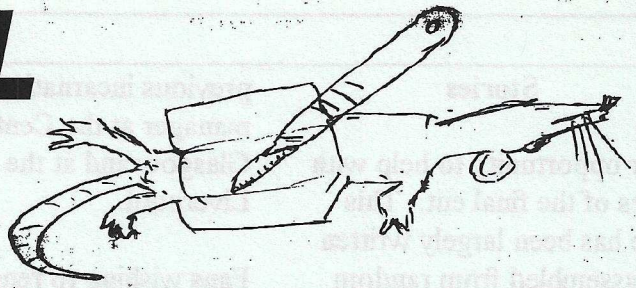

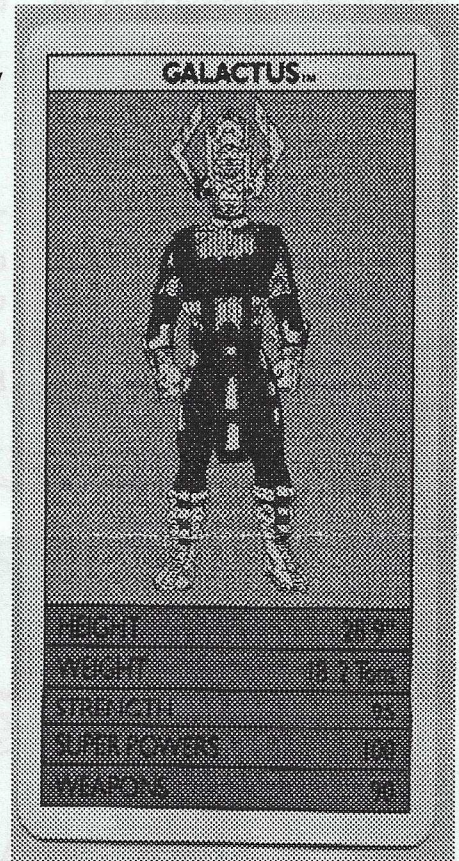
Top Trumps #2

An old friend

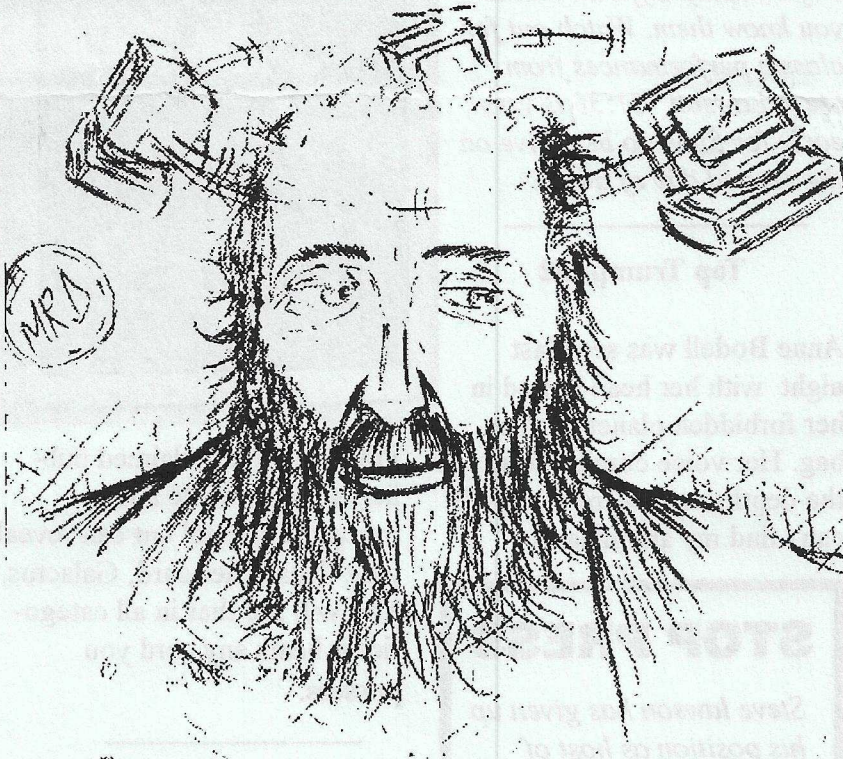
It turns out that the general manager of the hotel is an old friend of fandom. He has in

