THE EASTERCON

BECCON 87 17th-20th APRIL

With less than two months to go to Easter, welcome to the third and final BECCON Progress Report. Once more we have a great deal to tell you: In this PR you will find instructions on how to get to the convention, a full membership list correct to the beginning of February, Part 3 of the Quiz, and a lot of information about the convention itself. You should also have the Theatre and Concert Rail Club Application Form for discount rail travel (how about a small fan-fare?). BECCON: THE CONVENTION

We have tried to develop a number of themes in the BECCON programme. Some of these are obvious, such as the work of our Guest Of Honour - Keith Roberts. Some have developed from the type of material we have been offered. We have tried to maintain editorial control without stifling the creativity of our volunteers. And speaking of volunteers leads us into the first of our themes....

Most SF fans begin by reading books and comics, watching T.V., films and video. Some go on from there into other activities. They produce fanzines, write stories, make and wear costumes, design and play games. They also discuss all of these activities in print and in person. Also, just in case it had escaped your notice, they organise conventions. A major theme of BECCON will be ACTIVE FANDOM. Active involvement in fandom can lead fans on to become participants in the professional worlds of writing, publishing and film-making, to name just three examples. Our Fan Guests of Honour, Chris Atkinson and Malcolm Edwards, exemplify active fandom.

Within this theme we have arranged: workshops (on conrunning, fanzine production, costuming, writing, and more); the Easter Egg Race; the fancy dress; the debate; and many of the games. Any or all of these will let you take an active part in the convention should you wish to do so. The theme extends to cover discussion of the many ways fans become involved in professional activity or become professionals themselves. Fan Guest Of Honour Malcolm Edwards provides an example of someone who started as a fan and has become a professional writer and editor of SF. The directors of Kerosina Publications Ltd. will be talking about how and why a group of fans started their own publishing company.

Keith Roberts provides the convention with another theme: in addition to the usual speech made by the Guest of Honour, we will be presenting a play adapted from his novel 'The Inner Wheel'. We will also be showing a film of his choice (Or two films depending on how you think about it):- The film Three Daughters, directed by Satyajit Ray, has been split into two; one part called, unsurprisingly, Two Daughters has been separated from the third daughter Manihara. Some of Keith's artwork will be on display in the art show.

Many people know that Keith is an accomplished graphic artist and painted many covers for Science Fantasy and New Worlds magazines, so the visual arts are another of our themes. The art show and art auction are a long standing tradition at SF conventions, and need no further introduction (by the way, there is still space available in the art show). We have a talk on book and magazine cover art, a talk by artist David Hardy about his work, and Ken Lake will be showing us some stamps from wonderland. Turning to moving pictures, John Halas of film-makers Halas and Bachelor will be talking about computer aided animation in conjunction with a showing of the film 'Animal Farm', and George Stone will introduce you to Max Headroom as he was originally intended to be.

FANCY-DRESS

The fancy-dress parade will be held in one of the main halls on Saturday. There is limited space for changing so we suggest that entrants dress in their rooms. The route around the hall will include some steps so we also suggest avoiding any very large or unwieldy costumes. There will be a photo-call immediately before the competition starts, and no flash photography will be permitted during the competition itself.

There will be costuming workshops before the competition on Saturday, and again on Sunday, so that contestants can make plans for the Worldcon in August.

CHILDRENS PROGRAMMING

In recent years the number of children at conventions has been going up, but there have been few programme items specifically for them. We have arranged a variety of events specifically for children to take place in the creche, and some on the main programme for children of all ages. The Childrens' Fancy Dress combines both aspects: the costumes will be prepared in the creche from materials at hand for display in the parade in the Queens Hall at 4pm. If you would like to know more about the creche facilities, or to volunteer to help in the creche even for one hour or so, please write to us as soon as possible. More creche helpers would be very welcome.

CHRISTMAS DINNER

Christmas Dinner will take place on Sunday night at 8.30 p.m., and will cost £8.00 for three courses, excluding drinks. Tickets for the dinner will be available on the registration desk until 6 p.m. on Saturday. Numbers are limited, and preference will be given to people who express interest before 1st April. A vegetarian option will be available.

The Awards Cermonies which will follow dinner will be open to all members.

THE DEBATE

Mic Rogers will chair the debate, on the motion "Too much money is being spent on space research". David Brown will propose the motion, and Jerry Webb, well known consultant on space to British Industry, will oppose. The debate will be conducted under formal rules, which will be available at the convention. We need a second on each side, so if anyone would like to volunteer?

THE FAN-ROOM

Another long-standing tradition at British conventions is the fan-room. Every major convention has one, but they all have different ideas about what a fan-room is, and what it does. For some conventions the fan-room is the site for a second programme stream, for others - a second bar. We will be using our fan room for some of the smaller programme items but it will primarily be a place to sit, (collapse) and talk. For decoration, and interest, we intend to put some displays around the walls; photographs of earlier conventions, fanzines, details of local groups, cartoons and illustrations. This is also where we will be holding our signing sessions.

