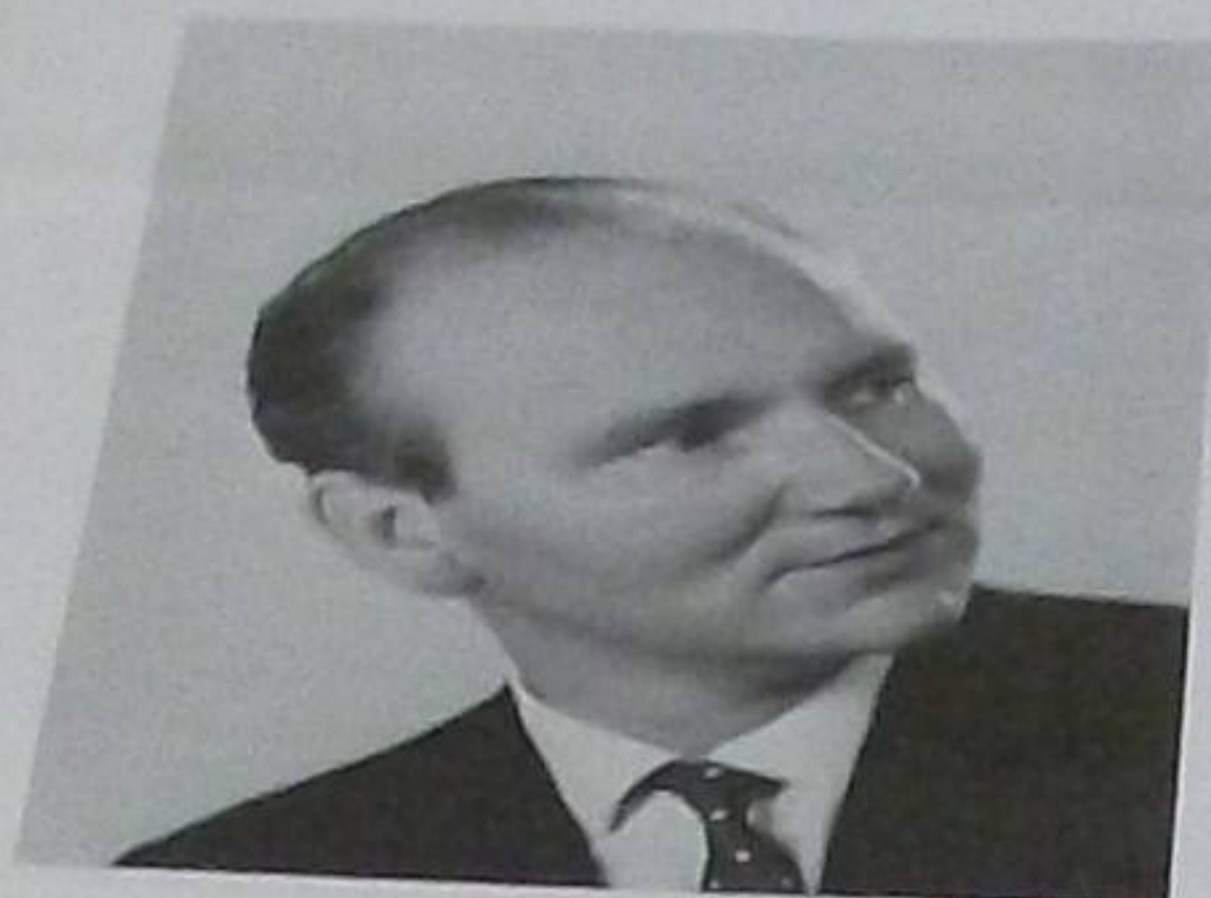




DAN MORGAN IS NAMED AS GUEST OF HONOUR

The committee is pleased to announce that Dan Morgan will be Guest of Honour at NOVACON 5. Dan has been writing SF mainly short stories, for over 20 years yet this will be the first time he has been Guest of Honour at any convention. He is the author of 11 science fiction novels, three of which were written in collaboration with the late John Kippax, plus a highly successful book on guitar playing. His novels include THE NEW MINDS, INSIDE, THE RICHEST CORPSE IN SHOW BUSINESS, HIGH DESTINY and A THUNDER OF STARS. During most of each year he runs the family tailoring business in Spalding, Lincoln, but for a few months in each year he spends with his wife and daughter in Almeria, Spain, where he spends the time writing while George soaks up the sun and obtains a tan that is so dark, traces are still left the year after! His hobbies are skin diving, fish watching and playing the guitar - jazz, classical and flamenco - and he likes wine, good food and good conversation. We feel sure that the last three items alone will make Dan Morgan an excellent Guest of Honour.

New books

We understand that Dan has completed and sold the fourth book in the 'Mind' series - the previous three books being THE NEW MINDS, THE SEVERAL MINDS and THE MIND TRAP. This will be published by Corgi late in 1975 - hopefully in time for NOVACON 5. Dan will again be off to Spain this year where if all goes well he will be writing the fifth book in the 'Venturer 12' series.

NEW HOTEL FOR NOVACON 5!

NOVACON, the annual science fiction convention sponsored by the Birmingham SF Group will take place this year at the Royal Angus Hotel, Birmingham. This will be the fifth NOVACON. After being held for four consecutive years at the Imperial Centre Hotel it was felt that there was need for a change mainly due to the fact that we have outgrown the old Imperial. NOVACON along with the annual Easter Convention gets bigger each year and a more spacious hotel is required. At the end of NOVACON 4, we promised you that we would look for an alternative hotel. This proved to be a considerably more difficult task than anticipated. Hotels in Birmingham are not built for big functions and those that are, have features on one side and that side is the main passage-way to and from the hotel is open along outside of Birmingham where one hotel quoted us rates of £11.50 per night single subject to increases between now and November. Eventually we looked at the Royal Angus and immediately realised that this was the hotel for NOVACON 5.

The Royal Angus, one of Birmingham's newer and more luxurious hotels, was opened in 1970. It accommodates 222 guests and all bedrooms have their own bathroom, shower, radio and television. A hotel brochure is enclosed with this Progress Report so that you can see for yourselves the excellent facilities that the hotel provides. We are sure that those travelling by car will welcome the fact that the hotel is on one of the main roads through the city centre as the hotel is on one of the main roads from 'Spaghetti Junction' to the city centre. Also, the hotel has its own car park, connected to the hotel by a covered footbridge.

Room rates

Room rates at the Royal Angus will be £5.25 a night for a single room and £4.50 a night per person occupying a double or twin-bedded room. These rates include continental breakfast, VAT and Service Charge. Full English breakfast will be available to convention members at an extra 60p. These rates are final and not subject to any increases that will occur between now and November.

Dates

After the controversy caused by last year's break in tradition, NOVACON 5 will be held in the official month of November. It will commence on the evening of Friday November 7th and continue through to Sunday afternoon on the 9th.
