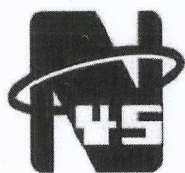

There are known knowns, known unknowns, and unknown unknowns and we hope some of those unknown unknowns will become known knowns through this ReadMe. Or it might just drive you to the bar for more beer – either way we're happy!

Hotel Check In/Out Times & WiFi

Hotel check in time is 14:00 and check out is 12:00

For wireless network access, please connect to the "ParkInn_Guest" Network.

1. Open your webbrowser
2. Choose the 'Meeting Delegate' option on the left hand side
3. Select your meeting/company name on the displayed list - Either Dysprosium or Eastercon (we think)
4. Enter *meet/2015* and click connect
5. Now you have internet access!

Parking

We have arranged parking in both the hotel car park and the NCP behind the hotel at £5 per vehicle per day. Do not use the machines in either car park to pay for your parking. In the hotel car park, register your licence plate at Reception and either pay or charge to your room. In the NCP, take your ticket to the attendant and they will take payment manually. Note that you can leave and re-enter the hotel car park during your stay without being charged for separate parking sessions. But you cannot do this in the NCP, so please plan your parking accordingly. Although both car parks are large, both operate park-and-fly services, so both will be busy.

Accessible Parking

There are approximately 8 disabled bays at the front of the hotel. However, these fill up very quickly. In the White Car Park outside the Aviator entrance there are a further two disabled bays. There are another couple at the flight crew entrance, but it should be noted that the wheelchair access to the flight crew entrance is potentially hazardous and a wheelchair user should not be expected to descend it unaided.

Registration Opening times

5pm to 8pm on Thursday

10am to 6pm on Friday

9am to 5pm on Saturday & Sunday

9am to 12pm on Monday

When the desk is closed, please report to Ops for registration matters. Please do not attempt to access the convention without having gone through some form of registration process.

Volunteering and GROaTs

This convention is made by you in so many ways. Everyone attending the convention has given freely of their time to get this far. However, there are many jobs still to do and you can help the convention to run smoothly all the way through to Tuesday morning.

In exchange for volunteering you will receive GROaTs (Gopher Reward Tokens) which you can exchange for food or drink in the hotel. You can use them as part-payment towards your room and most of the dealers will accept them in exchange for goods. Please note that you will not receive change. So, for example, if you buy a sandwich for £5 and you present 6 Groats, you'll not receive 1 Groat (or £1) in change. In that situation it would be better to present 4 Groats and

£1 of coin of the realm as top-up. GROaTs have no monetary value and cannot be exchanged for cash. They can be exchanged until 2am on Tuesday morning.

Groats come in ½, 1, 2, 5 and 10 denominations.

If, over the course of the convention, you complete 20 or more hours of volunteering, you will also receive a Dysprosium Eastercon Assemble T-shirt as our thanks. So, the sooner you volunteer, the sooner you'll get that t-shirt.

Behaviour, dress etc. in the hotel

We've said it before (in PR2 specifically) but we'll say it again - please do note that shoes must be worn in all public areas of the hotel unless you have specifically obtained permission in advance, and we do not have all rooms all nights so there may be non-convention members around the public areas. Respect the furniture as it belongs to the hotel and we will be liable for damage by members. It is the policy of the hotel to ban all smoking in all areas including e-cigarettes and all forms of visible pseudo-smoking. The smokers' area is outside the hotel, away from the entrance doors benches and tables. Please try and avoid smoking next to the doors to be courteous to other people, and please do not use the flight crew exit at the rear of the hotel as we have been asked specifically to not use that area. Plus NO DRONES! We're at an airport so please act accordingly.

Time of Breakfast in Con Hotel

It's the question everyone asks whenever they check in to a hotel - what time is breakfast please? Breakfast is from 9.00-11.00 daily.

If you aren't a Park Inn resident we've arranged for inexpensive breakfast rolls to be available on site. See below for prices.

Times of bar opening/closing and food serving hours

The real ale and cider bar and lounge bar will be open from 10:00am to 02:00am (and they remain open even later, if required but at 02:00am they will need a 30 minute end of day close and during this time the bar will be closed)

The hotel will be offering food at a range of times and prices throughout the day.

09.00-11.00: Breakfast rolls with a vegetarian option £4 each. These are available to everyone and are in addition to the hotel breakfast available for those staying at the Park Inn.

12.30-15.00: Lunch will be available from 12:30 – 15:00 in Bravo Bravo restaurant (3-course buffet £15 per person; children's size £5.95), the lounge area (sandwiches & paninis from £5), and the Aviator Suite (burgers and hot dogs from £5).