The fan-room will also be the venue for bidding parties, and we expect prospective convention committees to ply members with soft words (and hard liquor) in an attempt to get support for their convention bids.

We have a number of authors attending: So far these include Terry Pratchett, John Brunner, Ian Watson, Robert Holdstock, Barry Bayley and Bob Shaw. We are also very happy to announce another guest who, like our Guest Of Honour, has rarely been seen at conventions: Jane Gaskell, who will be at the convention on Friday and Saturday. We have arranged a signing session on Friday afternoon, and she will be giving a talk on Saturday. For those of you unfamiliar with her work our resident expert has this to say:

JANE GASKELL

Except for the eternally popular Atlan tetralogy (The Serpent, The City, The Dragon, Atlan), Jane Gaskell's books are chronically out of print and difficult to get hold of. This is a shame, as she ranks up there with Angela Carter and Tanith Lee. She is a poet of sleaze and grime. A warped sense of humour helps to appreciate the deceptive casualness of her acid-tipped prose. She shows us a blackly comic vision of life seen through the distorting vision of those who survive in the fringes: the flotsam of war, the physically and emotionally crippled, the scavengers in earth's ruins after the aliens have landed. In their own voices her awful but endearing characters reveal the terrible depravity of innocence.

WRITER'S WORKSHOP

Colin Greenland will be running a writers workshop at BECCON in two sessions on Friday and Monday. He is well known as a reviewer and critic of science fiction and his first novel, 'Daybreak On A Different Mountain', is available in paperback from Unicorn, while his second, 'The Hour Of The Thin Ox', is due for publication this spring. The workshop will only be open to people who have submitted manuscripts for discussion in advance of the convention, and there will be a small charge (over and above membership of the convention) to cover the administration costs. If you are interested in taking part in a workshop, either indicate your interest on The Form or send an S.A.E. to the BECCON address stating your interest. In either case we will send you further details. Places are limited, and the final deadline for submission of manuscripts is 21st March, so if you are interested we suggest you act fast.

FRIDAY NIGHT IS MUSIC NIGHT...

...and we have booked a band, The Adventures Of Parsley, who specialise in Sixties music, while Mike Christie has volunteered his services as a disc-jockey, and aims to keep you dancing well into the early hours of Saturday morning. If anyone has any particular music they would like to dance to, a note to BECCON will reach Mike and he'll see what he can do.

THE CINEMA PROGRAMME

The film programme is an important part of any SF convention, and BECCON has a 230 seat cinema in which to show ours. We have booked a number of major SF films already and are negotiating for several more. The ones we can announce include Dune, War Games, Cocoon, The Atomic Cafe, Harlequin and an old favourite - Allegro Non Troppo.

A SERIOUSLY SILLY GAME

Want to know how to run a really good room party? This game will not help you a bit. It should, however, provide two hours of amusement, if not edification, as two teams of contestants attempt to entice various prominent fans into their party. We need two teams of five eager volunteers, ready to demonstrate their mental and physical stamina and dexterity. Would-be contestants in this silliest (so far!) of serious games should contact BECCON before the convention, so that we can brief them on the rules, and something of what to expect.

THE REPRO ROOM

BECCON will have a repro room which will contain a variety of reprographic equipment, from a Roneo 2A (we think that this was Roneo's first rotary stencil duplicator) to a desktop publishing system. Electronic Printing Systems have agreed to lend us their Jetsetter system, complete with laser printer and we will have a computer to drive it. We will be having an instruction session on how to use all this wonderful equipment. If you have any ideas you could use it for, let us know before the convention to arrange to make best use of it.

