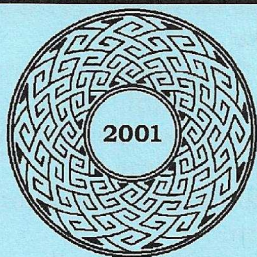

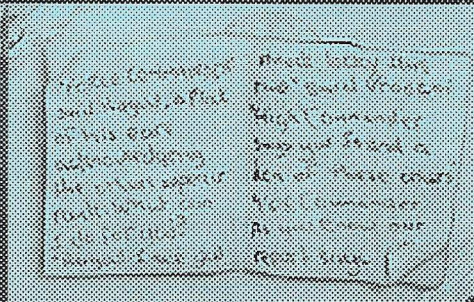
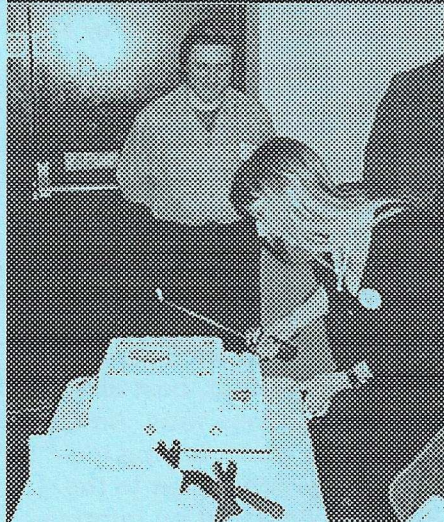
Surprised Guest

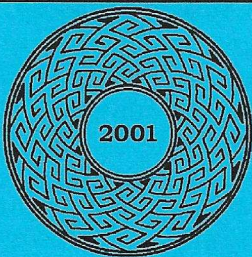
Fan Art Catalog

Lisanne Norman Interview

Chris Morgan made the interview feel like a fireside chat that all present could join in.

Lisanne started out as an artist but has always written stories. A kitten that had fallen in a river became the kernel of a series of stories featuring cat-like aliens. Lisanne found and joined ASTRA (the Association in Scotland To Research Astronautics) in Glasgow and started to learn about the scientific basis for SF.

Then she joined the Friends of Kilgore Trout, the Glasgow SF society. She consulted Jack Cohen about her aliens to ensure that they would be scientifically feasible. A family connection with Daw Books in the USA led to her first and subsequent SF novels being published.

Lisanne is also known as an active member of *The Vikings!*, a historical events re-enactment society. Lisanne's back problem restricts her somewhat but she played an active part in the re-enactment of the Battle of Hastings as an archer. Pictures of *The Vikings!* in action are now included in some children's school history books.
