Ken MacLeod is a leading light of the current Scottish school of hard science fiction writers. His writing has been called “sly cultural commentary,” “subversive and observant,” and possessing “an uncommon degree of political awareness,” often with bright ideas and biting wit in the strong Scottish characters reflecting his home country. He writes with a loving respect for the SF greats. His latest novel is *Learning the World*.

Donato Giancola Official Artist

Donato Giancola is noted for his illustrations of science fiction and fantasy, as well as other fields of art. His SF/fantasy clients include the SciFi Channel, Lucas Arts, DC Comics, and Wizards of the Coast. He has recently exhibited at the Andrea Rosen Gallery and The New York Academy of the Sciences. His numerous awards include NESFA’s Jack Gaughan Award for Best Emerging Artist (1998).

Cory Doctorow Special Guest

He is an SF writer, a web editor (www.boingboing.net), and a journalist, and is a Fellow of the Electronic Frontier Foundation. His most recent novel is *Someone Comes to Town, Someone Leaves Town*.

Steve Macdonald is a double threat as a filk performer and a filk activist. His most recent CDs are *Crossroads* and *Reap the Wind*. He has won several Pegasus awards and nominations for his filk songs, including “Journey’s Done” (1995).

HOTEL INFORMATION

Reserve your
room now!

Boskone’s hotel is the **Sheraton Boston** in the Back Bay area of Boston, Massachusetts, located just off the Massachusetts Turnpike (exit 22, Prudential Center/Copley Square), an area overflowing with restaurants and shopping. The hotel rates per night are: single \$137, double \$147, triple \$157, quad \$167, all plus tax. (Please contact us for suite availability.) Reserve your hotel room online by going to www.nesfa.org/boskone/hotel.html and following the instructions. You can pick a room in either the party of the non-party block. Reservations can also be made by phone at 800-325-3535. If reserving by phone, specify “Boskone 2006 Party Block” or “Boskone 2006 Non-Party Block” to get the convention rate. Additional rooms may be available after the deadline, but only on a first-come first-served basis. Reservations must be cancelled by **6pm, two days before your check-in date**, or the credit card used to guarantee the room will be charged for the first night’s stay.



Deadline: Reservations must be made by 5pm EST on February 2, 2006.

Special Requests: A limited number of handicapped-access rooms and smoking rooms are available, so please let the hotel know right away if you have any special needs. Likewise, rollaway beds and cribs are in short supply, so let them know if you think you’ll need one. Please specify a party or non-party floor room at the time of reservation. If you want to reserve a suite, please contact us at b43info@boskone.org or write to us at the PO Box.

Check-in and Check-out: Check-in begins at 3pm. Check-out time is noon. A late check-out of 2pm may be available. You can avoid morning check-out lines by pre-paying as early as the night before!

Registration

Registration for Boskone will be open Friday (4pm-10pm) through Sunday in the Republic Foyer on the second floor. Check posted signs in the event of a Registration room change. Everyone—committee, staff, program participants, artists, dealers—must register there to get name badges and convention materials. We will make it as painless an experience as we can! You can help: Please remember to bring photographic identification, such as a driver's license or passport, to the Preregistration Desk. If you arrive late, ask at the Convention Office (second floor, across from the Constitution Ballroom) about after-hours registration. If you haven't yet bought a membership and wish to do so before the convention, a registration form is available at www.boskone.org/join. You may register on-line or print and



mail the form to us at PO Box 809, Framingham, MA 01701, or you may fax it to us at 617-776-3243.

The price of an advance membership is \$43 through January 16, 2006. We accept Visa, MasterCard, checks (in US dollars drawn on a US bank), and money orders. At-con rates are: Full membership – \$52, Friday – \$16, Saturday – \$36, Sunday – \$18. We also accept cash at the con.

The cost of Dragonslair and Babysitting is included in the con membership, so all children who use these services must be convention members. There is no reduced rate for children. However, children under 10 who stay with their parents at all times are considered “kids-in-tow” who need not have memberships. (“Kids-in-tow” do not receive any convention materials.)

Transferring Memberships. Boskone does not refund memberships. However, you may transfer your membership to someone else. All membership transfers must be done in writing. Your transferee will be able to register much more quickly at the convention if you write to us in advance (at the PO Box or to b43info@boskone.org) to let us know of the transfer, and have your transferee bring a copy of your transfer letter to Registration. Please note that Life Memberships are not transferable.

Hal CLEMENT SCIENCE SPEAKER

How to Get to BOSKONE

By Car—The Sheraton Boston Hotel is located at 39 Dalton St in Boston's "Back Bay" area.

From the North: Take Interstate 93 South to exit 26A (Leverett Circle exit, now mentioning North Station and Storrow Drive) onto Storrow Drive. (Warning: The exit ramp separates from I-93 about a mile before turning off.) After you come out of a short tunnel, stay in the center lane for 1.7 miles until the Fenway exit, which will be on the left. Stay to the left in this exit; bear left at the first and second lights onto Boylston Street. At the fifth light, take a right onto Dalton Street. The hotel is at the far end of this block, on the left.

