Hotel Update

The Park Hotel now has no single rooms and no double rooms left. If any single or double rooms become available, they will be allocated on a first-come-first-served basis from the dates on the booking forms that were received. Instead of single rooms we can offer twin rooms for single occupancy (known as TBSO) with a £10 per day supplement on the normal twin room rate of £30, i.e. £33.50 per night for TBSO instead of £30 for a single. The available room types and prices (per person per night) breakdown as follows:

Single Rooms:	None available.
Double Rooms:	None available.
Twin Rooms:	Available at £23.50.
TBSO:	Available at £33.50.

If you have not sent in your Booking Form (see membership list on page 4), another is enclosed with this issue of *Dispatches*. If you wish to take TBSO, put a 1 in the 'Single Room' box on the form and write "Will accept TBSO" in the line left for 'Other (please specify)'. We can still find sharers for those people who want them.

In summary:

1. Those people who asked for a single room and have received confirmation of a single room will get a single room, but those who have accepted a twin room for single occupancy will be allocated a twin room unless a single room becomes available.
2. Those people who have asked for a double room and received confirma-

tion of a double room will get a double room, but those who have asked for a double room and received confirmation of a twin room will be allocated a double room if one becomes available.

3. Those people who have asked for a twin room should have no problems unless we run out of Hotel space entirely.

If there are any problems with your room booking we will contact you. Likewise, if you have any difficulties, please contact us, preferably by telephone on the number given in the Information section at the rear of this *Dispatches*.

The telephone number of the Hotel is given in the Information section, but you should not book rooms directly with the Hotel since you will then be charged the prevailing rate and not the reduced Convention rate. ☐

A 6 ft by 2 ft table costs £15 and we have room for a total of 15 tables. Anyone who wishes to book a table (including those that expressed an interest on their Booking Form) should telephone us on the number given in the Information section at the rear of this *Dispatches*.

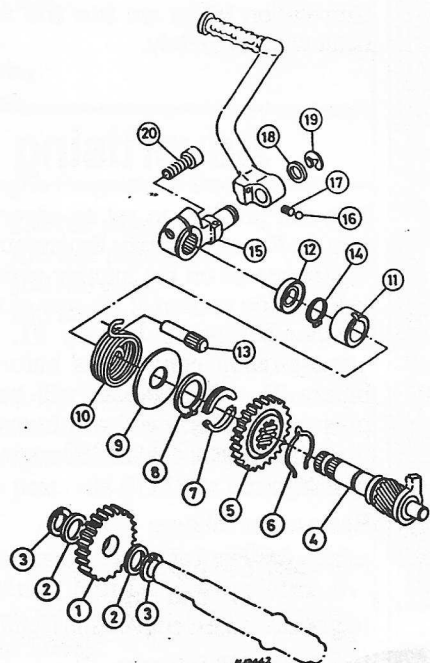

Directions

The Severn Bridge:

If you intend to use the Severn Bridge, the Department of Transport tell us that it is usually busy between 16:00 and 18:00 on a Friday (apparently due to people returning home for the weekend after spending the week working in London); they say there should be no problems returning on a Sunday. They have no planned works on the Bridge for the period of the Convention, but if you wish to make absolutely sure you can telephone:

Bristol (0272) 299299

for a recorded message about the current state of traffic. There is a toll on the Bridge of £1 for cars.

By Car from the South East:

From the South East, take the M4 West-bound to the Severn Bridge. If you anticipate traffic queues at the Bridge (a delay of more than 1 hour, say), don't take the Bridge, but instead take the M5 North at junction 20 and go around via Gloucester and the A40 or the M50 (see the route from the Midlands and the North).

However, if all is well, cross the Bridge into Wales (Croeso i Gymru and all that) and carry on along the M4, past Newport, until you reach junction 29, where you should turn off onto the A48(M). This road will take you into Cardiff (East and South according to the road sign).

You will travel past the Post House and Moat House hotels on your right and will reach a turn-off for the A470 (as the University College Hospital appears on your right); take this turn-off. You will reach a

roundabout underneath a fly-over, where you should take the second exit signed to the City Centre (the A470). Carry on along this road until you reach a small tidal flow system (very shortly after going over a railway bridge). In the tidal flow system the road forks at a set of traffic lights – take the right hand fork, leading to North Road. After another set of lights (where you should go straight on) you will see the large stone-built law courts and University buildings on your left.

Get into the left-hand lane and at the next major junction (a box junction), you can either go straight on and then immediately left onto Kingsway leading to Greyfriars, or you can go left and then immediately right onto Kingsway leading to Greyfriars, both of which lead you to Park Place past the NCP car park. As you pass the NCP, you will reach a set of traffic lights where the road bends left. Turn sharp right for Park Place. The Hotel car park is through an entrance on your left and the Hotel entrance is 30 metres further on.

By Car from the Midlands and the North:

Get to the M5 and travel South to the junction with the M50 (junction 8). At the end of the M50, take the A40 towards Monmouth, then at Raglan turn off onto the A449 heading for Newport. This joins the M4 at junction 24 (just before Newport), where you should continue as the instructions for travel by car from the South East.

