

Combining Eric's music writing skills (he's a founding member of February Album Writing Month) with Jen's improv comedy skills, they create songs about their nerdy passions with a ton of heart and a side of snark.

The Faithful Sidekicks have won multiple Pegasus Awards, including Best Performer in 2021 and they were inducted into The Filk Hall of Fame in 2024. They have been delighting audiences at conventions, clubs, and coffeehouses around the US, Canada and even Germany since 2014. MICHAEL BUSCH

FEATURED ASTRONOMER



Michael W. Busch received his BS in physics and astronomy at the University of Minnesota in 2005 and his PhD in planetary science at Caltech in 2010. He was a postdoc at UCLA and the National Radio Astronomy Observatory before starting as a research scientist at the SETI Institute in September 2013. He primarily studies near-Earth asteroids, using radio and radar techniques, with particular interests in the shapes, spin states, internal structures, and histories of individual objects - especially spacecraft mission targets and potential Earth impactors. He

also has side projects on martian dust storms and on SETI message design. The latter focuses on the currently-theoretical question of making a message readily intelligible to any alien astronomers who may see it.







CODE OF CONDUCT

Minn-stf acknowledges that interpersonal relationships are complex and not everyone likes everyone else, and not everyone agrees with everyone else.

Disagreements, friction, and vigorous debate are expected. However, interactions that become hostile or coercive do not have any part in a healthy social environment and Mnstf commits to addressing problem behaviors.

Harassment is difficult to define, and attempts at an exact definition are subject to rules-lawyering, so we won't attempt to do that.

However, repeated unwelcome behaviors are most likely to be construed as harassment. If someone asks you not to touch them, not to talk to them, or not to refer to them in a way that they find objectionable, and you persist in doing so, you may be harassing them. Actions that are sufficiently egregious (assault, truly hateful language, and comparable actions) fall under this policy, even if only one occurrence has been noted.

In the end, harassment is judged primarily by the person who feels harassed, and actions are more important than intent.

If someone tells you to stop something they perceive as harassing behavior, stop right away. If you tell someone to stop something you see as harassing behavior and they don't, you may tell us. If you don't feel comfortable telling someone to stop harassing behavior, you may also tell us. We want to make sure everyone is heard so that together we can make Minicon a healthy, fun, enjoyable experience for everyone.

To report violations of this code, whether or not action is desired, go to the registration desk and talk to the staff there.
