Annual Science Fiction and Fantasy Achievement Awards For 1977

Please Read Carefully!

How to Vote

You must be a member of Iguanacon, the 36th World Science Fiction Convention, in order to have your ballot counted. Each member of the convention may vote once, no matter how many memberships that person has in his or her name. In order to insure that only Iguanacon members vote, please indicate your membership number in the space provided, *print* your name on the indicated line, and sign the ballot. Failure to provide at least your name and to sign the ballot will invalidate it.

The voting process is the "Australian Ballot" system or, more descriptively, the preferential ballot system. So, on the ballot, number the nominees under each category from 1 to 5 (this last number may be 4 or 6 depending on the number of nominees in each category), 1 being your first choice and 5 being your last choice. In each category, there is a "No Award," which you may include in the ranking of nominees in each category at any point. If you are not familiar with all the nominees in a category, vote only for those with which you are familiar. *Remember, number your choices; otherwise, there will be no way to determine how you voted.*

The Final Ballot must be *received* no later than *July 31, 1978* to be counted.

The Final Ballots will be counted and seen only by the members of the Iguanacon Hugo Sub-committee.