Car Parking:

The Hotel has its own Car Park with a capacity of 60 cars. It is free for use by residents and non-residents, but in the event of it getting over-full, Hotel residents will be given priority. There is an NCP car park within 100 yards of the Hotel (see map),

called Greyfriars. It has a multi-storey section which is open 24 hours and costs £5.50 for 24 hours (less for shorter periods), plus an underground section for attended parking (i.e. you leave your keys with them and they park the car); this costs £2.40 for parking 7:30 to 13:00 and £2.40 for 11:30 to 17:30 (i.e. £4.80 for 24 hours), but note that it is shut from 17:30 until 7:30 the following morning.

By Rail and Coach:

Cardiff Central Station (telephone number in the Information section overleaf) and the central Coach and Bus Station are next door to each other. From here you can either get a local train to Queen Street Station (about a one minute journey) or you can walk to the Hotel in 10 minutes.

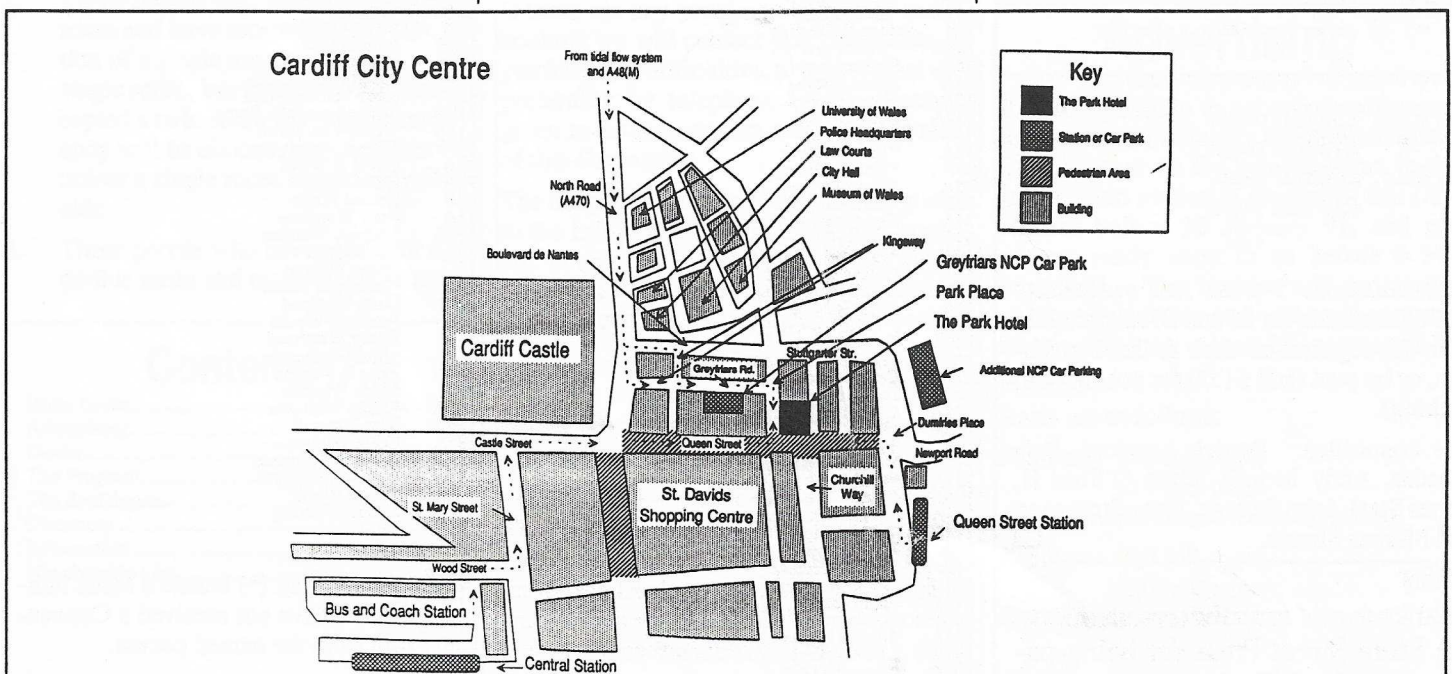
If you took the train to Queen Street Station, turn right as you leave the station building, then after about 100 metres, turn left onto Queen Street. The Hotel is 100 metres away on your right (entrance in Park Place).

If you decide to walk from the Central Station, head for the City Centre (along Wood Street for a short distance), then turn left onto St. Mary Street, heading for the Castle. When you reach Castle Street, turn right and walk down the pedestrianised Queen Street. The Park Hotel is 200 metres away on your left (entrance on Park Place).

By Air:

If you are travelling by plane into Cardiff Wales Airport, get a taxi or coach into town.

If you are coming in your reproduction Leonardo da Vinci flying machine, the nearest open space in which to land is in front of the town hall (beside Boulevard de Nantes), but watch out for the fountains.
