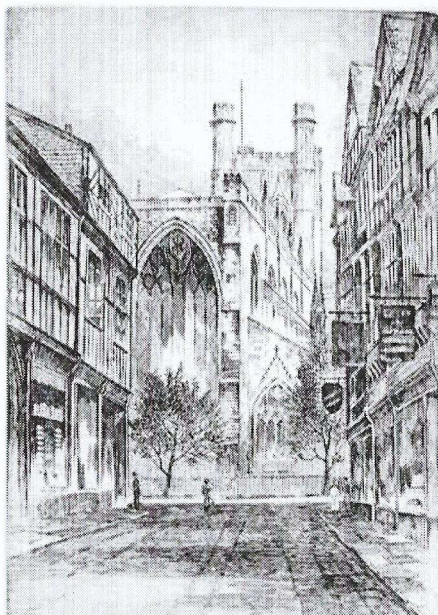

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About Chester

Chester is full of shops, restaurants, pubs and other great places to visit. The following list is just a sample to help you get started. The advantage of a city-centre convention hotel is that there is just so much to do within walking distance of the hotel (but do come back and spend money in the hotel bars otherwise we'll end up having to pay for the function space!)

Our thanks to Paul & Judie von der Fecht who have spent hours tracking down most of this information and typing it in!

Other information sourced from various online restaurant review sites including Chester @ Large (<http://www.clarence.ndirect.co.uk/large/nc.htm>) who say this about Chester

The main shopping area is along the axes of Watergate Street, Eastgate Street, Foregate Street, Northgate Street and Bridge Street. Much of this area features Chester's unique rows - first floor level galleries with a second tier of shop fronts above the street level ones. Restaurants and bars are also concentrated in this area with a few more strung down Lower Bridge Street. Most restaurants and bars are very busy after eight o'clock. It is wise to book where restaurants allow (not all do). Bars nearly all have bouncers on the door who may turn you away for breaking various arbitrary dress codes such as wearing trainers or jeans. Bon appetit and cheers!

Banks

The nearest cash points to the Hotel are at Barclays Bank on Northgate Street next to the Cathedral. A number of banks, (NatWest, Lloyds TSB, HSBC, RBS), are sited on Eastgate Street.

Tourist Attractions

Aside from the obvious (Roman stuff and the Cathedral) ... you should start at the Tourist Information Centre next to the Town Hall. On Saturdays at 7.30pm a Ghosthunter guided tour sets out from here. (Tickets from the Centre or the nearby Shropshire Arms pub).

For anyone interested in the history of Chester, there is the animated timeline at the Grosvenor Museum on Grosvenor Street, and the Dewa Experience on Pierpoint Lane off Upper Bridge Street. Across from the Grosvenor Museum is Chester Military Museum on Castle Street.

Anyone with violent impulses to unleash should try Chester Quasar, a laser tag emporium on Volunteer Street, just off Pepper Street and around the corner from habitat.

Further afield ...

The Spaceport on the banks of the Mersey can be found at www.spaceport.org.uk As well as the attractions of the Spaceport itself, a combined ticket covers a round trip on the Mersey ferry as well. As well as Chester Zoo, one of the finest in the country, there is also the Blue Planet Aquarium www.blueplanetaquarium.com close to Ellesmere Port.

Next to the Blue Planet is the MacArthur Glenn Outlet Village, and the Coliseum Retail Centre with a multi-screen Vue cinema and a large branch of Borders bookstore.

And then there's Jodrell Bank less than 30 miles away.

Chemists, medical centre, dentists and hospital A&E

There is a branch of Boots the Chemist at the exit of the Forum Mall on to Northgate Street. Turn right from Boots and there is a branch of Superdrug a short way down Northgate on the left. Turn left from Boots and head towards the roundabout on the Inner Ring Road and there is a dental practice, medical centre, and dispensing Chemist that is open from 9am until 10pm, including Bank Holidays.

If anything more serious is required, the nearest hospital is the Countess of Chester on Liverpool Road, (the A5116). It is five minutes away by car, and has an A&E department.

Shopping

The Forum Shopping Mall directly out of the Hotel entrance on the Ground floor is open from 9 to 5.30 Monday to Saturday and 11 to 5 on Sunday. When this is closed the easiest route to the main streets is to exit via the Lower Ground floor at street level and either turn right towards Watergate Street, or up the road slightly to the right of the entrance, past the Roman Strongroom.

The Market Hall is open from 8 to 5.30 Monday to Saturday. There is a stall selling trading cards, action figures and the like, easily spotted by the Legolas and Little Britain standees on top. W H Smith is close to the Eastgate Clock on the city wall, and has the very aromatic Lush diagonally across from it. Passing from Eastgate to Foregate Street there is a large branch of Boots, if the one closer to the Hotel does not have what is needed.

Continuing out of Chester past the Express by Holiday Inn on Sealand Road brings you to the Greyhound Retail Park, with B&Q, PC World and Staples, as well as the usual retail outlets and another cinema.

Churches, places of worship etc.

(Apologies if we've left off your particular place of worship, please ask at the hotel or Tourist Information office, or come to Registration and we'll try to find out)

As well as the Cathedral, there is St Peter's Ecumenical Centre, open from 10 to 3.30. There is a Quaker Meeting House on Frodsham Street, and a Christian Science Bookshop and Reading room off lower Bridge Street. (It is signposted from St Olave's Church). There is a Presbyterian Church on St John Street, along from the main Post Office.

Libraries, Cybercafes and Bookshops

The library is Northgate, next to the Town Hall.

There is a cyber café on Watergate Street. It is directly ahead of you as you walk from the Hotel. They are open 10 until 7 on Saturday and 11 until 5 on Sunday. They have a '£10 for all day' rate, plus others for shorter spans, and intend to be open over Easter.