18.00-21.30: Dinner will be available in the Bravo Bravo restaurant (3-course buffet £18 per person – children's size £6.95), the lounge area (sandwiches & paninis from £5), and the Aviator Suite (burgers and hot dogs from £5).

Midnight to midnight thirty: Bacon rolls, Bacon and egg rolls or vegetarian option £4 each. Please make an effort to buy a voucher for this earlier in the evening so that Chef has an idea of how many to provide. But he'll make more than necessary, so don't feel guilty if you get a late attack of the munchies.

To minimise the amount of cash they have to handle, the hotel will be selling vouchers for all meals and the midnight snacks. If you would like to speed up the queues, please go to Hotel Reception where there will be a desk for you to purchase the vouchers you might need. You can pay cash or credit/debit card, or charge it to your room. The various food locations will also take cash, but there will be no card or room charge payments.

Coloured Pegs & What They Mean

At times around the convention you may observe someone wearing a mini coloured peg. We'll be implementing a system this year for folks who sometimes find interaction with other people

overwhelming.

Yellow, purple and red clips will be available at the registration desk. You can collect these at any time you like and keep them until you need them. When you need to use them, just clip them to your badge pouch, or anywhere clearly visible to other people.

This system is based on systems used at Autistic spaces and conferences, Nine Worlds and other conventions.

The clips are used to indicate the following:

Yellow: "I only want to talk to people I know right now. If we've met before, it's okay to talk to me."

Purple: "I would like to talk to new people but find it difficult to initiate conversation. Please say hello!"

Red: "I'd prefer not to talk with anyone right now. If I start a conversation with you, it's okay to talk to me."

Please respect other attendees' communication preferences and do not talk to them if they are wearing a clip which indicates that they do not want to be disturbed.

Lastly, it's okay if you make a genuine mistake because you didn't know - like if you didn't see someone's badge or clip, or forgot what it meant. Just make sure to keep an eye out for next time.

Ops Opening times & How to Report Lost/Stolen Property

Ops will be open from 12:00 to 24:00 Friday, 09:00 to 24:00 Saturday and Sunday, and 09:00 to 17:00 on Monday with someone on call overnight and a phone number posted at Ops that can be used to contact someone. No matter when something happens, day or night, support will absolutely be available, so please do not hesitate to go to at Ops anytime. If you are reporting lost or stolen property, we will need to involve the hotel and take information so please be understanding if it takes a few minutes to record all details.

If you have found something, please bring it to Ops and we will handle it from there.

How to Report Harassment

If you are being harassed, or you notice that someone else is being harassed, or you have any other concerns, please contact Ops immediately. The Ops Room will be found at the front entrance of the Orbiter Suite at the front of the hotel.

REMINDER!

If you take medication set a reminder on your phone each day to remind you to take it. There will be tap water available at all the food points, the real ale bar and the lounge bar at the front of the hotel. If none of these places can help you, please go to Ops for more assistance. Please be responsible and do not take medication with alcohol.

The 5-2-1 Rule

FIVE hours of sleep per day, TWO meals a day, ONE shower a day.

FIVE - You need to sleep to recharge your body and your brain – plus, snoring in sessions can put off panel members, some of whom may be new. Please be respectful.

TWO - your body and your mind both need the right kind of fuel and your blood sugar et al needs to be in balance. You cannot survive on a diet of beer and vitamins - please take care of yourself.

ONE - You often cannot smell what you smell like but others can. Please be considerate and remember - your nose blindness does not exist in others. Please respect others.

Child care times

If you are a parent of a child under 12 you will probably be aware that we have a crèche and programming suitable for younger fans. Crèche staff are also available for evening baby sitting duties at an additional cost of £7.50. The crèche is running:

Monday: 09:45 – 16:30

The location of the crèche is not being kept secret, it's just we only know that it will be in a suite on the ground floor somewhere. If you have children booked into the crèche, that information will be with their badges. If you don't have children booked into the crèche, but would like to, please get in touch with Ops for more information.

Local places of worship and times of services

The Concierge located in the lobby at the front of the hotel should be able to provide you with directions to places of worship and the times of their services.

Warnings about dangerous parts of town

London is large and all of it has an element of danger. Obviously the area around the airport is patrolled more than most areas so could be considered safe but crimes such as mobile phone thefts are on the rise. Most common mobile phone thefts happen by someone stealing it out of the victim's hand while the thief is on foot, bicycle or motorbike. Leaving the hotel area is safe but some areas around the hotel are somewhat run down. After dark we always recommend having a buddy with you but it should be safe to walk to places like McDonald's and back.

Cloakroom

Regardless of which hotel you're staying at, or if you're commuting in each day, the cloakroom in the Orbiter Suite will be available for you to check your coats and bags in daily if you are commuting in. This is located immediately to the right of Registration.