From the South: Take Interstate 93 North to exit 18 (Massachusetts Avenue). Take a right at the bottom of the long off-ramp onto Massachusetts Avenue. Continue for approximately one mile, then take a right onto Huntington Avenue. At the second light turn left onto Belvedere. The hotel is on the right.

From the West: Take Interstate 90 East (Massachusetts Pike) to exit 22 (Prudential Center/Copley Square) in the tunnel. Stay left at the fork in the exit to continue toward the Prudential Center. (Avoid the Prudential parking turnouts.) Once out of the tunnel and above ground, merge with the traffic on Huntington Avenue. At the first set of lights, take a right onto Belvedere. The hotel is on the right.

Truck friendly routes: From the north, the simplest truck route is to continue south on I-93 until you get to the Mass. Ave. exit and then follow the directions from the south. The clearance on this route is about 13'9". *Note:* Mass. Ave. from the north is not signed well in advance, but is after I-90, which is just at the end of the tunnel.

Another truck friendly option is I-93 to I-95 south (nee Route 128) in Woburn to I-90 east in Weston and then follow the directions from the west. This is longer in distance but avoids downtown Boston. The routes from the west and south, above, are truck-friendly.

A note on parking: Because Boston is major city, parking costs are very expensive close to the hotel. The garage attached to the hotel charges \$38/day (\$37/day for valet parking, which includes in/out privileges). The hotel does not own the garage, so we can't negotiate a better rate. There are alternatives. Across Dalton St. from the hotel and uphill, past the bowling alley and the Summer Shack, is the Auditorium Garage; marked by a large, vertical PARK sign on the outside wall; operated by Pilgrim Parking, Inc. As of mid-December, prices at the Auditorium Garage were \$26/day.

Consider parking in one of the large lots at the end of the subway lines, and taking the subway in. Riverside Station (exit 22 off Route 128), on the end of the **D** branch of the Green Line, has a large open air lot where parking costs about \$4/day. Alewife station, on the Red Line, charges about \$5/day for parking for its multi-story garage lot (not suitable for tall vehicles). Alewife is a little closer to the hotel than Riverside is, but you will need to change trains at the Downtown Crossing Station for an Orange Line train going to Back Bay Station. There is also a large lot at exit 13 on Route 128 at the Amtrak station in Dedham. See directions below for "by the 'T'."

By Air—If you fly into Boston's Logan Airport, you can take a shared van service to the hotel for about \$9. See details at the airport or at www.massport.com/logan/getti_typeo_share.html—some will let you reserve on-line. A taxi ride will start with \$6.50 in fees before you leave the airport; there are no flat fees in the zone that includes the hotel so costs will vary according to the time your trip takes (~\$21–\$28).

You can also take the 'T' (MBTA) subway system. From any terminal take a free Massport Logan shuttle bus (#22, 33 or 55) to the Airport Station subway stop (Blue Line). Take an inbound train to Government Center and change for an inbound Green Line train. Alternatively, continue on the Blue Line to State Street Station and change for the Orange Line toward Forest Hills. Follow directions below for "By the 'T'."

Amtrak—The closest Amtrak stop is Back Bay Station (station code BBY), the last stop before South Station. Back Bay station is at 145 Dartmouth St. To reach the hotel, you can either take a taxi or walk (~1/2 mile). To get to the hotel by foot, cross Dartmouth St., go into the Copley Mall, then follow the signs through the Marriott Hotel, the skybridge, and the Prudential Mall to the Sheraton Hotel (all indoors).

For Amtrak information, see www.amtrak.com or call 1-800-USARAIL.

By the 'T'—There are three reasonably close subway stops: Hynes/ICA on the B, C and D branches of the Green Line, Prudential Center on the E branch of the Green Line, and Back Bay on the Orange Line. Which stop is best for you probably depends on where you are coming from and whether you mind walking outdoors. Hynes/ICA involves a slightly longer walk outside but has more frequent service and better connections. See www.mbta.com/traveling_t/schedules_subway.asp or call 617-222-3200 or 1-800-392-6100.

Walking Directions From Hynes/ICA T station to the Sheraton-Boston: Go upstairs, through the turnstiles, up more stairs, and through the doors; this is Massachusetts Ave. (the middle of a block — there aren't any street signs, but the signs inside say "to Massachusetts Ave.")

Turn left from the doors; the first light is Boylston St.

Turn left on Boylston St. (The hotel will become visible over/behind the Hynes Auditorium, ahead on the right.) The first light is Dalton St. (on your right only; on the left is Hereford).



Cross Boylston *and* Dalton, or continue on Boylston (past the fire station) until you can cross to the far side of Dalton.

Go downhill on Dalton St; cross the entrance to hotel parking and turn into the hotel driveway.

Go in any door. Hotel registration is ahead, across the lobby; the escalator on the left goes up to convention space.

At the top of the escalator, turn right. Information is across the near lobby in front of you; Registration (in Independence) is part way down the hall past the side of Information, on the right.

Commuter Rail—If coming from the south or west, take a commuter train to Back Bay Station. See the directions under Amtrak to get to the hotel.
