People outside the UK may find that the programme at guide.confusion2021.uk may show items as having already happened when they haven't. Although all items are at their correct times in British Summer Time, the guide very cleverly tries to show you only upcoming items in your local time. Look for past items if you're ahead of BST.

Mute to Watch Programme in Gather

If you're not wearing headphones in Gather programme items then you'll need to mute, or everyone will hear echoes of whatever you're hearing. Headphones are probably best.

Ghosting, Dancing, and Tracking

Hot gather tips:
Press **G** to move through those annoying people (but not objects) who are getting in your way. Press **Z** to dance appreciatively. You can search for people in the participants list and then 'locate' or 'follow' them to find them and go with them to places. Make sure they'd appreciate this. If you aren't the sort of person who would shout in a crowded bar then please think very

carefully before using @everyone chat.

If arrow keys are hard or you're left-handed, the WASD keys also work as navigation keys in Gather.

How to See the Programme

There are two ways to get into the programme items that you want to see.

If you're starting from the convention's Gather space, you can go to the item's

programme room at the right time, and 'interact' with it by pressing X.

If you're not in the Gather space, you can go directly to the programme platform at programme.confusion2021.uk. This will be updated at some point each morning with a list of the coming events for the day.

Remember, if you can't attend an item, you will be able to go back and view recordings on the 'Holodeck' (access it via the programme platform or in Gather from 21 Forward). Once the Holodeck is up and running, recordings will be available a few hours after items finish.

Unpaid Commercial Announcement

NewCon Press would usually be in the Dealers' Room selling books to customers without any shipping charges. This year, that's impossible, so instead we are slashing UK shipping prices on the website for the duration of the convention. 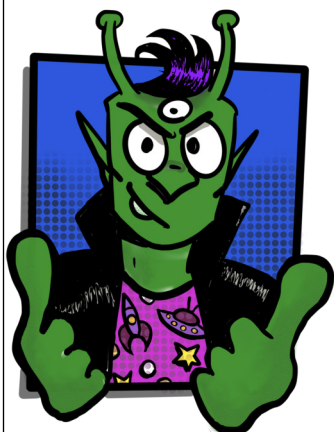

Note that your question must be no more than 160 characters in length and must include a question mark.

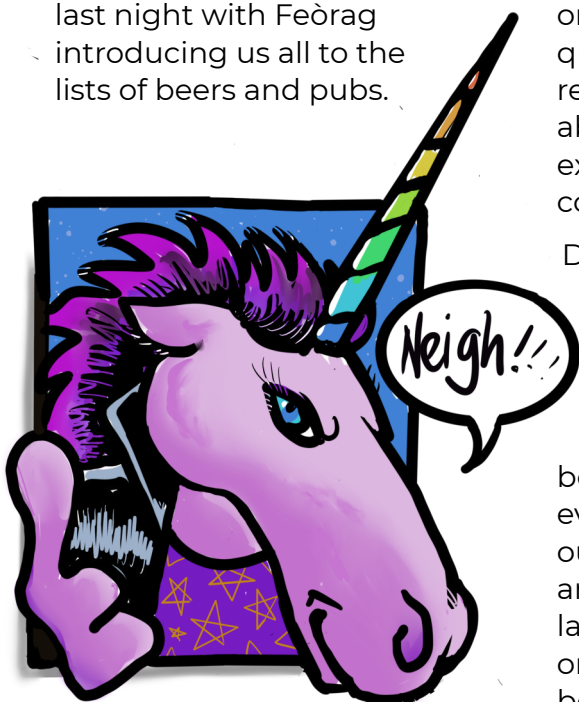

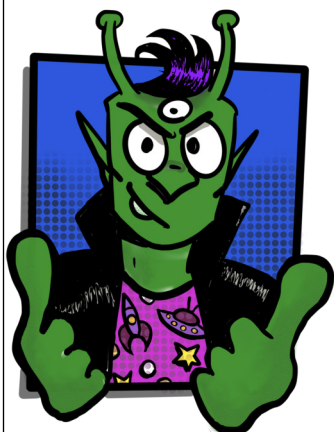

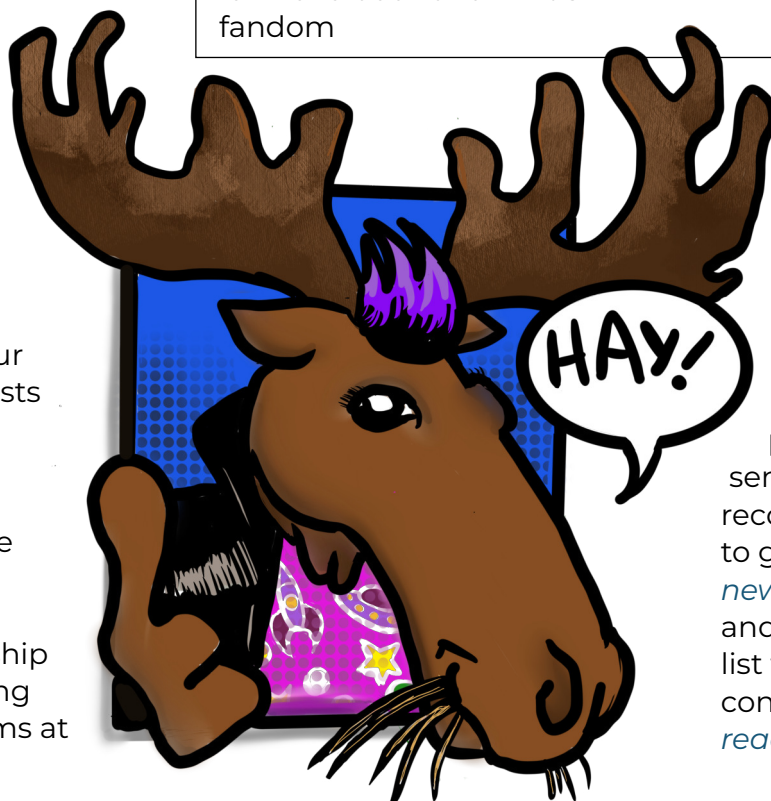