Baggage Store

When you arrive at the hotel, if your room is not available immediately, you will be able to store your baggage safely. If the hotel baggage store is full, please take your bags to the Cloakroom in the Orbiter Suite where they will either be stored, or taken to another room for temporary storage.

On check-out, if you need to store bags until you leave, the same rules will apply: if the hotel baggage store is full, please take your bags to the Cloakroom in Orbiter where they will either be stored, or taken to another room for temporary storage.

Monday Fire Alarm Check

A note for anyone who'll still be in the hotel on Monday that at 17:00 there will be a 5 second fire alarm test.

The Chocolate We Chose

With so many children still being kidnapped and forced into slavery on cocoa plantations in the Ivory Coast (the largest producer of cocoa for chocolate globally) the committee wanted to take a stand against slavery and poverty wages for cocoa farmers with their chocolate choice this year. We have purchased Divine Easter eggs as prizes and we have Divine mini (5g) bars for all members should they wish to try them. We chose these instead of the usual Easter chocolate for

a number of reasons but primarily because Divine is 45% owned by the farmers who grow and farm the cocoa. Divine buys their cocoa from the Kuapa Kokoo co-operative who pay quickly and use scales that are accurate - things we take for granted but these Ghanaian farmers cannot. Divine Chocolate uses quality cocoa beans from Kuapa Kokoo to make a delicious range of chocolate products available in ten countries worldwide. As well as sharing in the profits, members of Kuapa have a say in how Divine is managed.

We would like to encourage you to taste-test the chocolate we have purchased (please be considerate to others) and consider switching your chocolatey treats to this ethical company. They also produce the only mass-market palm-oil-free caramel which they include in their dark and milk caramel bars.

