Talking To The Stars.

Do you think that they will think that his arm is permanently stuck in that position?

An examination and critique of the words and pictures intended to introduce the human race.

Do we want to be alone?

Would we welcome contact with extra-terrestrials if it occurred?

Mass Communications.

How we carried the news from Ghent to Aix.

A history of long distance communications. Discussion of how they work and what they did to change society.

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The Queen vs. the Internet.

As the Internet attracts attention from the rest of society can—and should—clashes be avoided?

Messages from Starfleet: FTL communications from tachyons to sovereignty.

An illustrated discussion of the mechanisms adopted to provide instantaneous communications in SF.

Language, Truth and Logic.

Nation can't speak peace unto nation. Is communication possible?

Are there Universal Truths?

What constants can be relied on in conversations with the unknown?

Turing, Voight-Kampff and other tests.

A critical language for comics.

How can we discuss a medium that relies on the interaction between pictures and words when even the creators cannot agree on where the primacy lies?

Speaking In Tongues.

International languages: Latin, Pidgin, Esperanto and Klingon.

A discussion on how languages become international, a review of artificial attempts to build new ones and a consideration of a joke that may yet become one.

Raising the Dead: Learning ancient languages.

The methods by which a language can live beyond its native speakers.

Translation: A threat to native literature.

The temptation of European authors to become full time translators rather than producers of original works.

A look at the problems of translating works full of invented words.

Adaptation: Preserving the message beyond the medium.

Identifying the essence of a story when changing the medium.

Adaptation: The medium IS the message.

Discussing the ways by which the strengths of various media can be used to fill out the weaknesses of others.

Future Slang—inventing a new language.

How does one produce an idiom that can seem alien yet remain comprehensible?
