Most of you reading this already know about the Willis Fund. For those of you who are not acquainted with it, here is a very brief resume. In 1952 a group of fans in this country raised a fund to bring well-known Irish fan Walt Willis over here for the Chicon 2. The Fund was a success and Walt wrote a brilliant report of his travels entitled THE HARP STATESIDE.

According to all indications, next year's convention will once again be held in Chicago. It is also the anniversary of Walt's trip. Once again a group of interested fans are raising a Fund to bring him over for this convention - only this time, we plan to bring Walt and his wife, Madeleine. The Fund began officially on April 1st of this year and, with its minimum goal as \$1000, is near success today. In order to put the Fund well over the top and also have cash on hand for the Willisest to cover expenses in this country, we have an intensive drive taking place at this convention.

Even if you have no interest in the Fund itself and have never heard of Walt and Madeleine Willis, we think you will be interested in the items we are raffling and auctioning here.
