



FROM THE CHAIR RITA MEDANY

(um.. not sure that came out right but you know what I mean). Odyssey has also been granted Euroconference status which is very good news and will bring many from across mainland Europe. I'm also pleased to announce that Iain M Banks and Carlos Ezquerra will be joining Alastair Reynolds, Liz Williams, Mike Carey and Fran & John Dowd as our Guests of Honour for the convention.

I have a great team of people helping me with this and they have already been hard at work laying down the foundations of the convention. The programme team have been busy turning ideas into programme items (please keep those ideas coming!). The membership team have been busy signing up new members at conventions we have been to in the last year, and boy have we been to a lot! The membership team are also responsible for enabling you to access and update your membership and hotel bookings online.

Our intention is for this convention to be many things to many people. We are aiming for Odyssey 2010 to be a melting pot of real science, fiction, fantasy, art, storytelling, different cultures and flavours, talks, panels, quizzes and costumes that evoke that familiar "fannish" feeling.

We want the convention to be a family friendly event for parents and non parents alike; parents with children are very welcome here and we are busy devising fun and interesting programme items for members of all ages to take part in. Nobody understands what children want more than a parent does, so we are looking for parents to help us with that part of our programme stream as one of our volunteers, or simply helping us out with suggestions. Subject to budget constraints, we are also planning to provide a professional crèche facility similar to Orbital's. More details on what that entails will be posted on our website nearer the start of the convention.

Above all I would love for people to be able to look back on Odyssey 2010 with fond memories of what a great time they had and my team are working very hard to put together a fabulous convention for you. We need your help to make that happen, so please do come on board as one of our volunteers or share your comments and suggestions with us.

As I write this we are in the run up to the LX Eastercon which looks to be shaping up to be another great event. Do come and say hello to me there if you have time. CONVENTION NEWS HOTEL UPDATE

The Radisson will have no triple rooms in 2010, only singles, doubles and twins. There were a small number of zed beds but these have all already been allocated. The Radisson does have cots for infants but there are only three left unbooked, so if you are a family with young child and want to stay in the Radisson, you should contact Membership Services as soon as possible to arrange this. There will be family rooms available in one of the nearby overflow hotels. You'll be pleased to know that the air-conditioning systems will be go-

ing through a major overhaul, with more accessible controls.

QUIET ROOM

At Odyssey 2010 we will be having a Quiet Room, inspired by the Diogenes Club from Sherlock Holmes, available for fans who want a break from the noise and activity of the convention. It will be a place to chill out, read a book or newspaper, relax, and avoid conversation for a time, while still remaining in the company of other fans.

Holmes described the Diogenes Club thus: "There are many men in London, you know, who, some from shyness, some from misanthropy, have no wish for the company of their fellows. Yet they are not averse to comfortable chairs and the latest periodicals. It is for the convenience of these that the Diogenes Club was started, and it now contains the most unsociable and unclubable men in town. No member is permitted to take the least notice of any other one. Save in the Stranger's Room, no talking is, under any circumstances, allowed, and three offences, if brought to the notice of the committee, render the talker liable to expulsion. My brother was one of the founders, and I have myself found it a very soothing atmosphere."

We ask our members to respect the rule of silence in the Quiet Room and remember that people have come to this room to avoid conversation and to recharge their batteries.


MELANIE DAVIS TREASURY AND FINANCE

VOLUNTEERS ABOUT VOLUNTEERING

Like any other Eastercon, Odyssey is going to need your help. Although we promise to work the committee to the brink of exhaustion and mental collapse, even they can't do everything - which is where you come in.

Odyssey needs volunteers in a lot of different areas, in order to help the convention run smoothly. Helping out is a great way to meet new people, learn new things, and have a great deal of fun while you're at it.

WHO WE NEED

Art show: organising the Art boards, getting all the exhibition pieces signed up and mounted, bag-check and bid notifications, the auction that follows, and so on.

Masquerade: A chance to show off costumes that you have made yourself and win a prize. Prepare a short performance, or just display it to music.

Cabaret (no prize): Perform a song, sketch, dance, or anything else that may appeal to your fellow fans. I'm always impressed by the great variety of talent. Performances should be no more than three mins in length, unless extra time is agreed in advance with Judith.

Gophers: General at-con runners, getting information and bits'n'pieces from A to B, whether it's a replacement microphone, a glass of water, or committee member. Our Gopher team will also be carrying out Steward duties, making sure that only convention members are in the convention areas, keeping food and drink out of the art show, etc.

Green room: The Green Room is mainly a place for programme participants to gather before their item starts. The role of the Green Room staff is to ensure that the right people for the next set of programme items are there. They will also get the participants a drink each as

thanks for being on the programme, and encouraging them to go to their item in good time. After that there's usually some quieter time, where the Green Room might deal with programme-related questions (passing them on if GR staff don't know the answers themselves) and chat or do jigsaws, until it's time to do it all again for the next set of items.

Newsletter: the occasional and intermittent at-con publication that carries programme changes, restaurant recommendations and scurrilous rumour and outrageous libel (as long as it's funny...) We need editors to feverishly pound away at collecting the reports and getting each issue out. We also need photographers, who will be directed by the newsletter editors to take photographs of key events during the convention. Ops: the beating heart of the convention. Ensuring that the programme is running according to schedule, getting programme changes out to the members, finding missing panellists, etc.

Programme: Lots of work before the convention actually starts, to ensure that there's an excellent and exciting programme for everyone involved. And then making sure that everyone on it knows where they need to be, and when. Dealing with the inevitable last-minute changes.

