BREAKFAST Breakfast times are 7.30 am to 10.30 am each morning. Please note that **VOUCHERS** will be issued with your key card which are **ONLY** to be used for breakfast. HOT FOOD Cheap hot food will be available in the Lounge and Restaurant on Friday from 6.00 pm to 7.00 pm and from 11.00 pm until Midnight in the Lounge only. TEA AND COFFEE Will be available at all times until 1.00 am either from the lounge or bar.

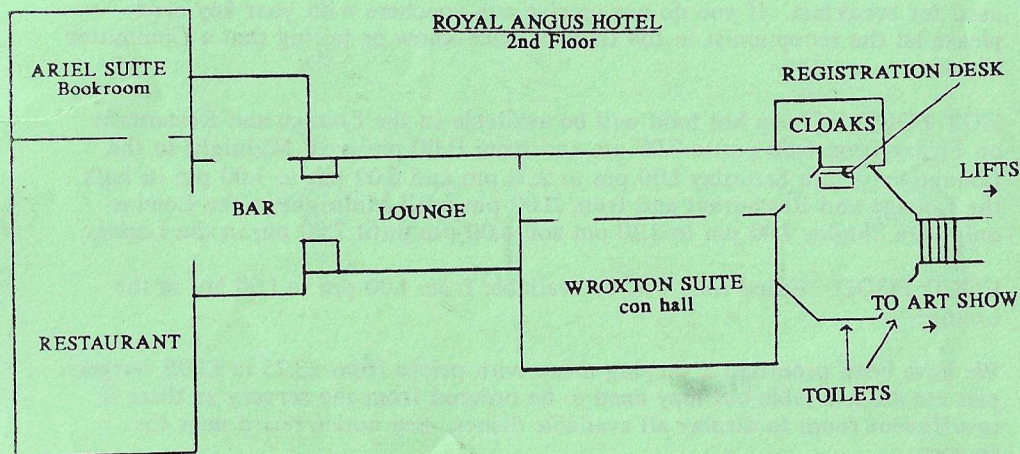
RESTAURANT Opening times 12.00 noon until 2.30 for lunch and 7.00 pm until last orders at 10.00 pm (9.30 on Sunday). On Sunday there will be a 3-course carvery available for £13.50 and a set menu Sunday Lunch for £10.

BAR Whimsey's Bar will be open from 10.00 am until 4.00 pm (with sufficient demand) for residents and 10.00 am until 2.00 am for non residents.

BOOZE The Hotel is unfortunately not able to cope with real ale but there will be Gillespies Malt Stout and Theakstons Best Bitter available and at last years prices! So there is absolutely **NO EXCUSE** not to drink the bar dry.

CAR PARKING Each resident should be issued with a voucher which will allow a discount of £1.90 per day off the fees in the attached NCP car park. Rates are 2 hrs £2.00, 3 hrs £3.00, 4 hrs £3.90, 6 hrs £5.00, 9 hrs £6.00, 12 hrs £6.80, 24 hrs £7.50. The night rate 6pm - 9 am £2.90. However if you park your vehicle in the car park after 6.00 pm and remove it from the car park before 9.00 am then the car parking is free.

DIRE WARNINGS Remember the Hotel is in the business of providing rooms, booze and food with a view to making a profit, they will not take too kindly therefore to anyone trying to usurp their business by either kipping out in unpaid-for rooms and bringing from outside either food or booze.
