PROGRAMMING

LepreCon 13 will be offering something of interest for people of varied interests. Is it art, science fiction, fantasy or space programming you'll be wanting to sit in on? Look for lectures, discussions and demonstrations on the Roots of Fantasy BT (Before Tinkerbelle), the commercial business of space (Selling Unreal Estate), trends in alternative fiction (How many books doth a series make?), and the types of art and the words used to describe them (sort of a Terms of Artfull Endearment).

Other areas? The possibilities are wide-open with topics in the hat on comic book art and production, costuming as personal expression and functional garb, how to write your own computer games, what's ahead in art and literature themes, and the business of being a writer or an artist (how to get started, and how to stay that way).

Plans in progress call for an airbrush workshop, a (very) wide-ranging discussion on the use of animals in science fiction, fantasy and space, a Trivial Pursuit tournament for those whose diversity of trivial knowledge (or lack of chutzpah) precludes them from the traditional Trivia Bowl, and a reincarnation of last year's panel on serious answers to silly questions (or vice versa), to be known as "Child of What If?". about Child of What If?, truly. I'll be collection silly and/or serious questions for the panel throughout LepreCon 13. Keep it in mind.)

How about board and computer gaming, videos, films, the masquerade, the Trivia Bowl (see above), and all the familiar areas of activity, along with a guided tour of the art show (for those who like to mix culture and critique), a game auction (such a deal we can make you), and a journey into that rarefied world of marketing (aka, why are my favorite books always on the bottom shelf?).

The guests of honor have enthusiastically added their ideas to this list, and come June they will be adding their talents and humour.

GUESTS

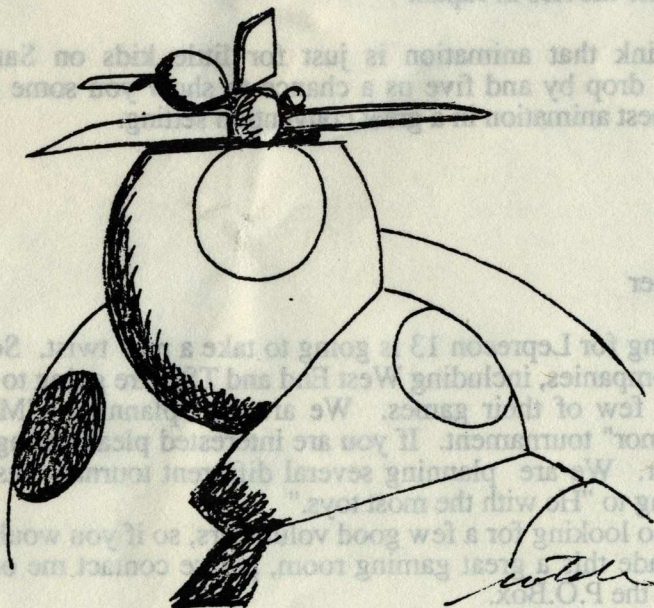
It gets harder every year to pick guests of honor from all of the great people out there, but this year I think we have really out done ourselves.

WEAPONS POLICY

The weapons policy for LepreCon 13 will be the same as for many conventions past, basically stated, let's all be smart. Real or realistic firearms are not allowed at this convention, nor are weapons that fire a projectile such as water, rubber bullets, disks, et al. Bladed weapons may be carried so long as they are enclosed in a hard protective sheath. The only exception for bladed weapons is for the masquerade, and that must be cleared before hand with Pati Cook for the masquerade and Jim Webbert for convention security.

Also you need to know that the city of Phoenix has passed an anti-smoking ordinance which means that there cannot be any smoking in convention function area. As the hotel is private property, smoking is allowed in the lobby and other open areas only. Also the Con Suite will be set up with both a smoking and a non-smoking area for your convenience.

Fans on the whole are very intelligent and considerate for others, so with your help we can make this a safe and enjoyable convention for all of us.