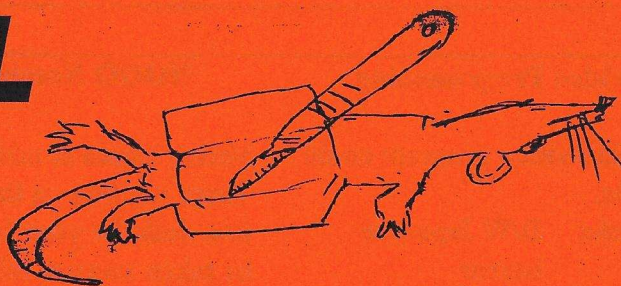

Shopping Trip

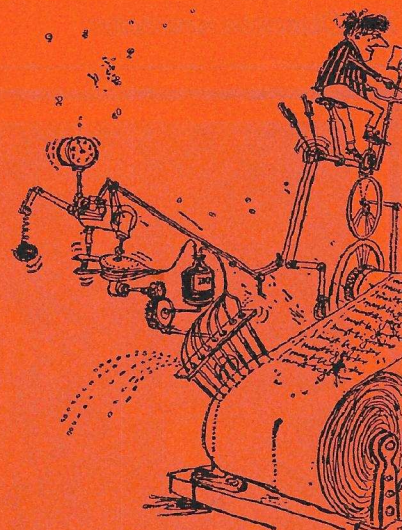
A reminder for those wanting to go shopping at MeadowHall the program book says to meet at 11:00 in the hotel Lobby.

NOGO Awards

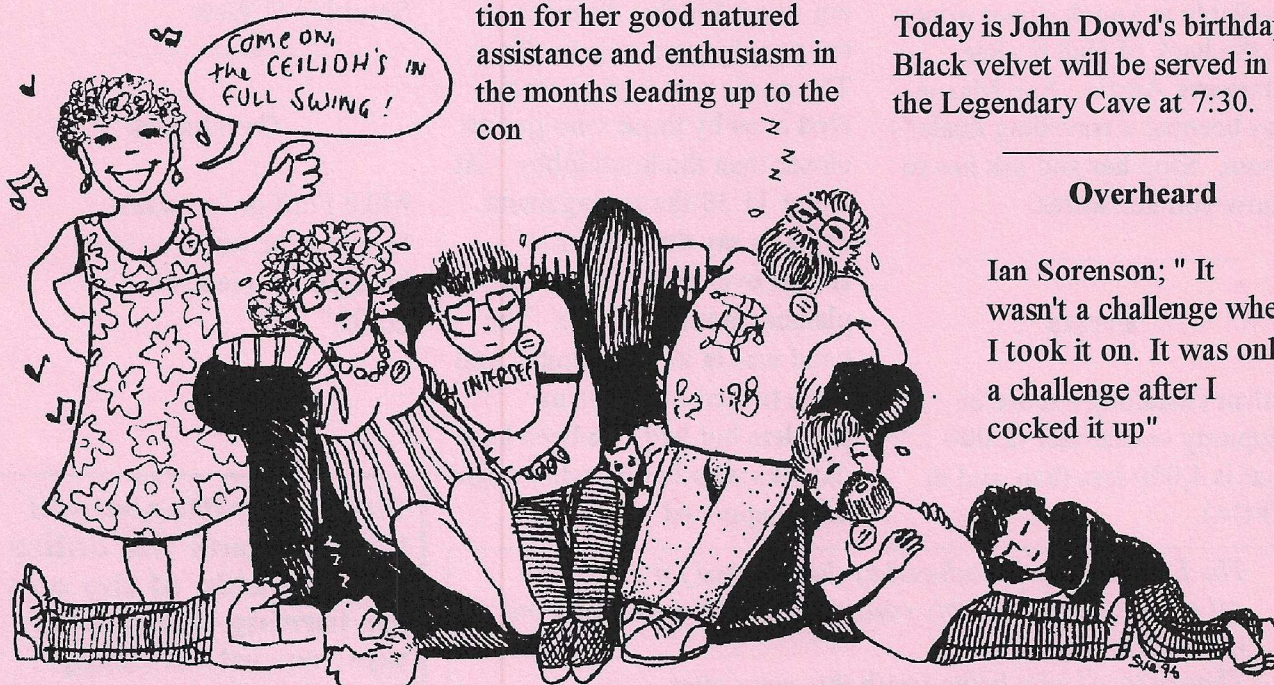