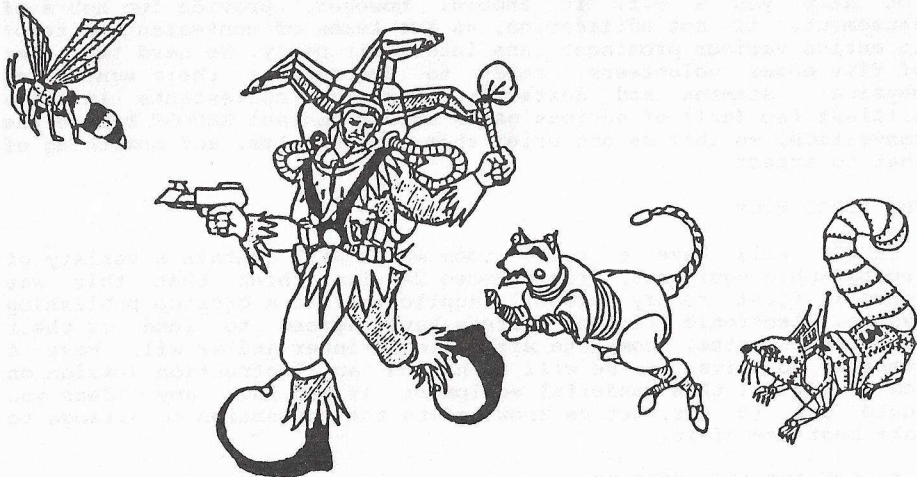
THE BOOK AND ART AUCTIONS

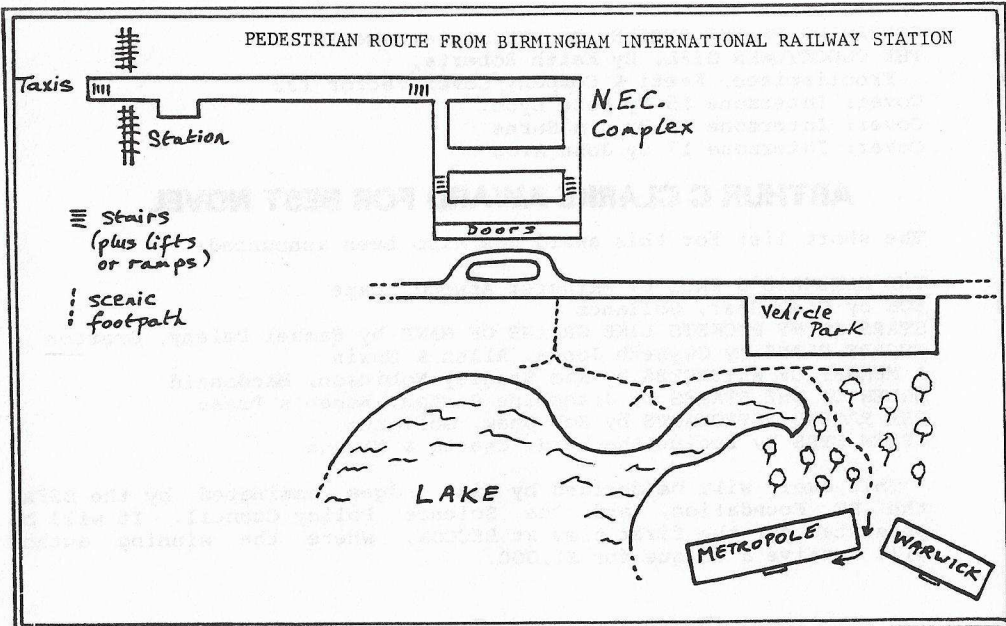
This award will be decided by six judges nominated by the BSFA, the SF Foundation, and The Science Policy Council. It will be presented for the first time at BECCON, where the winning author will receive a cheque for £1,000.

HOW TO GET

BY TRAIN

Birmingham International Station is on the main railway line between London and Birmingham. There are two trains per hour from London Euston during the week, with a journey time of about 80 minutes. From Birmingham New Street the travelling time is 9 minutes, or 16 minutes for the slow train. (It is also on a line from London Paddington via Reading, Didcot, Oxford, Banbury, Leamington Spa and Coventry. We recommend this route for those who wish to enjoy a sedate sightseeing tour of the English countryside).

To get a taxi to the hotel, turn left as you enter the station concourse. To walk, which takes about ten minutes, turn right and follow the signs to the NEC and the Hotel. The route takes you through the NEC complex. Follow the signs to "Metropole Hotel" (which are unfortunately none too obvious) through the complex. When you leave the complex you should be heading straight out towards the lake. Follow the path to the left away from the complex towards the vehicle park, until the path forks: the right hand fork goes through trees round the end of the lake to the hotels. There are signs saying "Hotel" on the way. Pass through the gap between the buildings, and the main entrance to the Metropole is on your right (but you pass the door to the pub first!).

Find the M6.

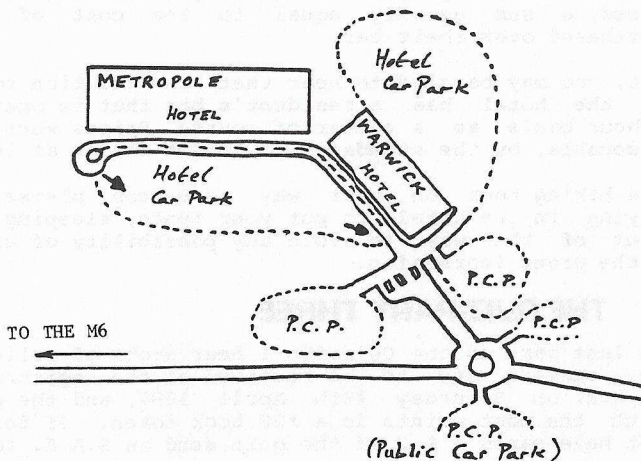
For those that need more detailed instructions, the National Exhibition Centre is to the east of Birmingham near Junction 4 of the M6, and very near the M42 and the A45. On approaching this area follow signs to the "National Exhibition Centre", "N.E.C." etc. Once on the N.E.C. site follow signs to "Hotels" or "Hotels and Conference Centre".

