12, at the next roundabout take the 2nd turning, the entrance to the hotel is 200 yards on your left.

We are looking into taxi prices from Stansted and Gatwick and will provide information on this in PR3. If there are 2 or more of you travelling together from Stansted a pre-booked taxi is likely to be cheaper and faster than going by train.

From the Marks Tey train station:

Turn left out of the station, proceed along the road, keeping on the left hand side for approx. 75ft, cross the road before the slip road on the right. Follow the small path with the bollard at the end and cross the slip road by the bollard. Follow the path over the A12. Cross the slip road by the no entry sign. Follow brown signs for the hotel which is approximately 200 yards on your left.

Getting to Marks Tey train station:

Trains to Marks Tey go from London Liverpool Street station. Currently a single from London Liverpool Street to Marks Tey costs £23.10 and takes 55 minutes. A return from Stansted Airport is £49 and takes around 2 hours. Please bear in mind that train tickets typically go up in price in January. You can research train times here