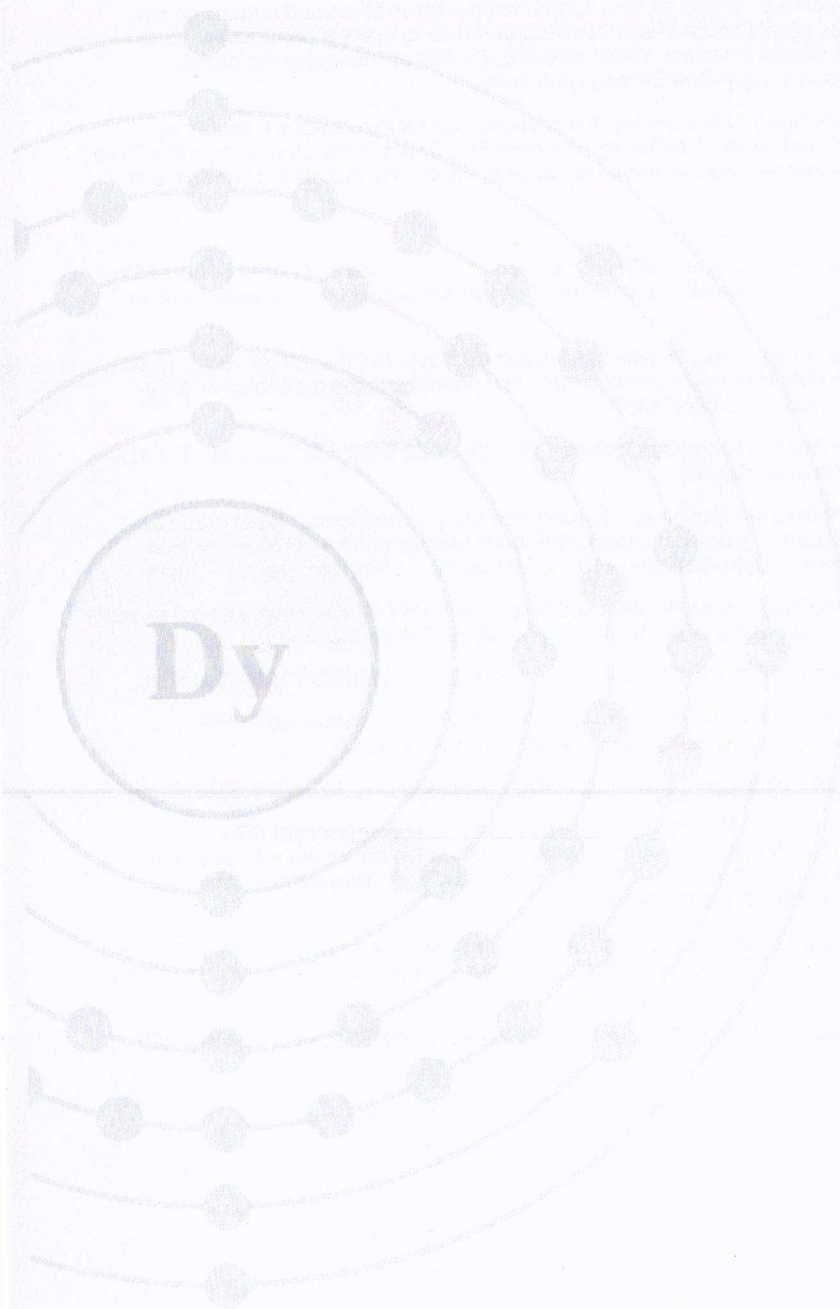

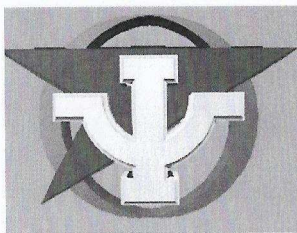

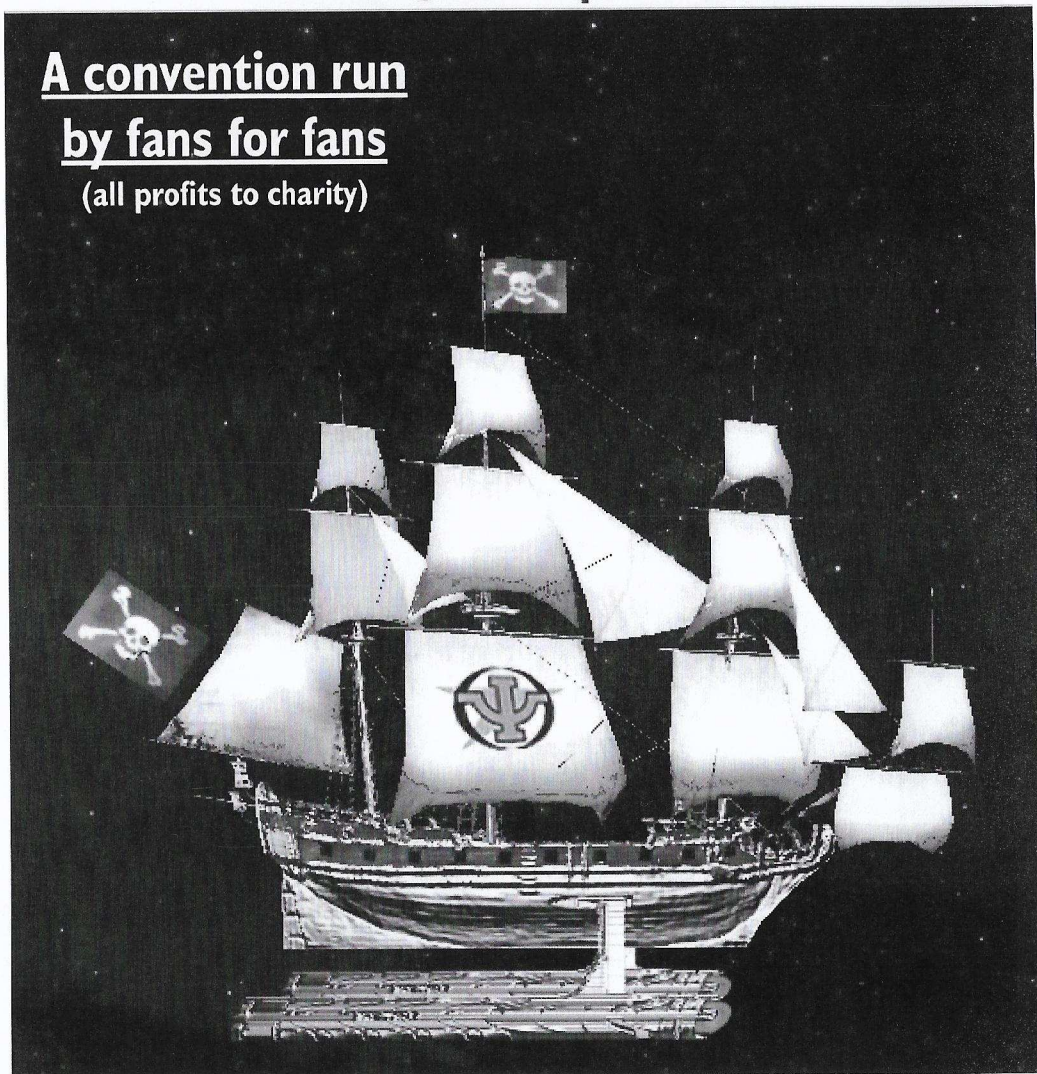