Publicity Odyssey needs people who can help get publicity out to all potential members. This includes taking flyers and posters to local specialist book and comics shops, libraries, SF fan groups, other conventions, comic marts and anywhere else where the fans of tomorrow can be found. If you can print them off, we will supply electronic format versions of the flyers and posters, and if you can't print them yourselves, we'll send you as many as you need! Please get in touch if you can help.

Registration: Making sure that everyone who turns up gets their badge, README and related stuff in an orderly fashion, signing up the walk-in membership, and so on.

Tech: Lights, sound, and possibly action, too. The tech crew are responsible for the microphones, mixing desks, cabling, projectors, and so on that are used during the main hall events such as the opening and closing ceremonies and the masquerade. They also supply tech facilities as required to the other programme rooms.

HOW TO VOLUNTEER

First - join the convention! You can't help us out unless you're a member. Once you've joined, you can edit your details online via a webbrowser. Go to the link you were emailed and update the "Volunteer!" section.

Note: if there are several people on the booking, all sharing the same address, there'll be a separate set of checkboxes for each person Note: if you never received the email with the link, or have lost it, go to the Membership Services section to have it sent again. If you don't have web access, drop us a letter telling us what you'd like to help with. A volunteer form can be found on our website in the volunteer section if you'd rather print that off and send it in.

"BUT I'VE NEVER DONE THIS BEFORE."

Don't worry about it. If you're new to Eastercons or conventions, helping out is strongly recommended as an excellent way to get involved. There'll be people there who can show you what needs doing and how to do it, and you'll learn something new as well as having a good time.



MIKE CAREY BY KELLIE TAKENAKA

Mike Carey was born in Liverpool in 1959 and attended Oxford University before becoming a teacher, a role in which he continued for fifteen years before becoming a full time writer. His first comic, Aquarius, appeared in the 1980's under the Trident imprint, which had been developed by the distributor Neptune. His subsequent works in the 1990's included comics for Malibu's Rock-It Comics division, 2000 AD, and Caliber, the latter of which brought him to the attention of editor Alisa Kwitney at DC's Vertigo imprint.

Mike's work for Vertigo included the long running series Lucifer, a stint on the iconic Hellblazer, the recent Crossing Midnight, and several wonderful miniseries, including a nine issue adaptation of Neil Gaiman's novel Neverwhere. He's also done extensive work for Marvel comics, as a writer for Ultimate Fantastic Four and X-Men, the latter of which earned him the nod as Keith Dallas' "Favourite Marvel Writer" of 2008 on Comics Bulletin. More recently, Mike has published a series of novels set in a millenarian London featuring the musical exorcist Felix Castor, and he has a screenplay, Frost Flowers, currently in development. He also co-authored a graphic novel, Confessions of a Blabbermouth, with his daughter Louise Carey, for DC's Minx imprint.

Mike's work in comics is noted for its consistent high quality, excellent dialogue, and respect for continuity and character history, no matter what universe he's currently working in. Many of his works evidence a thoughtful approach to the complex concepts of established religion, personal identity and free will, most visible in Lucifer and his run on Hellblazer, and are also notable for their strong, compelling female characters – which can be a rarity in comics!

A resident of London, where he lives with his wife Lin, three children, and family cat, Tasha, Mike has been a regular guest at the London and Bristol Comic Expos, and was most recently a guest at the Leeds Sequential Art Festival in November 2008, where he taught a Masterclass in Comic Book Dialogue.

IAIN M BANKS BY MICHAEL O'TOOLE

There's a mystery at the heart of an Iain M Banks story. You're never on firm footing, right up until the end, and even knowing that there's a twist doesn't often help. Of course, sometimes you may not even want to work out what's going on. Frankly, Against a Dark Background, or even more so, his Song of Stone (as Iain Banks) were works of more than usual bleakness that have haunted me for years after.

Still, is he the best sci-fi writer of his generation?

Because that darkness is just one part of an overall storytelling ability that's rare, rich and strange. Banks delivers on plot, character, scene, all put together in a near-seamless fashion. It's not enough, he seems to be telling the 'big concept' sci-fi writers amongst us, to dream up these tales of wonder – it's got to be well written too...It's a dictum that applies just as much to his 'mainstream' books (as lain Banks) as it does to the lain 'M' Banks that writes such compelling science fiction.

Each book feels fresh, working as a powerful reminder that there's a seriously inventive mind at work invested, as the aforementioned William Gibson said, with a certain 'gnarly energy'. It's an energy that comes as much in person as it does on the page. After listening, you don't feel much wonder at how anyone could have written so many quality words in a row. It's that he can type as fast as he thinks.

Banks' characters often come from the Culture, a galaxy-spanning civilisation based as often on massive Al-controlled starships as it is on planets. The inhabitants live in what we might call a post-scarcity world, where living for pleasure seems to be the main occupation. Is it a paradise? It would seem so, but I sometimes wonder what Banks would say about that...

Every once in a while the cute and fluffy bunnies of the Culture come across the harsh reality of the rest of the universe. It's in that rub, where the seemingly infallible brains of the Culture, and their all-too-fallible agents, meet the rest of the galaxy that some of Banks' most

compelling works are set. For those familiar with Banks, I'm pleased to make your acquaintance. And for those just setting out to read Banks, I honestly would say I envy you.

Of course, the above is only a short, all-too-worthy introduction. For another side, Banks has also written a non-fiction book on the joys of whisky...and did we mention that there is a panel at Odyssey devoted to appreciating that particular drink? Oddly enough, Banks has agreed to be on it...
