

Hotel

After a nationwide search for a suitable hotel, we've settled on the Crowne Plaza, Chester. The hotel is in the centre of Chester only a minute from the main shopping area. The city itself is in the west of England just a short drive from the border with North Wales.

The hotel has 160 rooms, all of which are to be used for members of Contemplation. The base room rate is £85/night for a standard twin/double and the hotel has agreed to make 10 of these rooms available as singles for the reduced cost of £75/night. The more luxurious Executive rooms are available at £105/night and some of these rooms are suitable for families with children. If you wish to book a single or a family room, you will need to contact the hotel by phone rather than through the website.

Room bookings for Contemplation will be handled by the hotel directly with the option either to book online or by telephone. You will be able to book your room from February 1st at 5pm through the hotlink on the convention website (see overleaf) or by calling 01244 899988, stating that the booking is for Contemplation with group reference 'con'. All bookings require a deposit of one night's charge with a minimum stay of 3 nights. Room booking will close on March 11th.

Since bookings are going direct to the hotel, we are not able to find room sharers for you, and you will need to do this for yourself. Whoever books the room needs to specify who they are sharing with (either at the time of booking or later). Only one of the sharers should book and pay the deposit, but the bill will be divided as normal.

The best that we will be able to do if we receive a sharing request from you is to post it on the Eastercon Yahoo group bounce or the Eastercon2007 Livejournal (links to both are on the convention website). A member list will be published on the website shortly to enable you to find others who are attending.

Dealers' Room

This is the Prince of Wales Suite, a room 45ft by 40ft., which can accommodate 43 tables. Although the room has seven (yes, seven) doors, the recent site visit confirmed that only four (or at a pinch two) doors need to be kept unobstructed.

Tables are 6ft x 2ft 6in and the maximum bookable by any dealer (initially), is three tables. Prices are: One table — £25; two tables — £60; three tables — £100. Invoices will be made out for full payment at the convention.

I know that several potential dealers have indicated that they are interested in taking tables, but as of now NO confirmed bookings have been made, only “expressions of interest”.