Unfortunately the excellent bookshop, 'Bookland' that is shown on the Chester Tourist photo guide closed some years ago. There is a branch of The Works, a clearance and remainder shop opposite Superdrug on Northgate, with W H Smith on Eastgate very close to the Clock, and Waterstone's on Eastgate Row, along from the large department store Brown's of Chester. There is also a very crowded shop selling comics, magazines and action figures on Brook Street. On the corner of Watergate St (between the Crowne Plaza and the Holiday Inn) is Stothert Old Books. If you walk along Northgate Street past the Library and cinema towards the walls and take the steps up the walls on the right-hand side, there are two bookshops at the top. The walk around the city on the walls can be completed with ease within an hour. On St Werburgh Street, which curves past the Cathedral, there is a Society for the Promotion of Christian Knowledge bookshop.

Arts & Crafts, Music, Electronics and Charity Shops

As well as the haberdashery stalls at the Market, there is the Arts and Crafts Studio on Upper Bridge Street Row, above Past Times, and the Bead Shop on Frodsham Street selling beads, patches and jewellery findings.

Further up the row on Upper Bridge Street from the Arts and Crafts Studio is Kites Aloft - The Writing Place, with a range of designer cards, papers, T-Shirts and fun stuff.

Frodsham Street also has Oxfam and at least two other charity shops, and a large branch of Tesco.

On Watergate Street is the Art Shop, selling all manner of art and drawing supplies.

There is a music stall in the Market Hall, as well as Back Alley Music on Northgate St.

Opposite Pizza Hut on Foregate St is Partners, another source of stationery and office supplies.

As well as a Maplin's in Boughton (and the PC World mentioned above), closer to the convention there is a branch of Radio Shack, on Northgate St.

Parking

Don't forget that parking at the Hotel rate of £7.50 per day is available at the Princess Street 24 Hour Car Park with the scratchcard obtained from the Hotel. This should help to spread the burden from the Crowne Plaza car park, which is fairly small (less than 80 spaces for 160 rooms!)

Trinity Street (Next to hotel): Short stay pay & display. £1.50 for up to 1.5 hours, £12.00 for over three hours. £2.00 for overnight parking from 5pm until 9.30am

Princess Street (In front of and underneath Hotel and Trinity St car park): Longer stay pay & display. Up to four hours free for Disabled badge holders. £2.70 for up to two hours, £8.00 for over six hours and again £2.00 for overnight. **NB.** This car park is locked between 11.30pm and 7am.

Gorse Stacks: Same rates as Princess Street, except only £1.50 for overnight parking.

NB. All the car parks, including the Crowne Plaza, have a two metre maximum headroom.

Food

There is an abundance of pubs in Chester, all serving food. There is a Subway sandwich shop opposite the Odeon cinema on Northgate St, plus two more sandwich shops further along the street. There is a second Subway on Foregate St, very close to Games Workshop. Plus there are several bakeries that sell sandwiches and snacks on Watergate, Northgate and Bridge Streets. There are McDonalds, Burger King and all the usual fast food places in the town centre.

And then there are many dozens of restaurants from the cheap to the expensive and gourmet.

Combining the recommendations of a few online sites ... and remember, CH1 is close to the hotel, any other postcode and you should check on a map to see how far away it is.

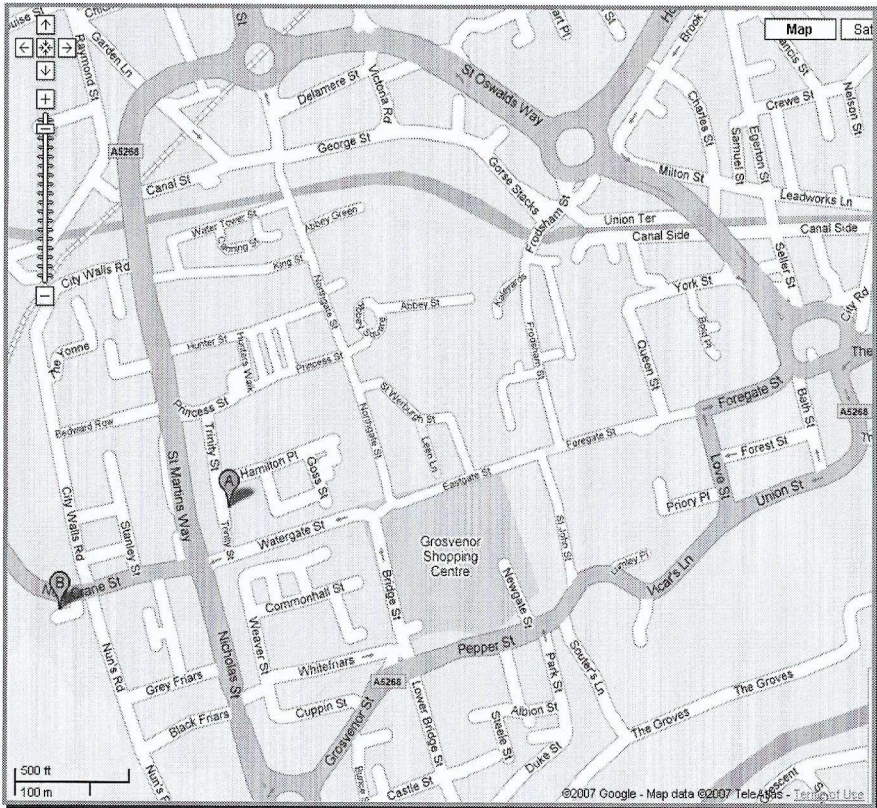
