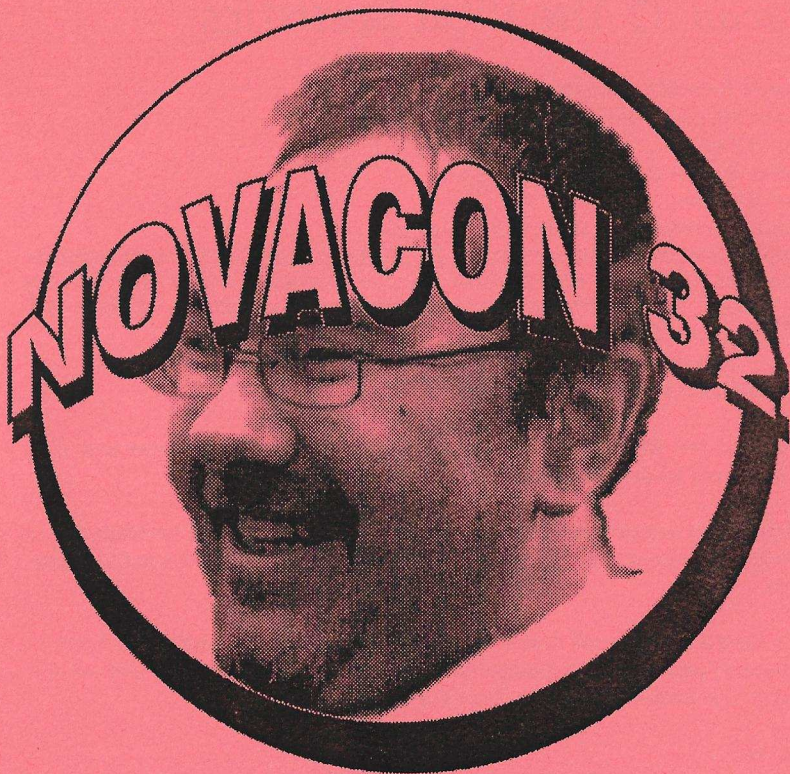

I first encountered our Guest of Honour Ian McDonald's fiction in the form of *Desolation Road* back in the late eighties and was stunned by the vigour and power of that bleak tale. I was even more surprised by the complete change of style exhibited in *King of Morning*, *Queen of Day* in the early nineties. Next I came across the disturbingly horrific *Necroville* and the savagely topical *Sacrifice of Fools*, each impressive works.... But Ian really knocked me for six with *Chaga* (and later *Kirinya*) – where you were totally enveloped in that wonderful, disturbing, sense of the utterly alien.

Finally, in 1998 I met Ian when we shared a stage at Intuition, the Eastercon that year. I was delighted to discover that he was every bit as stimulating and entertaining in person as his work seemed to indicate. A plan was hatched.... Now, a mere three years later, it has come to fruition and I'm delighted to announce that Ian McDonald has agreed to be our Guest of Honour at Novacon 32 next year!

I'm also delighted to present another strong committee this year with the welcome return of Steve Green on Programme; back again just 17 years since his last committee post (there really is *no escape*...). While after six straight years of doing the publications for Novacon I am relieved to hand the task over to Dave Hicks who will, no doubt, be ably assisted by his partner Cat Coast who reprises her role as Secretary. Back again for more punishment we also have David T. Cooper as Treasurer, Alice Lawson on Operations and Steve Lawson on Registrations.

As yet we have not confirmed a deal with a hotel, but we have pencilled in the 1st-3rd November with the Quality Hotel – if you are happy with them and they are happy with us we hope to return here. 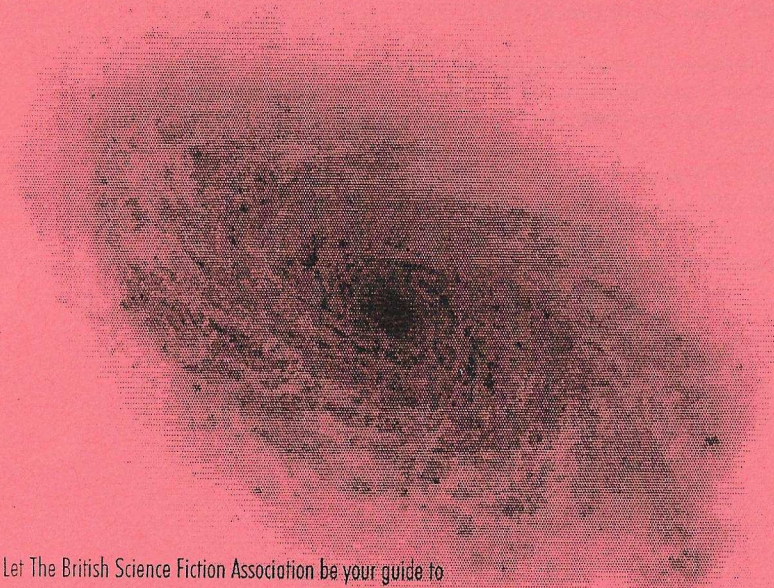