Parking the car:

The hotel is obvious from the road and is approached via a roundabout. There are three car park kiosks - take the straightest line between them ignoring the illuminated signs. Drive along the front of the Warwick and Metropole hotels (keep to the left of the carriageway dividing barrier) and then into the Metropole's car-park. If this is full leave the car-park at the other end and drive round the back of the Warwick and use its car-park instead. In either case parking is free. There should be no need to pay to use a public car-park.

ON ARRIVAL

When you register at the hotel you will be asked how you intend to pay your bill. If you wish to pay by credit-card - the hotel accepts Access, American Express, Diners Club and Visa (Barclaycard) - an impression will be taken of your card, as is becoming normal hotel practice, and you will settle on departure. If you wish to pay by cash or cheque you will be asked to pay for one night's accommodation as a deposit against your final bill, with the balance payable on departure.

FINANCE MATTERS

The membership rate for adults is currently £12. From 1st April we will no longer accept memberships through the post. Membership on the door will be £15 for the weekend or £5 per day. Conversion from Supporting to Attending membership is, as always, £5. The rates for children aged 9 to 14 are fixed at £5. Children under 9 are free but there will be a charge of £3 for use of the creche.

There are still single and twin rooms available in the Metropole and Warwick Hotels. The membership list on Page 14 shows Status as 'H' for those who have booked rooms already.

There are still tables available in the book room. The rate is £2.00 per foot run for the duration of the convention, and those interested should write to Chris Walton at the BECCON address.

Cheques should be made payable to 'BECCON' and sent to the usual address.

WEAPONS POLICY

Our Weapons Policy is very simple one - anything dangerous (i.e. Sharp, Pointed, Missile Projecting, etc.) **MUST** be peace-bonded. Exceptions will be made for special items at the time of the Fancy Dress, provided they have been cleared with the BECCON Committee in advance. Non-bonded items will be examined by our weapons expert, Gytha North, and if in doubt will be tested on their erstwhile owners...

There must not be any pyrotechnics inside the hotel at any time. The hotel's smoke detectors are very sensitive, the fire brigade arrives before it can be stopped, and there is a call out charge for false alarms.

WARNING FOR VISITORS

You may be unaware of the term 'Corkage'; this is the right of any Hotel or Restaurant to charge persons bringing alcoholic beverage onto their premises, a sum usually equal to the cost of that beverage when purchased over their bar.

In this context, you may be glad to hear that in addition to the convention bars the hotel has a resident's bar that is open and staffed on a 24 hour basis as a matter of course. Prices when last visited were reasonable, by the standards of London fandom at least.

If you are on a hiking tour on your way to Beccon, please make sure, when staying in the hotel, to put your tents, sleeping bags and other gear out of the way, to avoid any possibility of giving the Hotel Staff the wrong impression.

THE EASTERCON CHARTER

There does not seem to be a great deal of interest in this at the moment. After publishing a draft in PAPA and CONRUNNER, distributing it to all who volunteered to help at Albacon III and publishing its availability in PRI, I have received precisely five letters and four mailing comments in PAPA. Not a large sample to judge the general opinions of fandom, and one which does not reflect the meeting at Albacon.

Since all these letters have been broadly favourable to the basic concept that I have used, I do not propose to revise the previously published draft before BECCON. The proposed Charter is divided into three parts as follows:- (1) The Constitution, which defines the Eastercon, the voting cycle and the method of amendment (agreement of meetings at two Eastercons). (2) The Charter proper, which lays down guidelines for the committee to observe or publicly disagree with. (3) The Help File administration, which maintains a list of useful addresses etc. for the use of successive Eastercons.

I would be glad to receive any comments, especially about the content of (2), and will try to reply to letters as soon as possible.

FROM MEDIA QUEEN TO HIGH PRIESTESS

Kerosina Books are pleased to announce the latest addition to their list: *Gráinne* by Keith Roberts.

Gráinne, to be published in April, is Roberts' most intriguing novel to date. Based in part on the author's own experiences, this often amusing masterpiece is filled with lively and convincing insight. Its detailed narrative charts, among other things, the rise to fame of a somewhat unlikely provincial advertising agency, the Fitzsimmons Group.

The central theme is the story of an extra-

ordinary woman, Gráinne. It follows her from her student days in Oxford, through a meteoric career in television to her self-ordained destiny as high priestess of a radically new social movement. Roberts himself carefully avoids use of the word 'religion', but others may disagree.

Without doubt, *Gráinne* will be one of the most controversial books of 1987.
